WHERE TRADE BOOMS.

The Furniture Makers Also
 Have Their Hands Full.

FURNITURE FOR EXPORT

Made by One Firm Which Goes Into
 Aristocratic British Homes.

Toronto Homes Are Now Being Fitted
 Up With a Luxuriousness Un-
 dreamt of Before - The Spring
 Trade in Furniture Will Be Un-
 usually Large and the Manufac-
 turers With Increased Stocks Are
 Preparing for It.

One branch of manufacturing that is
 booming in Toronto to-day is the furniture
 trade. In this rounds The World repre-
 sentative found this to be an absolute fact.

"We are starting in well," said the man-
 ager of the Cobban Manufacturing Com-
 pany, "and it looks like a boom. We are
 branching out in office, bank and store fit-
 tings, and we don't take a back seat to
 any Yankee firm in the way of design."

The manager pointed out some exquisite
 mantles in quarter-cut oak, which he de-
 clared to be "all the push just now."

Toronto houses were being fitted up with
 fixtures undreamt of before, and he be-
 lieved that a building boom was in store
 for the city in the spring.

Furniture for England.
 The World was not surprised to find that
 the Charles Rogers Manufacturing Com-
 pany of Toronto were shipping fine furniture
 to England. Some time ago the company
 sold a set of Charles Rogers' fine chairs in
 the shape of dining room furniture to Lord
 Abinger and another to Baron Burton.

THAT JOHANNESBURG FIGHT

Further Particulars Show That the
 Boers Resorted to Genuine
 Rowdiness.

London, Jan. 17.—The Cape Town cor-
 respondent of The Daily Mail, who confirms
 the report that the Johannesburg meeting
 on Saturday was broken up by bands of
 armed and organized Boers, says:

"The Boers occupied the building quite
 an hour before the commencement of the
 meeting, and from the galleries threw down
 boxes, chairs and tables upon the Uitlander
 in the arena. Within 15 minutes ter-
 rible fighting was in progress. The whole
 interior was wrecked, the police remaining
 passive spectators, and the wreckage had
 a huge pile on the main floor of the hall.
 At one stage in the fighting the police
 caught a young Boer trying to set fire to
 the debris, but they liberated him after a
 mild rebuke."

"At this point a fresh contingent of Boers
 invaded the hall, flourishing sticks and iron
 bars, and attacking every Uitlander they
 could lay hands on. The Uitlanders made
 for the door, escaping after a terrific scuffle,
 in which many were injured. Outside the
 hall they formed up, waiting for a further
 attack."

"The Boers then held a meeting inside
 the wrecked hall, emerged and marched to
 the police barracks, cheering the govern-
 ment and hooting the Uitlanders. Huge
 crowds of Boers gathered in the streets
 at night. The censorship at Johannesburg is
 very strict, but the latest telegrams say
 that the Boers were not only not dis-
 armed, but were allowed to march through
 the streets after the meeting. Matters had
 begun to look ugly, when the police com-
 manded the Boers to disperse. Boers re-
 sisted, and a fight broke out. The Boers
 then returned to the hall, and the English
 remained behind and singing the
 National Anthem. Two Englishmen,
 however, were arrested for the meeting for
 disturbing the police, were released. Presi-
 dent Kruger and the Boer authorities are
 expected to meet to-day. The Boers have
 promised to permit the meeting if
 conducted in orderly fashion."

CARLETON COUNTY STATISTICS
Chattel Mortgages, Bills of Sale, Etc., This Year and Last—
Ottawa News Notes.
Ottawa, Jan. 16.—The number of chattel mortgages and bills of sale issued in the county of Carleton during the past year was 508, about the same number as in 1897.

The total amount secured by such instruments was \$601,316.74. Three hundred and thirty-seven mortgages were renewed and discharges were granted. The assignments for the benefit of creditors numbered Sixty-six hire receipts or temporary assignments being filed, the total amount represented by such being \$10,861.66.
