SYNOD OF MANITOBA AND THE NORTH-WEST TERRITORIES.

SYNODICAL COMMITTEES' EXPENSES.—It was agreed to pay a claim of \$70.70 for the travelling and other expenses of the Synodical Committee for the past year.

ICELANDIC MISSION.—A claim of \$275 for the salary and expenses of the second missionary to the Icelanders—Mr. Larus Johnson—was granted. It was agreed to remind the Presbytery of Winnipeg that no reply had been received from it to the communication sent last June as to the Icelandic Mission.

TRAVELLING EXPENSES OF MISSIONARIES.—The Synod's Committee submitted an estimate of the amounts required to meet the travelling expenses back to College of the student missionaries laboring in the Synod during the past summer. The amount—\$754.45 was ordered to be paid, and the several Presbyteries were instructed to furnish the Committee in March next with a detailed statement of the amounts actually paid the several missionaries for travelling expenses. It was agreed to call the attention of the Home Mission Committee of the Synod to the rule in the East, whereby students laboring in Ontario and Quebec meet their own return expenses to College, and to intimate that hereafter this rule, with certain modifications, will be applied to students laboring in Manitoba and the North-West.

STUDENTS' ALLOWANCE FOR WINTER SERVICES.—An application from the Synod's Home Mission Committee, that the grants to fields supplied by students from college during the winter be not reduced, was not entertained.

MISCELLANEOUS.

CONFERENCE WITH FOREIGN MISSION COMMITTEE, &c.—The following extract minute of the General Assembly was read : "In order to secure the co-operation of the women of the Church in Home Mission Work, the General Assembly instructs the Committee, instead of taking action in the direction of forming Women's Home Mission Societies, as sanctioned by a previous General Assembly, to confer with the Foreign Mission Committee and with the Executive Committee of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society, with a view to widening the basis of said society, so as to include Home Missions in its operations."

Dr. Robertson and Mr. Macdonnell were appointed a sub-committee to meet with the Foreign Mission Committee and arrange for a conference between the two committees as to the widening of the basis of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society, in accordance with the instructions of the General Assembly. At a later stage this subcommittee reported that the conference would be held at half-past seven o'clock this evening in the Board Room of Knox College.

The Executive met at this hour in Knox College. There were present to confer with them the members of the Foreign Mission Committee and also representatives of the Executive of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society, who had been invited to the conference by the Foreign Mission Committee.

The representatives of the Home Mission Executive made certain statements regarding the desirability of Home Missions being included in the work of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society. Thereupon the secretary of the Foreign Mission Committe read the following resolution adopted by the Board of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society, at a meeting held on October first :— "That this Board is not unwilling to confer with the Home and Foreign Mission Committees, if such conference should be arranged. That the Board thinks it has very strong reasons for remaining in its present relation to the Foreign Mission Committee and continuing to work for Foreign Missions only." Representatives of the Women's Foreign Missionary were heard in support of their views. Several members of the Foreign Mission Committee thereafter expressed their mind in opposition to the proposed change, resting their opposition, chiefly, on the resolution of the Women's Board. The conference was then closed.

The Home Mission Executive regrets that the object of the conference was to a large extent frustrated by the virtual refusal of the Foreign Mission Committee to discuss on its merits the proposal of the General Assembly to broaden the basis of the Women's Foreign Missionary Society,—maintaining, as they did, that the resolution of the Women's Board rendered discussion useless.

MISSIONARY FOR IMMIGRANTS.—An application was received from the Presbytery of Montreal for the appointment of a missionary to meet and direct immigrants arriving from Europe. The matter was referred to and Farrie

Messrs. Macdonnell, Somerville and Henderson were appointed a sub-committee to frame regulations in accordance with the Assembly's minute.

REV. A. FINDLAY'S REPORT.—The Rev. A. Findlay laid on the table an interesting report of his work for the past half year. The Report was received, and it was resolved to publish the substance of it in the *Presbyterian Record*. Mr. Findlay's expenses (\$166.36) were ordered to be paid.
