It is said that the great firm of Glasgow shipbuilders who have in the "Alaska" surpassed any previous attempt at combining speed, safety and carrying capacity, have been given a contract by an American company, for the construction of a line of similar vessels of greater capacity, and guaranteed to possess the same speed. They are, however, expected to exceed the speed of the "Alaska" very materially, and the intention of the company is to reduce the time of the passage to five days at sea. The terminal points of the line are to be Milford

very materially, and the intention of the company is to reduce the time of the passage to five days at sea. The terminal points of the line are to be Milford Haven, the great harbor on the west coast of Wales, and Montauk Bay, the most easterly point of Long Island, and they thus intend to combine the fastest of ocean steamers, with shortness of distance and the best possible railway time. There appears to be but little doubt that they will by this means be enabled to reduce the time necessary to cross the ocean by at least twenty-four hours. An enormous amount of ingenuity has been expended of late, in endeavors on the part of inventors to increase the speed of ocean steamers by transferring them into monstrosities, such as the luckless cigar ship "Meteor," and a perfect host of double and treble ships, not forgetting those that were to walk and roll upon the waters, have been proposed. In the past, however, every increase in speed and efficiency has been obtained, not by any great and wonderful discovery, but by long experiment and a steadily increasing knowledge of the principle of flotation, and the results of the past can in this case be looked upon as an exceedingly good forecast of the future. While increased speed is a great gain, it should not and must not be obtained at the cost of a decrease in safety. Recent events have proved that the modern steam vessel

danger from collision, but it must be added that steam has greatly reduced the loss of life and property from the other dangers of the sea. The weak point in modern steam vessels arises not from their model but from their construction Their enormous size makes it doubly necessary that their water tight bulkheads should be built far more strongly even than their CHARREN

is not sufficient to ensure safety in these immense vessels; they must be divided longitudinally as well. A bulkhead running in an unbroken line from bow to stern would do more to strengthen a vessel than any other device, and this or some other means of overcoming their great defect must be adopted. In a great many cases, however, if the ordinary bulk-heads were constructed as they should be, and properly attended to, the result of a collision would not be what it has been of late. When the question of safety is compared with speed alone the latter good quality, even in this age is of secondary importance, and should be looked upon in that light.
