An Act to restrain the injurious practice of inoculating with the Small Pox.

WHEREAS it is highly expedient to restrain the injurious practice of inoculating with the natural Small Pox, Preamble.
(*variola*);

Be it enacted &c., That any person who shall produce or
5 attempt to produce, by inoculation with variolous matter, or by wilful exposure to variolous matter, or to any matter, article or thing impregnated with variolous matter, or withilly Enacting
Clause.
by any other means whatsoever the disease of Small Pox in
10 any person in this Province, shall be liable to be proceeded against and convicted summarily before any two justices, and for every such offense shall upon conviction be imprisoned for any term not exceeding one month.
