BOYS' HOME.

TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL MEETING.

The Twenty-Ninth Annual Meeting in connection with the Boys' Home was held on Tuesday the 12th February, 1889, at the Home in George Street.

Besides a large attendance of ladies there were present :—

Col. Gzowski, Sir Daniel Wilson, Canon Dumoulin, Rev. Dr. Cavin, Rev. D. G. Sutherland, Dr. J. G. Hodgins, Rev. A. J. Broughall, Rev. Prof. Roper and Dr. Thorburn.

Letters of regret at not being able to attend were received from Mayor Clarke, Rev. Dr. Potts, Rev. Dr. Stafford, Mr. S. H. Blake, Mr. W. Gooderham, Mr. W. H. Howland, and others.

The chair was occupied by Dr. Hodgins; Rev. Dr. Caven opening the meeting with prayer. After which the boys were called in and each received from Mrs. Dunlop, first Directress of the "Home," a ten cent piece. The money was the gift of Mr. E. B. Osler, and was intended to be presented at Christmas, but after consideration, the managers decided to reserve it for this occasion, and to judge from the smiling faces of the little fellows no holiday gift could have been more appropriate.

The Rev. J. C. Roper then read the Secretary's Report as follows :—

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The lady managers of the Boys Home have much pleasure in laying before their friends and the public, their Twenty-Ninth Annual Report.

The total number of inmates during the past year, including those in residence on January 1st, 1888, was 127 ; of these 32 were removed by parents, 10 were sent to situations, 1 absconded, leaving the very large balance of 96 boys still resident in the Home. Of the 10 boys sent to situations, one has proved satisfactory and is bound to his employer till he attains the age of 18 years ; 6 have been returned, principally on account of their being too young, and not strong enough for the work required of them, and three are still on probation.

During the last year four boys have completed their terms of apprenticeship ; two of these have drawn the money to which they were entitled, the other two have only drawn a portion of the money held in trust for them, and express a desire to be allowed to add to the remainder from their earnings ; it is the great pride and pleasure of the matron to see these boys returning to spend evenings with her and thank her for her loving care during their childhood, and to tell of kind and careful treatment since they left the Home.

Indeed, the managers often hear of the boys turning out well and not forgetting the kindness they have received ; one lady reported the following circumstance while making her annual collection :—

"While collecting among the employees of the Grand Trunk Railroad sheds, one young man handed me two dollars ; when asked if that was not a very large subscription for a man in his position, he replied, "No, when I was a small boy, unable to take care of, or care for myself, I was taken into the Boys' Home and cared for with a kindness I shall never forget, and nothing I can afford to give would be too large a subscription." This and other incidents are very satisfactory to those connected with the Home.

There are now some 75 boys serving their apprenticeship

with farmers in different parts of Canada, and it is very pleasing to hear such reports of, and letters from the boys, as the following :

Secretary of Boys' Home :

DEAR MADAM.—It gives me no small amount of pleasure to comply with your request. Fred Holdsworth has been in attendance at this school for four months and three days and was seldom absent.

He has been studying principally, the fundamental branches, as arithmetic, reading, writing, composition, etc., and for the time made very fair progress.

Allow me to remark, that he came to school neat and clean in his person and clothes. I have often observed, that the apparel of boys in his position is often neglected, but I am pleased at being able to state that Fred was amongst the best dressed boys in my school.

The general health of the boys has been very good ; and up to October last, the Home was quite free from disease of any kind ; but, unfortunately, during that month a boy was admitted with a skin disease that was not known to be contagious, till several other boys were discovered to have taken it, and owing to the want of an infirmary, it was almost impossible to prevent the disease spreading ; however as soon as possible a suitable house was procured and twenty-five infected boys removed thereto. They were placed under the care of one of the matron's assistants, and are attended, at the request of Dr. Thorburn, by Drs. Graham and Cavan, kindly assisted by some medical students.

This disease though very contagious, is neither prostrating

nor dangerous, but is very tedious and requires great care. The necessity of opening a separate building has involved a largely increased expenditure, but the managers are sure, as in time past, it will be put into the hearts of kind friends of the Home to help them in this difficulty ; while on this subject the managers are glad to be able to state that a building committee has been formed for the purpose of making preparations for adding a wing to the present building to be used for infirmary purposes whenever required. Most people know how troublesome and dangerous contagious diseases are, and how necessary it is to isolate children infected with them ; the managers therefore hope that the people of this prosperous city will contribute *liberally* and *promptly* towards the building fund, so that the additional building may be ready for occupation when the year expires, for which they have taken the present premises. And here the managers would add that great credit is due to the matron, Mrs. Munro ; but for her faithful watchfulness this skin disease would have spread throughout the whole Home before the infected boys could be properly isolated.

During the summer the boys had many pleasant excursions, more especially the members of the little band which was in constant demand for the many Sunday School picnics, and here the managers would gratefully acknowledge the kindness of several schools to these little boys on such occasions, and especially to the Bloor St. Baptist Sunday School for their donation of five dollars at Christmas.

In referring to the band, the managers wish to inform the public that it was originated by the ever kind friend of the Home, Mr. William Gooderham, and for many years entirely supported by him, and in order to keep it up, as it is a great pleasure and pride, as well as a beneficial training to the boys, a certain amount of expense is incurred which the managers feel should not be taken from the regular funds of the Home ; they therefore appeal to those who would wish to help give these little boys this pleasure ;

for which purpose a box has been placed in the entrance hall of the Home.

The managers wish to express their great indebtedness to Mr. Kilgour, whose untiring efforts, assisted by several ladies and gentlemen, teach the boys every Sunday, to try and lead a higher and better life for the honor and glory of God. The managers also feel very grateful to Mr. Brush, who still continues his labor with the boys.

To Dr. Thornburn who still continues the firm and devoted friend and physician of the Home, the managers owe a large debt of gratitude.

The Treasurer's Statement of accounts will be found annexed as usual, and in thanking the general public for their liberal support, the managers would especially acknowledge the bequests of the late Mrs. Mary Pollard, James Fleming, and a client of John Stark ; being \$572, \$250 and \$200 respectively.

The managers would also offer their thanks to the many butchers and provision dealers for their constant gifts of meat, vegetables etc., during the whole year, and to the general public for the good things poured in at Christmas to gladden the hearts of the boys, more especially Mr. E. B. Osler, who sent twelve dollars, all in new ten cent pieces to be divided among the boys.

Grateful acknowledgement is due those thoughtful ladies and gentlemen who assisted at the enjoyable Christmas tree given the boys on the Friday after Christmas.

It is with regret the managers announce the loss of so successful a school teacher as Mrs. Warbuton, but they are glad to be able to state that the Public School Board have supplied a very able substitute.

The managers feel they cannot close their report without expressing their deep regret at losing a very valued friend and fellow worker in Miss Gordon, who died at Bournemouth, England, after a painful illness.

In conclusion the managers pray that Almighty God will bless the work they have in hand and which He has so far allowed them to continue with such success.

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

In presenting my twenty-ninth Annual Report, I beg to inform our friends, that during the summer of 1888, several of the boys contracted a very contagious and troublesome disease of the scalp, "Tenia Tonsurans," and knowing how rapidly it spreads, when it enters an Institution, and especially as we had no means of separating them, I personally took the first two boys to the General Hospital, but the authorities would not receive them, later on the lady Directresses procured a suitable building on Parliament Street, to which twenty-four of the boys were sent, six have been returned cured. Doctors Graham and Cavan kindly consented to take charge of the quarantined boys, and I wish here to express my thanks to them for their attention.

With the exception of this troublesome and annoying affection, the inmates have enjoyed most excellent health. There were a few cases of catarrhal condition of the respiratory tract, and it is gratifying to know that there have been no deaths to record. This is a cause of thankfulness, for both scarlet fever and diphteria, invaded many houses in our neighborhood, with fatal effect. The question may be asked how it is that these hundred boys escape sickness, etc., while others who live in comfortable houses, surrounded by every care and luxury are very often sick.

It is due to a variety of circumstances. The ages of the boys being between six and thirteen years, is one of the most healthy in the course of human life. The ventilation and sanitary arrangements are most carefully studied and enforced, the food that is given is sound and wholesome. There is no surfeiting or cramming allowed, or sweets and pastry, to derange and disorder digestion, etc.

I am happy to hear that it is the intention of the lady Directresses, to put up an Infirmary in connection with the Home, and I am sure that the benefactors will show their usual practical appreciation of this intention, so that in future when any contagious disease makes its appearance, we will not have to seek other quarters.

This report would be incomplete were I not to mention the constant care and attention of Mrs. Munro, and others in charge of the boys.

The public are also greatly indebted to the ladies who devote their influence and time to fulfilling one of the missions of life, namely, to think of others and not constantly studying their own comforts and ease.

It was then moved by Canon Dumoulin, seconded by Sir Daniel Wilson, and carried unanimously, “That this meeting desires to record its gratitude to Almighty God for the success which has attended the Institution during the past year ; and during the many years through which it has been in operation.”

Sir Daniel Wilson then tendered a vote of thanks to Dr. Hodgins, for discharging the duties of chairman, after which the Rev. Dr. Caven pronounced the benediction.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents ; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year ; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses ; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer, and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society ; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose ; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week ; inspect the house ; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a. m. Each meeting shall be opened with

prayer. The minu'es of the preceding meeting having been read and signed the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the discretion of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee ; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a. m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a. m. from 1st October to 1st May ; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p. m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a. m., Dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p. m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys ; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
