#### GREEK AND LATIN LITERATURE.

LUTARCHI Vitæ Parallelæ Latinæ, a J. A. CAMPANO, some three or four initial letters having evidently been illuminated, have at some former period been extracted, a total of 511 leaves, very stout and fine paper commencing with the dedicatory epistle of Campanus in the first volume, and "Post Caroli Mortem diligentissime ac sanctissimeq reservit" are the concluding words in the second volume, there being 49 long lines to a full page, 2 vols in one very stout folio, strongly half bound, rough calf, 15.50, [Circa, about 1474].

A previous edition was issued 1470, ULRIC HAN, being the printer, and JOHN ANTHONY CAM-PANUS doing the editorial work. The FIRST BEING the SECOND ROMAN PRINTER, of whom little is known. Campanus was a worthy bishop, who contented himself with three hours' sleep out of the twenty-four in order that he might serve as corrector of the press for Han. He died in 1477, at the age of fifty. This volume being of the greatest rarity, and is a very fine example of the early press.

PORTIUS AZZOLINUS was an eminent Italian lawyer who lived in the twelfth century. He was Professor of Jurisprudence at Bologna, and such was his popularity that the university was attended by 10,000 students. The above work is so "ingenious and profound," says Gravina, "that although written in a barbarous age, we cannot, with all our present erudition, be safely without it."
