Cane of Canaries.

Canaries are not so delicate as many suppose. I have one which is seven or eight years of age, and is very healthy. In addition to his seed and water, he has a piece of yeast bread every day, of which he is very fond, liking it equally as well, when it is wet with water after it has become dry and hard, as he does when it is fresh. We also give him apple, orange, lettuce, celery tops, sweet potato and cracker. He never has hemp seed and rarely either sugar or cake, these being the things which are fatening and frequently producing apoplexy. When he has plenty of bread and something green he eats very little seed. He always dislikes to be let out of his cage, and when we force him out, as we are sometimes obliged to, in order to clean it, he comes back with the greatest delight. Scalding the cage is the best way to get rid of mites. One thing of which he is very fond, I forgot to mention, the seeds of one core in a day. A little cayonne peppers the water is good for the birds when they appear to be cold or when they have diarrhoa.
