Any person who cares at all for the lace in which hed resides io glad to note reliable signs of prosperity, and he will be as glad to make such indications known, even if he is actuated by no higher motive than selfistness this will be the case, for whatever is for the interest of the locality in which he lives is for his personal interest also, and sometimes in a very unmistakable and direct manner.
