## Our Next Governor General.

From day to day the papers announce the name of our next Governor General. One day it is the Duke of Marlborough, the next it is Earl Grey. One objection urged against the appointment of the Duke of Marlborough is the fact that his wife is a New York lady, and it is held, would turn Rhode Island into a second American White House. Some Canadians feel that they would be crowded out of their own vice-regal home and their places taken by the aggressive swells of American cities. Moreover if once a woman from the great Republic were installed at Ottawa a precedent would be established and the assertive Yankees would insist that the place belonged forever to them. It is at once conceded by some that if the dispute involved arbitration, the great American jurists, impartial beyond all doubt, would have Lord Alverstone on their side, and Canada would be under the social rule of the wealthy women of the States. But we think our fellow citizens unduly alarmed. No doubt the Duchess of Marlborough has forgotten her father's house and the things of New York, that are but as yesterday to the splendor and age of Hohenheim and London. It is more likely she would out do the native English in her admiration of what belongs to the autocratic life into one of whose families she has cast her life and fortune. Any way there are matters of more consequence to the nation than the complexion of social life at Ottawa.

## Our Water Supply.

Since the summer drought has been again safely tide over we hear very little about our water supply. Would it not be well for our town rulers to take time by the forelock and devise some method of preventing a recurrence of the experience of the past two or three summers? This is the time for formulating plans which when put into operation will ensure that next season, even at the driest time, there will be no shortage in water and no limit to the use of street and lawn sprinklers. Well kept lawns add very much to the appearance of any town, and Wolfville people are yearly taking more interest in providing these beauty spots, and adding to their care. The town should do all that is possible to encourage this work. The value of the street sprinkler is year by year becoming better recognized by our people, and its failure to appear for even a short period during the heated term of summer evokes much certifying in the heads of the officials having it in charge. There seems to be little doubt but that the source of our present water supply is adequate to the requirements of the town for many years to come. What is wanted is provision for the storage of a larger quantity of water and this can easily be had by the addition of another reservoir. Those who have looked into the matter carefully, including experienced engineers, agree that this reservoir can be provided with very little trouble and at a reasonable expense. With double our present supply in store, the safety of the town from fire would be greatly enhanced, and users of lawn and garden hose, who pay a yearly fee for the use of the same, would not be prohibited from using them at any time in the summer. Surely the man who pays for this privilege should not be deprived of it at the very time when his need is most apparent. Having had experience of dried up lawns and gardens and dusty streets for the past two summers, our people will willingly undertake the expense of adding to the water supply when such addition can be so easily made. Our water system is already the most valuable asset of the town, and is increasing in value each year. Its efficiency must be maintained and made adequate for the growing requirements of its constituency.

## William Hall, V. C.

William Hall, of Horton Bluff, the colored man who won the Victoria Cross during the Indian Rebellion, died on Thursday last week, aged 78 years. Mr Hall entered the British navy at an early age, and served his country faithfully for many years. At the relief of Lucknow he was one of a squad of mariners who volunteered for a very difficult service, and he received the 'cross' for standing by his gun while the company were engaged in blowing open a gate to make an entrance into the city. He and another man were left alone to work the gun, their comrades having been killed, and by their pluck and perseverance succeeded in effecting an entrance for the British troops. Twenty years ago Mr Hall left the navy and settled at Horton Bluff, where he has well known and highly respected by all. At the time of the visit of the Duke of York to Halifax he visited the city and was kindly received by His Royal Highness. He is said to have been the colored man who ever held the coveted Victoria Cross. He was unmarried and lived with two sisters, Mrs Robinson and Miss Rachel Hall. The funeral took place on Saturday, burial being made at the Brooklyn cemetery, near Lockhartville.
