### Interesting Facts About the Codfish

(By JAMES H. CONLON). lence is now familiar with 12.-In our purely Canadian waters there are no fewer than 700 edible species, though, actually, less than 25 are in markets of the country, and consider-Among commercial fishes, cod and

herring dispute the crown of supremacy. There are more herring taken from the waters of the world than any other species. It has been estimated that the annual total catch of herring is not less than 3,000,000,000. Like northern hemisphere. When commercial value is considered along with the prolificacy of the yield, however, all species must give way to the common cod. In 1921 our waters yielded in excess of 200,000,000 pounds or about 25 per cent of the fish produced As the cod family is very numer-

us; it would be impossible here to arrate the secret differences beween its members. Nor with the human race is it wise to be so communipositive disrepute in the Great shores in search of "King Cod." Engfor a long time. Indeed, the codfish of our North Atlantic banks was one of the principal inducements which led England to establish colonies in America, and in the record of early voyages are many references to the abundance of codfish along our shores. So important was the cod in the early history of this continent that it was placed upon the celenial

diet. It feeds upon various kinds of animals, including crustaceans, mollusks and small fishes, and even browses upon Irish moss and other forms of aquatic vegetation. Some humorously attribute its prolificacy Whether they called this form of vegetation "Irish moss" because of the attribute, true or fancied, of stimulating reproduction, or whether it developed that power in consequence of the name, is a secret not disclosed by any available authority. All manner of things have been found in cods' stomachs, such as scissors, oil cans, finger rings, rocks, potato parings, corn cobs, rubber dolls, pieces of clothing, the heel of a boot, as well as many new and rare specimen of crustaceans and mellusks. Some aver that the cod swallows stones for ballast. The presence of the other articles in the man-eating tendencies, any more than the presence of ashes in the back yard should lead neighbors to suspect we have coal in the cellar. The cod is simply an indiscriminate eater and one doesn't have to go to the Grand Banks to find species-perhaps humans-almost as bad .


