THE BANKS REQUEST THEM AND WILL GET THEM.

NOTING DONE IN REFERENCE TO A NEW FLAG
Important Matters to Come Before the National Committee—Travellers and Mail Companies—Military Church Parades—Traffic Through the New Canal.

OTTAWA, Oct. 10.—At the request of several leading banks, the Post Office Department has decided to issue letter cards of the denomination of 2c. The bank state that they will be glad to use several thousand of such cards in a year, as they will be of great advantage to them for sending out notices to customers in preference to ordinary letters. The department has also decided to issue in towns where there is no delivery by carrier.

ENQUIRIES AT THE MARINE DEPARTMENT
to-day elicited the information that practically nothing has been done in connection with the carrying out of the provisions of a new Dominion flag. That some action will have to be taken soon is evident from the fact that the province of British Columbia has just acquired a new coat of arms, and has decided that it will be necessary to crown the crown colony days, viz., a crowned lion standing upon a shield, which is the coat of arms of the province of British Columbia. It is reported that the Government intends to issue the new Dominion flag, something in the nature of a marine ensign, at about 7.30 p.m. to-morrow.

Mr. Johnston travels on his bicycle, carrying his sample case on the handles. He left Myrtle at about 7.30 p.m. to make Balsam.

The man carried a good-sized stick and waved it threateningly.

CHATHAM, N.B., FIRE SWEEP
FIFTY POOR FAMILIES MADE HOMELESS.

CHATHAM, N.B., Oct. 10.—Fire broke out about noon to-day in the store of Bryan Morin, in Duke-street, and is still raging furiously. Already about 15 buildings have been burned, and include the Roman Catholic Cathedral and the convent of Chapel Hill, Alex. Robinson's carriage factory, Miller's foundry, and the dwellings of D. Smith, Thomas Macgregor, Alexander Robinson, Frank Cassidy, James Hackett, and all the houses in Foundry lane. At this hour, 30 persons are still spreading.

THE TOWN OF NEWCASTLE was appealed to for aid and a fire engine and crew have just arrived.

AS AFTER 11. Campbellton, N.B., Oct. 10.—Later—The Roman Catholic Church and convent at Chatham were not destroyed as at first reported. The fire is under control. About 25 buildings were destroyed.
