FORM OF A BEQUEST TO THE SOCIETY.

I give and bequeath to "The Newfoundland and British North America Society for Educating the Poor," instituted in London in the year 1823, the sum of _____ Pounds sterling, to be raised and paid for the purposes of the said Institution, out of such part only of my personal estate as shall not consist of chattels real, or money secured on mortgage of Lands or Tenements, or in any other manner affecting Lands or Tenements; for which Legacy the Receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Institution shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors.

****** Bequests for charitable or benevolent purposes, of lands or tenements, or of money to be laid out in the purchase thereof, or charged on, or otherwise affecting lands or tenements, or of money secured on mortgage of lands or tenements, are void; but money, stock, or other personalty, not falling under any of the above descriptions, may be so bequeathed.

LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

I. This Society shall be designated **THE NEWFOUNDLAND AND BRITISH NORTH AMERICA SOCIETY FOR EDUCATING THE POOR.**

II. The Schools shall be managed by Masters and Mistresses of the United Church of England and Ireland, or of the Established Church of Scotland, and conducted, as nearly as circumstances may permit, on Dr. Bell's System.

III. This Society shall consist of a Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Secretary or Secretaries, and also of Governors, and Life and Annual Members, and such other Officers as may be deemed necessary for conducting its affairs.

IV. Each Subscriber of One Guinea annually, or upwards, shall be a Member.

V. Each Subscriber of Ten Guineas, or upwards, at one time, shall be a Member for Life.

VI. Each Subscriber of Five Pounds annually, or of Twenty Guineas at one time, shall be a Governor, and entitled to attend and vote at all Meetings of the Committee.

VII. An Executor paying a bequest of Fifty Pounds, or upwards, shall be a Member for Life.

VIII. The business of the Society shall be conducted, and all its Officers appointed, by a Committee of not less than Twelve; of whom Nine, who shall have attended the greatest number of times during the year, shall be eligible for the ensuing year.

IX. The Patron, Vice-Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Secretaries, shall be considered *ex-officio* Members of the Committee; the ordinary Meetings of the Committee shall be held once every month.

X. Three Members of the Committee shall constitute a quorum; and in case of equality of votes, the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

XI. Five Auditors, three of them not being Members of the Committee, shall be appointed by the Committee annually, for the purpose of auditing the accounts of the Society, of whom three shall be a quorum.

XII. A General Meeting of the Members of the Society shall be held in London annually, on the Second Wednesday in May, when the proceedings of the foregoing year shall be reported, and the Accounts presented, and a Committee chosen.

XIII. A Special General Meeting of the Society may be called at any time, at the requisition of the General Committee, or any nine Members, by letter addressed to the Secretary.

XIV. Ten days' notice of all General Meetings shall be given in at least three Newspapers. Those Members of the Society who reside within the limits of the Threepenny Post shall be summoned by letter to attend; and when such General Meetings are Special, the object of them shall be mentioned in the summons.

XV. At all General Meetings, and at those of the Committee, the Patron, or, in his absence, the Vice-Patron, or, should he be absent, the President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President first upon the list, who may be present, or in the absence of all the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, and in his absence, such Member as shall be voted for that purpose, shall preside at the Meeting.

XVI. None of the Laws of the Society shall be repealed or altered, nor any new Law established, but at the Annual General Meeting, or at a Special General Meeting called for that purpose.

RULES FOR AN AUXILIARY SOCIETY.

1. That the object and constitution of the Newfoundland and British North America Society for educating the poor, having the cordial approbation of this Meeting, a Society be now formed, to be called "The Auxiliary Newfoundland and British North America School Society of _____," for the purpose of co-operating with that Institution.

2. That all persons subscribing One Guinea per annum, or upwards, or Five Guineas or upwards at one time, shall be Members of this Society.

3. That the business of this Society shall be conducted by a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, Secretaries, and a Committee, consisting of not less than _____ Members; and that three Members of this Committee constitute a quorum. That the Committee shall meet once every quarter or oftener, on some day to be fixed by themselves.

4. That the Committee divide this town and neighbourhood into districts, and appoint two or more of their members for each district, who may associate with themselves any Subscribers, for the purpose of soliciting subscriptions and donations from the inhabitants thereof; and that they establish proper agents and correspondents in different parts within the limits of the Auxiliary Society.

5. That this Auxiliary shall furnish the Parent Society, on or before the first week in March in each year, with an abstract of its cash account, &c.

6. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on such day as shall be fixed on by the Committee in each year, when the accounts (as audited by the Committee) shall be presented, the proceedings of the past year reported, and a Committee chosen for the ensuing year.

RULES FOR AN ASSOCIATION.

1. That we form ourselves into an Association in connexion with the Newfoundland and British North America Society for educating the poor, for the purpose of contributing towards its object, and that this Association be denominated "The Association."

2. That all persons subscribing the sum of Five Shillings or upwards per annum, or making a donation of One Guinea or upwards at one time, or collecting to the amount of Two Pounds or upwards, shall be Members of this Association.

3. That the business of this Association shall be conducted by a Committee to be chosen annually, consisting of a Treasurer, Secretaries, and not less than _____ other Members, and under the patronage of such other Honorary Members as the Society and Committee shall select and obtain.

4. That the Committee meet once a quarter, or oftener, if necessary, on a day to be fixed by themselves, and that three Members be empowered to act.

5. That for the purpose of soliciting and collecting donations and subscriptions, the Committee divide this neighbourhood into districts, and appoint one or more collectors from among themselves to each district; and that these contributions be paid to the Treasurer at the Committee Meetings.

6. That this Association shall furnish the Committee of the Auxiliary Society, on or before the last day of February in each year, with an Abstract of its cash account, &c.

7. That a General Meeting of the Subscribers be held on such day as shall be fixed on by the Committee in each year, when the accounts (as audited by the Committee) shall be presented, the proceedings of the year reported, and a Committee chosen for the ensuing year.

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

- I. That the Report, of which an abstract has been read, be received and printed, under the direction of the Committee; and that while this Meeting reviews with thankfulness God's past mercies in the proceedings of this Society, they would also exercise a humble confidence in His blessing for the time to come.

On the Motion of the Rev. H. Budd, M.A., seconded by Sir A. Agnew, Bart. M.P.

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

2. That this Meeting has heard with great satisfaction Mr. Willoughby's very favourable Report of the Teachers and of the Schools under their care; and of the lively and increasing interest which the Government, Merchants, and all classes in the Colony take in this Society; and it is therefore with much concern that, under such promising circumstances, the Committee should have found themselves under the necessity, from the deficiency of their funds, of curtailing the operations of the Society.

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

3. That this Meeting deeply laments that the depressed state of the funds has not allowed of any attempt being made in the Canadas. They feel this the more, as the openings pointed out by Mr. Willoughby, and published in the last Annual Report, were so numerous and encouraging.

On the Motion of the Rev. H. Stowell, M.A., seconded by E. N. Thornton, Esq.,

RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY,

4. That the cordial thanks of this Meeting be given to the Auxiliary Societies and Associations; to the several the Clergy, and other friends who have exerted themselves in the cause of the Society during the past year; and to the Rev. Thomas Harding for his able and judicious Discourse preached last evening; and that the following Gentlemen be the Committee for the ensuing year, with power to add to their number, viz.

THE
ELEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE
NEWFOUNDLAND AND BRITISH NORTH AMERICA SOCIETY
FOR EDUCATING THE POOR.

ANOTHER year having closed, the Committee feel much pleasure in reporting their proceedings to the members of the Society; and in doing this, they desire, in the first place, to give glory to God for any measure of success which has attended their labours.

The gratifying patronage and support which your Society has always enjoyed in Newfoundland, has been cheerfully continued during the year. His Excellency the Governor, and all the public authorities, have materially aided your cause, and, as occasions have arisen, given their testimony in favour of your schools. On opening the session of the House of Assembly on the 27th of January last, Sir THOMAS COCHRANE again referred to your schools as one of the topics of his former message to the House, which had not yet been considered.

Your Committee have felt peculiar pleasure in observing, in the printed correspondence of "The Society for Propagating the Gospel in Foreign Parts," the kind mention which the Lord Bishop of Nova Scotia makes in his report to that venerable society of those of your Teachers whom his Lord-

ship saw on his late visitation in Newfoundland. The amount of receipts in the island for the year ending May 25th, 1833, was £441..4s..5d. currency.

In the course of the last year your Superintendent, Mr. Willoughby, has visited all the stations, excepting Twillingate and Little Placentia. He was very kindly invited by J. B. GARLAND, ESQ., one of your Vice-Presidents, late Speaker of the House of Assembly in Newfoundland, and now a Member of the Council, to accompany him in his yacht to Trinity Harbour, Bonavista, and Green's Pond. Mr. Willoughby gives a very favourable report of all the Teachers and Schools. Referring to the close of the annual meeting of the Teachers at St. John's in May, he observes. that "Most of the Teachers are once more departed for their respective stations: all, I believe, happy in their charge. This has been by far the most interesting meeting we have had. Each Teacher's report was encouraging. A spirit of unity and brotherly love prevailed; and the Lord, I trust, was with us to solemnize our minds, to increase our sense of dependence upon him, to give us, in some measure, a suitable feeling of gratitude for his providential care over us in our going out and coming in through another year, and especially for averting from this island the dreadful malady which has visited so many countries. —All seemed happy."

Your Committee will now very briefly notice, in due order, the state of your respective schools.

ST. JOHN'S.

In the last annual Report it was stated, that Mr. and Mrs. Jaynes were in England, having left their school in Mr. and Mrs. Netten's care. Mr. and Mrs. Jaynes returned to their charge in August; Samuel Codner, Esq., having given them a free passage on board one of his vessels. Accounts have been received of their safe arrival and continued health.

Soon after Mr. Jaynes' return, he visited a settlement in the district of St. John's, called Black Head Bay, in company with Mr. Netten, for the purpose of reading the Scriptures and distributing tracts.

While sitting at one of the cottage fires, the neighbours, young and old, soon gathered around them. On inquiring if they had a Bible or Testament, they brought him a short history of the Bible, which he told them was not the word of God, and asked them if they had a Testament; when the remains of one was produced, which proved to be one of your Society's old canvass Testaments, sent out in 1823, which, by some agent of yours, had been conveyed into this dark corner: this was the only portion of God's word that could be found in the whole settlement. After reading the 3d John, and speaking to them, he drew out some little books and tracts. They all eagerly asked for and received one each, and then gave their visitors a warm invitation to partake of their humble fare, which, when they had done and were about to return, these kind-hearted people begged that your Teachers would permit them to man a boat and take them home by water, which, as they had passed through deep mire to get there, they gladly agreed to; and, accordingly, they were rowed home to St. John's, a distance of five miles.

Since this visit, one of the inhabitants has called three times on Mr. Jaynes, urging him to do something for them in the way of a school. There has never been a school, nor any place of worship, among them.

HARBOUR GRACE.

Mr. Willoughby reports, that he found Mr. and Mrs. Kingwell, as usual, occupied with their school, and all in good order. Several scholars, who had been removed by some unfriendly influence, had returned to the schools, and their parents had become liberal subscribers to the Society. On

Mr. Kingwell's return from the Teachers' annual meeting in St. John's, he was much pleased by the first class of boys and girls repeating to him more than 300 verses of Scripture, which they had learned during his absence. The selection they had made, and the manner in which they repeated them, were truly gratifying. No two had chosen the same passage. Mr. Kingwell accompanies the recital of this fact in his journal with a prayer, that "The great Head of the Church may bless these simple means to the spiritual edification of the lambs of his flock!" Mr. Kingwell remarks in his journal, under date of 27th October, 1833, "I was pleased to-day by hearing from one of our scholars, who has just returned from Labrador, that he, with one of his companions (who had also been a monitor in our school), had been accustomed to assemble the children twice every Sunday, to hear them read, repeat hymns, collects, and catechism."

SPANIARD'S BAY.

Mr. Willoughby spent part of a Sunday with Mr. Griffin, your schoolmaster at this place, and was well satisfied with the order of his school, and his manner of conducting his two services amongst the adults. This practice of the Teachers (your Committee would remark here once for all) to read occasionally the Liturgy of the Church of England and a printed sermon to their neighbours, is only adopted where there is no place of public worship, and no missionary to perform divine service; and this is one of the incidental benefits attending the Society's school establishments. Spaniard's Bay is more of a missionary station than any other belonging to the Society, there being no place of worship in the settlement.

The number attending the schools is comparatively small, but the labours of the Teacher among the adults in a missionary character make it as important a post as any occupied by the Society. Mr. Willoughby states his conviction, that

Mr. Griffin is exactly the man for the station, and adds a remark on the subject made by Mr. Griffin himself: "I believe I am just where God designed me to be, and for which he prepared me; though I did not think so at first." Mr. Griffin has a Sunday School in the morning, and a service for the adults in the afternoon and evening; also a Wednesday evening service: on these occasions the room is full, even to inconvenience. On the afternoon Mr. Willoughby was present he was pleased in seeing some young women come an hour before the time of service, to keep places for their aged relatives until they arrived, when they themselves retired to the lower part of the room. In some cases the people assembled would sit on each others' knees by turns. Mr. Willoughby further reports, that they paid great attention during the reading of the Liturgy and a plain sermon, and sang very well: and adds, "evidences are not few that the Lord has been present by the power of his Spirit to bless these means of grace to the quickening some who were dead in spiritual things." The school-room is sometimes filled in ten minutes after the doors are opened. In making a collection for the Society, Mr. Griffin found the people more willing to contribute than he could have conceived; and some whom he considered to be too poor to give any thing, brought small sums unsolicited; most of them gave half and some a quintal of fish. The people have also shewn their gratitude by supplying the school this winter with fire-wood in abundance.

The school-room at this station was very providentially preserved from destruction by fire, on the morning of 24th February, 1833. Mr. Griffin was awakened very early by the smell of smoke. He arose, and found it proceeded from the stove, which had ignited the floor. He endeavoured to put it out, but in vain, having no water at hand. He then gave an alarm, and obtained assistance, and succeeded in extinguishing the fire by covering the floor with snow. All the boards and joists were burnt black, and the floor was obliged to be broken up; but this was all the damage done. Had not the fire been thus quickly got under, the whole

building would soon have been destroyed. In this the Committee have much cause of gratitude to Almighty God for his preserving care.

PORT DE GRAVE.

When Mr. Willoughby visited Mr. and Mrs. Lind, in June, he found the school filled with almost a fresh tribe of children. This is generally the case in the summer, when both boys and girls, who are able to work in the fishery or gardens, are taken from school; and their younger brothers and sisters, who cannot attend in winter on account of the weather, then occupy their places. The consequence is, that the master and mistress have the same business of training to go through as if they were opening a new school.

Mr. Willoughby observes, that the school here excites much interest, and is frequently visited by the inhabitants. Mr. Lind writes, "The Lord is prospering our handy work; may we have grace to give the praise to whom it is due! The dear children are much more attentive, and the parents evidently value more and more the instructions given." Mr. Lind states, that he has lately invited his neighbours to join his family in daily prayers at eight in the morning and nine in the evening. The attention they pay shews how much they value it. The usual number who attend is from 12 to 20: more than 40 have been present. Many of the children in this school repeated whole chapters from the Bible to the Teacher on his return from the annual meeting.

The inhabitants of BARENEED having built a school-room at their sole expence (with the exception of £10 from your Society), which has not yet been occupied, have renewed their applications for a regular Teacher with great urgency. The Superintendent visited the place, and engaged a Branch Teacher, and made such an arrangement with the inhabitants as is calculated to defray the greater part of the expence. The school has been opened and is very promising, both on

week days and Sunday. It, of course, continues to be under the superintendence of Mr. Lind.

BRIGUS.

Mr. Willoughby was rejoiced to find Mr. and Mrs. King, at this place, in much better health than when they resided at Greenspond, and their school in a flourishing condition. He called upon several of the merchants and planters, who appeared well pleased with the school. Mr. Willoughby fully expects that, in a year or two, this school will be very little expence to the Society. One person, unsolicited, and not having any child in the school, gave him an annual subscription of £1. Mr. King states that his questions on the Scriptures, on opening and closing school, are as pointed as possible ; and hopes that the Lord by his Spirit impresses them on the hearts of the children. He records a pleasing fact, of two stout lads, whose behaviour was painfully insolent when first admitted into the school, but whose conduct had undergone an entire change, and they now evinced much attention to spiritual things.

Mr. Willoughby also visited the branch school at Burnt Head, kept by Mr. King on a Sunday, and where he has divine service. He observes, that it is an interesting little place, about four miles from Brigus. There were 46 scholars present, one of them, who was learning to read, being thirty years of age. Mr. Willoughby writes, " It was a gratifying sight to see the scholars learning, and the other inhabitants assembling and standing outside until prayers commenced. In these little knots I doubt not good is doing which the eye of man cannot see. Ability to read God's word, which will be there circulated, the distribution of tracts and books, prayer and praise engaged in, must bring a blessing, through the mercy of our God." The school is kept in a planter's kitchen.

TRINITY HARBOUR.

It has already been stated, that Mr. Willoughby was accommodated by J. B. Garland, Esq. with a free passage to this place. He found Mr. Martin well, and the day school much as usual; but Mrs. Martin was very far from well, though she attended to her duties in the school. During Mr. Willoughby's stay, there was a public examination of the children, in the presence of Mr. Garland and all the other persons of influence in Trinity. Afterwards a subscription was opened, headed by J. B. Garland, Esq., who gave £10, as Speaker of the House of Assembly, in addition to the ordinary subscription of his house at Trinity.

In consequence of Mrs. Martin's state of health, it was found necessary that she should visit England. Suitable arrangements having been made, Mr. and Mrs. Martin arrived at Poole in January last, after a favourable voyage. Mrs. Martin's health has much improved, but she is not yet able to resume her duties.

Mr. Martin, therefore, has returned alone, as he could not be longer spared, and was anxious to renew his labours. It is hoped Mrs. Martin will be able to follow him before the fall. Mr. Fleet being disengaged in consequence of the destruction of the school-room at Green's Pond, has charge of the schools at Trinity during Mr. Martin's absence.

Mr. Martin has given to the Committee a pleasing account of the manifest improvement in the children, and the benefit derived by the Parents.

BONAVISTA.

Mr. Willoughby accompanied Mr. Garland to this place; and found Mr. and Mrs. Meek well, and with at least 50 more children than the school-room ought to have in it. Forty children are yet waiting for admission, and, if they should be accommodated, it is supposed 250 would be still without

instruction. He called upon the principal inhabitants, and found them possessing a good feeling towards the school and Teachers. And before he left, he began a subscription for adding 20 feet in length to the school. Mr. Garland very kindly gave £5 towards the object, which Mr. Willoughby now hopes will be accomplished without any additional charge to the Society.

Mr. Meek states in his last Report, that, "as far as the actual number on the books is concerned, there is a considerable increase in our daily school since last year; and though many, for too obvious reasons, have attended very little, yet the school, when the weather would admit, has been quite full, and frequently crowded. An early and very severe winter, in addition to other disadvantages, contributed much to their non-attendance; but in the summer the number attending was frequently 170 and 180." On a Sunday in last July, ten more were present than at any time since the opening of the school. It is with much pleasure the Committee have heard that the fishery at this place has been more successful than in the preceding summer; and they hope that the last winter has, in consequence, been less severely felt.

GREEN'S POND.

It was stated in the last Report, that Mr. Fleet had succeeded Mr. and Mrs. King in the charge of this school. Mr. Fleet reports, that the school was going on satisfactorily, and the children were constant in their attendance, when his labours were suspended in consequence of the total destruction by fire of the school premises. The particulars have already been given in the Society's occasional paper, No. 5. By this event Mr. Fleet lost all he had, and narrowly escaped with his life. His general health was so much affected by the event, that he visited this country in the autumn; but, finding himself much refreshed, and having obtained good medical advice, he availed himself of the first opportunity to return to Newfoundland. On his arrival at St. John's, it

was agreed he should take Mr. Martin's place at Trinity, while he and Mrs. Martin visited England.

One object which Mr. Fleet had much at heart in coming to this country was, to obtain some help from your Committee towards the erection of a new school-room at Green's Pond; but the crippled state of the Society's funds would not allow the Committee to hold out any encouragement to him.

When Mr. Willoughby visited Green's Pond, in company with Mr. Garland, he convened about twenty of the chief persons in the place, who resolved to erect a school-room forthwith, and immediately subscribed for the purpose. Before Mr. Willoughby left, the plan of a new school-room was approved, and a Committee of seven persons appointed to superintend the work.

Mr. Garland very liberally subscribed £15, and materially aided Mr. Willoughby with his advice; and on every occasion manifested a warm attachment to your Society. One planter engaged to send his vessel, carrying thirty-eight tons, to fetch timber, which he would cut from the woods, bring land, and deliver on the site where the school-room is to be erected, and give £2 in money; and his partner promised to do more:—"When it is considered," Mr. Willoughby remarks, "that these are men who go to sea as fishermen, it is an honourable attempt to secure education for their children and those of their neighbours!" Mr. Garland stated to the meeting, that "his own subscription was not worthy to be compared with this generous benefaction of the planter!" Mr. Willoughby then promised, that, when the school-room should be erected, Mr. Fleet should return to them.

TWILLINGATE.

Your Committee have had repeatedly to regret that the school-room at this station was not occupied by a Teacher. They are happy in being able now to report, that Mr. Wm. Walker is in charge of it. At the Teachers' meeting in May, several of the inhabitants of this place, accompanied by the

Member of the House of Assembly for the district, called on Mr. Willoughby, and urged their claim on the Society for a Teacher, having built the school-room on the understanding that one would be supplied. Mr. Willoughby felt the force of this claim, and, knowing the importance of the station, determined that Mr. Wm. Walker should give up Little Placentia, and go to Twillingate. Accordingly Mr. Walker proceeded to this place in October last, and opened school on the 27th of that month, with every encouragement.

PETTY HARBOUR.

On Mr. Jeynes' return to St. John's, Mr. and Mrs. Netten resumed their labours in this station. The people were very much pleased at seeing them again, and the attendance at school was larger than it had previously been. Mr. Netten states, that, on visiting the people, he had witnessed several pleasing instances of the children reading to their parents or friends tracts which had been lent.

LITTLE PLACENTIA.

It was stated in the last Report, that Mr. Wm. Walker had opened a school in this place, in the expectation that it would be only a small charge to the Society, in consequence of the willingness of the inhabitants to subscribe liberally towards it. Mr. Walker persevered in the trial for more than twelve months, and in many respects had much encouragement in his work; but, owing to the unusual badness of the season, the subscriptions fell very far short of that proportion of the expence which had been reckoned upon. As the funds of the Society would not justify your Committee in sending out a single new Teacher this year, the Superintendent had to decide between the claims of Little Placentia and Twillingate to Mr. Walker's service; and he was led to determine in favour of the latter, in consequence of the school building, which had been erected at the sole expence of the inhabitants, and vested

in Trustees for the Society, upon a distinct pledge that a Teacher should be sent; whereas, at Placentia, there was no suitable room for a school, although ground was, indeed, very recently offered, on which one might be built, could funds have been produced. The people at Little Placentia were much concerned at Mr. Walker's retirement, and they sent a strong representation to Mr. Willoughby on the subject, which he has forwarded to your Committee,—and it sincerely grieves them not to comply with its prayer; but, until larger means are placed at their disposal, they feel it to be clearly their duty not to engage any new Teachers. Indeed, it is with the deepest concern that your Committee report, that, finding the pledged expenditure of the Society to exceed the average income, and that a considerable debt was due to the Treasurer, they felt it to be their duty to instruct Mr. Willoughby to reduce the amount of his bills upon the Treasurer; and to authorize him, if necessary, to close one or more of the schools. It is, however, with much thankfulness the Committee are able to add, that Mr. Willoughby effected the required reduction without any other change than that of making Bay Roberts, under Mr. Burkitt's care, again a branch of Port de Grave, instead of a principal school. The small number of children in attendance at Bay Roberts had proved the necessity for removing Mr. Burkitt, and although he might have been advantageously placed at Little Placentia, yet, as he was very anxious to come to England on his private affairs, he was permitted to do so; and this has led to the dissolution of his connexion with the Society.

The following sums have been, since the last Report, remitted for books sold, viz.

To the British and Foreign Bible Society £20

To the Religious Tract Society £20

To the Prayer Book and Homily Society £10

It was stated in the last Report, that Mr. Willoughby proposed to return from Upper Canada to Quebec, by way of Montreal, and hoped to reach Newfoundland in May. He arrived in safety at St. John's, Newfoundland, in time for the

Annual Meeting of the Teachers, having visited most of the places of importance in Lower Canada and New Brunswick. Mr. Willoughby found numerous openings for schools, where such Teachers as your Society now have in Newfoundland would prove a great blessing, and be joyfully received. He sent home one very earnest application for a Teacher and a school for a population of about 4000.

Your Committee, while expressing their concern that the Society's contracted means would not allow them to comply with this request, cannot refrain from again observing, that this portion of the British empire presents a most encouraging and extensive field for Christian enterprize. His Excellency, Sir John Colborne, the Governor of Upper Canada, is a warm friend and patron of religious education, and has much at heart the best interests of the provinces under his care; and your Committee feel assured, that, if they were entrusted with ampler funds, they would have no difficulty in establishing many schools, especially in Upper Canada, with the same success as they have done in Newfoundland.

HOME PROCEEDINGS.

The amount received during the year from subscriptions, donations, associations, and collections, is £1629.5s.8d. The contributions in Newfoundland, reduced to sterling money, amount to £375.0s.9d. And a legacy of £100, left by the late Mrs. Hannah More, has been received, after deducting the duty and expences.

The payments during the same period have amounted to £2709.11s.1d.; and your Committee are deeply concerned to add, that the Treasurer was in advance, on the 31st March, 1834, no less a sum than £703.15s.6d.

Feeling the importance of making a strenuous effort to increase the Society's funds, your Secretary, early in the spring of last year, opened a correspondence with every friend of the Society throughout the country, proposing specific days for

visiting each place ; but, from various uncontrollable circumstances, meetings were held only at Exeter, Teignmouth, Dartmouth, Devonport, Gloster, Hereford, Cheltenham, Brighton, York, Poole, Bath, Bristol, and Southampton, in each of which places Sermons on behalf of the Society were preached.

The state of your Secretary's health not allowing him to perform any public duty during the latter part of the year, he obtained the assistance of the following clergy on the above occasions :—The Rev. D. Wilson, Vicar of Islington ; the Rev. T. Sims ; Rev. F. Close, of Cheltenham ; Rev. H. Budd ; Rev. J. Hambleton ; Rev. S. Langston ; Rev. J. H. Walker ; Rev. J. W. Watts ; Rev. Mr. Hodgson ; Rev. S. R. Capel ; whose valuable services the Committee desire to acknowledge with sincere thankfulness.

Mr. W. Jeynes, the Master of the Central School in St. John's, also attended meetings while he was in this country. Soon after the Anniversary Meeting last year, he accompanied your Secretary to Staines, where a public meeting was held in the School-room, and a fresh interest excited in favor of the Society. While in Devonshire, he also attended meetings at Exeter, Teignmouth, and Devonport, as well as several private meetings to which he was invited.

The thanks of your Committee are eminently due to the Rev. Jas. Ford, and your many kind friends in Exeter, for their increased exertions, which have enabled them to remit no less than £84.9s..8d. to the funds of your Society in the year just closed.

Your Committee would take this opportunity of expressing their gratitude also to their associated friends at Camberwell, Tulse Hill, and Islington, for the contributions which their energetic efforts have sent to your Society during the past year.

Your Committee have further to acknowledge their obligations to those of the Clergy who have opened their churches to the Society throughout the country ; and they desire also to express their best thanks to the Rev. H. Stowell, of Man-

chester, for his sermon preached at St. John's Chapel, Bedford Row, and to the Hon. and Rev. B. W. Noel, who again very kindly advocated your cause in the church of St. Swithin, Cannon Street: and among those who have most effectually come to the help of your Institution in its time of need, and who ought to be mentioned by the Committee with peculiar gratitude, is the Rev. F. Bevan: that gentleman last year gave to the Society £50, and has this year again contributed the same sum.

The Committee close this Report of their proceedings, during the past year, with emotions of deep anxiety for the present and future well being of your Society. Hope and fear alternately checquer the prospect. In Newfoundland all is encouragement, whether the prosperity of the Schools is considered—the competency of the Teachers—the attachment of the inhabitants—or the countenance and liberal patronage of the government and the merchants: while, on the contrary, at home the Society languishes, notwithstanding its acknowledged adaptation to the moral and religious wants of our Colonies.

As an Education Society, it is an indispensable forerunner to the successful circulation of the Scriptures and the preaching of the Gospel in Newfoundland and British North America. The souls which are the objects of its solicitude at present are comparatively few; but if without the knowledge of Christ they must perish in their sins, what can justify the withholding the means of communicating to them that knowledge?

There is scarcely a county in Great Britain of which it may not be said, that it is represented in Newfoundland or the Canada's by some of its children: but how represented? Not in its moral order, its social happiness—not in its spiritual light and beauty: No! These wanderers from home have left the land of Sabbaths and of Bibles—of happy churches and faithful and affectionate pastors—and many sigh for their lost privileges, and anxiously look to the churches of their native land freely to bestow upon them a small portion

of that spiritual wealth which they, through the riches of Divine Grace, have so freely and abundantly received.

From the experience of ten years, the Committee feel assured that a very moderate exercise of Christian zeal on the part of the Society's friends would secure a sufficient income for its present wants; and they earnestly implore Almighty God to stir up the wills of his faithful people to help them forward in their work: and particularly they would request the prayers of all the Members of the Society on this behalf.

It would, indeed, be a lamentable reproach to the Established Churches of Great Britain, if this cause of education in Newfoundland and British North America should now, after surmounting so many difficulties, and obtaining a sure footing in the former Colony, with a reasonable prospect of increasing assistance from colonial funds, fall to ruin for want of a little love and liberality at home. May the good Lord, in his tender pity to the scattered and perishing thousands of immortal souls in the British Colonies, avert so great a disaster!
