We are powerless to-day to combat with the Consumers' Gas Company, but there was a time when their valuable franchise was the absolute property of the citizens. At that time there was no necessity to propose arbitration in order that we might have the privilege of buying back our property at several million llars. A similar opportunity to that which existed in the last generation to secure cheap gas for all time to come was open to the Ontario Government last year, when the franchise for the developm of electric power at Niagara Falls expired through default. We will strive in vain to do in ten years hence what we might

have accomplished without effort this year For the new load which has been fastened on the shoulders of the people Premier Hardy, the leader of the most corrupt party that ever disgraced the annals of Canada, must be held responsible.


# ROOT THEM OUT.



# DIVISIBLE PAYMENTS.

The amount of general taxes may be divided into two instalments and local improvement rates, and on the payment of the first of such instalments on or before the 21st day of August, an extension of time shall be given for the payment of the local improvement rates to the 12th day of October; and on the payment of the first instalment and local improvement rates on the days named, an extension of time shall be given for the payment of the second instalment of general taxes to the 12th day of December.

ALLOWANCE FOR PAYMENT IN ADVANCE.

1.-Ratepayers who prefer paying their taxes in full on or before the 21st day of August shall be entitled to a reduction of one and one-half per cent. on the pay ment of the local improvement rates and the second instalment, which might be de-ferred to the 12th of October, and the 12th day of December, respectively, but if only Local Improvement Rates are paid with the first instalment, a reduction of one per cent, only will be allowed on the Local Improvement Rates. 2.-Ratepayers who have duly paid the first instalment, and on or before the 12th day of October prefer paying the remaining instalment, shall be entitled to a re-duction of one per cent. on the last instalment.

# PERCENTAGE.

An addition of five per cent. shall be made to every tax rate or assessment, at any part or instalment thereof, remaining unpaid after any of the dates herein men-tioned for the payment thereof, and being the actual instalment or instalments then in default, and it shall be the duty of the Collectors of Taxes to collect by distress or otherwise all such taxes or instalment of taxes as remain unpaid, together with the said percentage charge of five per cent. Provided, however, that upon any taxes payable before the 12th day of December next, and not paid on or before the day or days herein fixed for payment, the following percentages only shall be charged and payable:

days herein fixed for payment, the following percentages only shall be charged anapayable: On taxes payable on the 21st of August, if paid before the 20th of September, one-half of 1 per cent., after 20th September 5 per cent, will be added. On taxes payable on the 12th of October, if paid before the 11th of November, one-half of 1 per cent., after 11th November 5 per cent. will be added. Failure to pay not only forfelts the right of settlement by instalments but brings the parties under the penalty of the Assessment Law, which enacts that in case space of fourteen days after demand, the Collector shall levy the same with costs by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the party who ought to pay tho same.
