THAT TERRIBLE BURRIGONE.  
SOME DETAILS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED ABOUT THE DESTRUCTION CAUSED IN PORTO RICO.

LOSS AWAY UP IN THE MILLIONS.  
HUNDREDS OF PEOPLE HAVE BEEN KILLED AND AMERICANS HAVE SUFFERED ALONG WITH NATIVES.

San Juan de Porto Rico, Aug. 10.—A hurricane broke over the south coast at 1 o'clock Tuesday morning and swept west. There was no abatement for nine hours, the greatest damage being done between 8 and 10 a.m. The wires were down, and communication with the interior was swept away. There is no communication carried on by couriers. Here at San Juan, four natives were drowned in the harbor; 80 houses were demolished and hundreds were unroofed. The damage to property is estimated at \$500,000. Costly stores to the value of \$50,000 were destroyed.

Once Almost Destroyed.  
A despatch by cable from Ponce, sent at 10 o'clock this morning, says that town was almost completely destroyed. The main buildings are down; the bridge is swept away. There is no communication between the port and the city. The damage to the port is estimated at \$200,000. The records and property of the customs are ruined, and all the vessels are ashore.

Standard Oil Co. Hit.  
At Canano the entire plant of the Standard Oil Company was ruined. The loss on the property is about \$200,000. At Bayamon a majority of the houses were destroyed, and the Standard Oil Company's property was ruined. Two hundred cattle were killed, and the railway was seriously damaged.

Half a Million Lost.  
A courier who has just arrived from Humacao, capital of the province of Pinar, reports awful destruction there. The loss to property is estimated at \$500,000. The loss in the lives of the disaster is estimated at \$400,000.

Forty-Six Bodies Recovered.  
The courier brought an official report from Capt. Eben Swift of the 6th United States Cavalry, who says: "Humacao was totally destroyed. Forty-six bodies have been recovered. There are many more in the debris. Eight or ten of the bodies were badly mangled. The bodies of the 15th Infantry, who were killed at the port of Humacao, have been recovered. Thirty thousand people were killed at Las Piedras and five at Juncos."

Loss of \$700,000.  
Couriers from the other districts are anxiously expected at the palace. The steamship "Cape Horn" was wrecked on the coast of San Juan, was caught in the storm, and the crew were saved through the heroism of the crew. The first officer, the coffee crop is ruined and the loss is estimated at \$700,000.

Truly It Was Awful.  
St. Thomas, D. W. I., Aug. 10.—(Special.)—The destruction of the island of San Juan, Porto Rico, is truly awful. The loss of life and property is estimated at \$700,000.

It is Suspected That the Censorship of Despatches is Again Active.

STILL TALKING ABOUT WAR.  
It is Said Kruger Will Not, However, Try to Make Englishmen Fight Englishmen.

BOER COMMANDING OFFICERS Have Notified Volunteers to Be Ready and There is Military Activity at Pietermaritzburg.

London, Aug. 11.—There is little actual news this morning, concerning Transvaal affairs. From the silence of the despatches regarding Mr. Chamberlain's speech it is believed that the censorship is again active. It is evident, however, that the amendment to the constitution empowering the Government, in the event of war, to call upon all inhabitants, without distinction, to assist in the defence of the state, has created some amount of alarm.

Despatches from Pietermaritzburg report the considerable military activity there. The commanding officers have notified the volunteers and issued circulars notifying the volunteers to hold themselves in readiness for active service.

Five Years' Limit Made.  
London, Aug. 11.—The Pretoria correspondent writes: "In order to avoid interference with the Transvaal's internal affairs, which is the strongest objection to the proposed constitution, the franchise bill, the adoption of a five-years' limit on the franchise, has been decided upon."

Kruger Stands by the Lead.  
The Johannesburg correspondent of the "Daily Mail" writes: "The Volksraad has today (Thursday) decided to stand by the lead of the Government. The Volksraad, he continued, was afraid to go to the right hand and away from the lead."

What is the C.P.R. Dividend?  
Much Interest Manifested in Money Circles in Montreal as to What Mr. Shaughnessy Will Do.

President Loubet Signed Decree Reducing the Sugar Bounties.

Paris, Aug. 10.—President Loubet has signed a decree fixing the bounties on two categories of sugar for the year 1899 as follows: The first category, 75 centimes instead of 3 francs 50 centimes on sugars of the first category; 3 francs 10 centimes instead of 4 francs on sugars of the second category; 3 francs 50 centimes instead of 4 francs 50 centimes on sugar of the third category.

The municipal taxes of the City of Toronto for the year 1899 are due and payable as above under City By-Laws Nos. 3739 and 3740, and certain local improvement By-Laws.

Taxes are Payable at the City Treasurer's Office, New City Hall Buildings, Queen Street.

The City Hall and Branch Offices will be open from 9 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m., for the first four of the special days of collection (Sundays excepted), and from 9 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m. on the last mentioned special days, viz., 21st August, 12th October and 12th December.

First Instalment Payable from Wednesday, 16th of August, to Monday, 21st of August, both days inclusive.

Notice is hereby given, pursuant to By-Law No. 3740, passed on the 26th day of June, 1899, that provision is therein made for the payment of taxes for the current year in the manner following:

DIVISIBLE PAYMENTS.

The amount of general taxes may be divided into two instalments and local improvement rates, and on the payment of the first of such instalments on or before the 21st day of August, an extension of time shall be given for the payment of the local improvement rates to the 12th day of October; and on the payment of the first instalment and local improvement rates on the days named, an extension of time shall be given for the payment of the second instalment of general taxes to the 12th day of December.

ALLOWANCE FOR PAYMENT IN ADVANCE.

1.—Ratepayers who prefer paying their taxes in full on or before the 21st day of August shall be entitled to a reduction of one and one-half per cent. on the payment of the local improvement rates and the second instalment, which might be deferred to the 12th of October, and on the payment of the first instalment and local improvement rates on the days named, a reduction of one per cent. only will be allowed on the local improvement rates.

PERCENTAGE.

An addition of five per cent. shall be made to every tax rate or assessment, of any part or instalment thereof, remaining unpaid after any of the dates herein mentioned for the payment thereof, and being the actual instalment or instalments due in default, and it shall be the duty of the Collectors of Taxes to collect by distress or otherwise all such taxes or instalments of taxes as remain unpaid, together with the said percentage charge of five per cent. Provided, however, that upon any tax payable before the 12th day of December next, and not paid on or before the day or days herein fixed for payment, the following percentages only shall be charged and payable:

On taxes payable on the 21st of August, if paid before the 20th of September, one-half of 1 per cent., after 20th September 5 per cent. will be added. On taxes payable on the 12th of October, if paid before the 11th of November, one-half of 1 per cent., after 11th November 5 per cent. will be added.
