A DESIRABLE OFFICIAL. The renewed suggestion of the Mutual Underwriters' Association of Ontario for the appointment of a provincial fire marshal is one that is worth the serious consideration of the government.

The World recently quoted from the annual report of the fire marshal for the State of Ohio, in which he says: The need of a fire marshal to the securing of evidence in cases of incendiarism is shown by the fact that in the last 2-1/2 years the number of convictions for incendiarism in Ohio has exceeded that for the hundred years preceding the creation of the fire marshal's department.

Nine states of the union now have fire marshal departments, and in five others the commission of insurance has the powers of a fire marshal. In eighteen states effort is being made to secure fire marshal laws, which provide that the cause, origin and circumstances of every fire which damages property occurring in the state shall be investigated by a municipal or township officer and reported to the state fire marshal, who has all the power of a court. In Ohio last year there were 109 convictions for arson.

On account of this change the financial operations of the government for the ten months of 1909 will not advantage the provincial treasurer, as the large expenditures of the government are made during the early months of the year, while the large receipts always come in November and December.

Receipts and Expenditure. The estimated receipts for ten months of 1909 are \$6,105,722.08, including cash balance Dec. 31, 1908, and amount to \$9,177,408.88, and are made up as follows:

Hydro Power Saving. Dealing with the hydro-electric power commission, the provincial treasurer stated that so far the saving over contracts including estimates for equipment unwarmed, was \$481,599.
