



EXTRACTS FROM THE RULES OF THE SOCIETY.

2. The management of the Society shall be under the direction of persons who are members of the Church of England in Canada, and all the agents of the Society shall likewise be members of the same.

3. The selection, appointment, removal and field of labor of all the agents, together with the amount of their respective salaries, shall rest entirely with the Committee of the Society. The Clergymen employed by the Society shall be subject to the ecclesiastical jurisdiction of their Diocesans; and the schools shall be opened at all times to the visits of the Diocesan and the parochial missionary Clergy in their respective districts.

The following Resolutions relative to membership were adopted by the Corresponding Committee at the meeting held in the Committee room on August 5th, 1877 :

Resolved,—“ That every new member to be added to the Corresponding Committee of the Colonial Church and School Society, Montreal, shall be proposed at one meeting and elected at the next.”

Resolved,—“ That no layman shall be eligible as a member unless he is, or is willing to become a subscriber to the funds of the Colonial Church and School Society, of not less than five dollars per annum. That no clergyman shall be eligible unless an annual parochial collection is made by him for the Society, or unless he himself is, or is willing to become a subscriber to the Society of five dollars per annum.”

Resolved,—“ That members of the Corresponding Committee who for one year absent themselves from its meetings shall, *ipso facto*, not be continued on the list of the Committee.”

SABREVOIS MISSION.

BASIS OF ITS OPERATION.

I.—The whole work, known as "The Sabrevois Mission," is conducted by the Corresponding Committee of the Colonial Church and School Society in Montreal ; of which Committee the Bishop of the Diocese is, *ex-officio*, Chairman.

II.—The Secretary of the Committee is also Superintendent of the Mission, having full charge and ordering of its affairs, under the Committee. To him all Missionaries and Agents are responsible, and shall correspond with him in all matters connected with the missions, shall render to him all necessary reports of work done, and returns of all collections and disbursements, and at all times give him such information as he may deem needful to publish or submit to the Committee.

III.—As a Mission, supported by a Church of England Society and other Church aid, it shall be strictly ordered, in all its missionary operations, according to the order of the Church. No deviations shall be made from this, except with the sanction of the Bishop.

IV.—The Sabrevois Mission Schools were originally founded and are supported for the express purpose of giving to children of Roman Catholics and converts a good education, combined with sound religious instruction, according to the doctrine of the Church of England.

V.—In the schools, young men preparing for the Ministry, or as Colporteurs, or as Teachers, shall be regarded as a separate class. When sufficiently advanced, those intending to take Holy Orders shall, excepting under special circumstances, enter some Theological training college.

VI.—No English-speaking children shall be admitted into the schools, save in such exceptional cases as shall be sanctioned by the Committee.

VII.—The clergyman who has charge of the schools and the general oversight of the institution, shall be styled the **PRINCIPAL**.

VIII.—No Teachers or Agents shall be engaged in the schools, or other departments of the Mission, without the advice of the Superintendent and the sanction of the Committee.

IX.—The chief aim of the Committee, in conducting the Mission, shall be to reach the French Roman Catholic population, especially by the engagement of Colporteurs, and, through them, to bring Roman Catholic children into the schools.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1888-9.

The year's operations, a record of which is herewith submitted, have been limited by our lack of funds, and thus confined to the ordinary methods of past years. Among our most pressing needs at present is the separation of the offices of pastor of l'Eglise du Redempteur and Principal of the Mission Schools. Without this neither position can be satisfactorily filled, as both are sufficiently arduous and of sufficient importance to absorb the time and energies of an able and active missionary. Your committee would fain see their way clear to meet the increased expenditure involved in the above. Faithful as Principal Larivière has been in discharging the duties of the double position, much, especially of the Pastoral work, has been but partially done.

Through the generosity of Mrs. Phelps in placing funds for the purpose in the hands of the Lord Bishop, Mr. Norman Dumesnil, a pupil of the Mission Schools, and candidate for the Ministry, has been engaged as colporteur in connection with l'Eglise du Redempteur. His work is full of promise, and the report of his first month's work will be found interesting.

At a time when the entire country is stirred by the incorporation of the Jesuit Order and the bestowal upon them of four hundred thousand dollars of public funds, is it too much to hope that the work of French evangelization may receive such an impetus through more generous support as shall enable our efforts to be materially increased. Nothing can under God prove so effectual in resisting the advances of Romish ascendancy as giving the people the Gospel of peace and freedom.

The Rev. Canon Rollit, Missionary Agent, has laboured with success. The multiplicity of new missionary enterprises now demanding attention has greatly enhanced the difficulties of raising funds. During last summer the Rev. D. Larivière visited the Lower Provinces on behalf of our work and was well received. The Rev. J. J. Scully, an esteemed Presbyter of this Diocese, is now visiting Great Britain on behalf of our work, and the Rev. E. J. Fessenden has arranged to plead for us in the United States. The Rev. Jean Roy remains at Sabrevois, the early cradle of our work. At St. Francis Mr. John Tucker continues to minister to the Abenakis Indians. The post he fills is a trying one.

The Sabrevois Mission Schools have been worked very satisfactorily. The numbers in attendance might have been much larger, had our means permitted. In them the Canadian Church has a door ever open to receive any who desire to educate their children in the pure faith and truth of Protestantism.

An objection is sometimes raised to the number of children with English names attached to the schools. Your Committee would emphasize the fact that in this Province there are very many who are English in name but not so in tongue nor in religion, descendants of Wolfe's army, who remained in the country after the conquest. It has not been possible to make during the year any further reductions in grants to Country Schools.

Death has called away three much esteemed members of the Committee, viz., the Revs. Canons Duvernet and Belcher, and C. J. Brydges, Esq.

Once more expressing gratitude to our God who has blessed us hitherto, and renewing our thanks to the Parent Society as well as to our many and generous supporters in Canada, we beg to submit our Report.

REPORT OF THE LADIES' ASSOCIATION OF THE SABREVOIS MISSION, 1888-9.

The Ladies' Association report their meetings held and the Schools visited as usual during the year. Their collections this year were slightly in advance of last.

An "At Home" was held in the College in the month of October and was attended by many friends. The Ladies feel that its success was greatly due to the efforts of their President, Mrs. Gault, who made and carried out all the necessary arrangements.

Mrs. Shelton and Mrs. Lindsay being unable to attend the meetings, have requested that their names be taken off the Committee; and the Ladies have to deplore the removal from our midst, by death, of Miss Crawford, one of their oldest and most faithful members.

REPORT OF THE SABREVOIS MISSION SCHOOLS FOR 1888-9.

By REV. D. LARIVIÈRE, B.A., PRINCIPAL.

Humbly and heartily do we here express our thanks to Him who is the author of every good and perfect gift, for what we have been permitted and enabled to do during the past year.

The School re-opened on the 1st of October under very encouraging auspices. Applications for admission from all parts of Canada and the United States were received by us, and of these 77 were admitted, 47 being boarders and 30 day pupils.

The number of pupils admitted is yearly increasing, and it might increase more rapidly if our funds would permit. However, we have good reason to be encouraged when we think that by our little efforts 77 intelligent pupils were placed under the immediate influence of the Gospel, and have learnt during the school term the articles of our Church, and the beautiful prayers of our Liturgy. Out of these 77 pupils 13 belong to Roman Catholic families and the rest are for the most part the children of converts. We might have had several more were it not for the fear of annoyance and persecution from relatives and friends and trouble of a more serious kind from priests.

The year has been one of steady work, unbroken by sickness or any unusual events; the assistant teachers did their work diligently and well, and our pupils made good use of their time, as a consequence, the result of their work, as shown by their final examinations, was very satisfactory, even better than I expected.

The subjects that formed the basis of instruction were:—French and English, Mathematics and Classics, Vocal and Instrumental Music, Drawing, Book-keeping, History and Geography, the Catechism and Prayer Book, Romish Controversy and Old and New Testament History.

The final examinations were conducted on the same plan as last year.

Rev. Canon Empson, M.A., examiner in Euclid and Algebra, in his report says: "I consider the answering very satisfactory, and in every sense creditable to the Sabrevois College."

Dr. Henderson, Principal of the M.D.T.C., was the examiner in the Catechism and in the Old and New Testament History.

Rev. J. H. Dixon, Rector of St. Jude's, was the examiner in Romish Controversy.

Rev. G. Rogers, B.A., Rector of St. Luke's, was the examiner in Arithmetic.

Rev. L. V. Larivière, B.A., Incumbent at St. Hyacinthe, was the examiner in Latin and Greek.

Rev. N. P. Yates, B.A., Professor at the M.D.T.C., was the examiner in Canadian and English History.

They state that the papers submitted to them were very satisfactory and give proof of assiduous labour and progress.

Rev. S. Moore and Mr. A. J. Richer, assistant Teachers at the College, give similar testimony of the papers they examined.

Mr. E. W. Arthy, Secretary of the Protestant Board of School Commissioners, Montreal, examined our pupils in English Grammar, and this is his report: "I return you herewith the papers in English Grammar, corrected. In assigning values I have occasionally been a little more indulgent than I should be disposed to be with English scholars, in cases where the wording of a question has been obviously misunderstood, as for example, where a rule has been given instead of an illustration of the rule, or *vice versa*. In other respects the marking is, I think, sufficiently rigid. The Higher Class takes the high average of 76.8 per cent., and

the Lower 54.7. These results to my mind are highly satisfactory. The papers throughout show indication of careful and thorough training. Will you kindly convey to the students my congratulations on the success of their efforts."

Mr. J. W. Tucker, B.A., Professor in the High School, Montreal, was the examiner in the French subjects, he writes as follows: "I enclose to you the result of the French examination, which was both searching and severe, more so in the 1st Class. These results are satisfactory and encouraging. They are the best proof of the diligent application of the pupils to their studies, of the proper use they have made of their time and opportunities, and of the careful teaching they have received. They are besides a strong argument in favour of the zealous and energetic prosecution of French work. The answers were intelligent and the spelling good. In the High School such results as these would be called splendid. In the 1st Class the marks range between 85 and 67, with an average of 74 per cent. In correcting the papers I deducted one mark for each mistake in spelling or incorrect answer. This you see is severe marking. I was more lenient with the 2nd Class, deducting only half a mark for each error in spelling."

Three of our pupils have passed successfully the examinations for Matriculation in Arts, at Bishop's College, Lennoxville.

Another encouraging fact in connection with the work of the College is that five of our best young men, of whom four are matriculated in the Arts course, have made application to be admitted as theological students at the M. D. T. C. next September. One of these young men will be engaged as colporteur during the summer.

We are grateful to the Ladies of the Sabrevois Committee for their endeavour to promote the interest of the Mission, and especially to their President, Mrs. M. H. Gault, for her encouragement and help in our work during the past year.

Before closing my report, I beg to acknowledge the kindness of the Editor of the *Church Guardian*, Dr. L. H. Davidson, B.C.L., for sending gratuitously the *Church Guardian* to our pupils.

REPORT OF L'ÉGLISE DU RÉDEMPTEUR, MONTREAL, 1888-89.

BY REV. D. LARVIÈRE, B.A., PASTOR.

We are unable to report, I regret to say, any great progress in this field of labor. The cause of our seeming non-success in our Missionary work here in the Metropolis of Canada is not difficult to find. The funds at our disposal for the last five years have permitted us to have but one Missionary to carry on, both the work of l'Eglise du Rédempiteur and of the Sabrevois College. The Pastor being also the Principal of the College, cannot give all the time he would like to give to build up a congregation. During 7 months in the year the urgency of the work of the school leaves but little time for pastoral visitation. In every congregation, at all times and under all circumstances, pastoral visitation is an essential to success. In this of ours, it is the one thing needful. The work here has suffered much from our inability to spend more time in the Parish.

In referring to my last report, as it appeared in the Annual Report of the Society, I find these words, in relation to the need then felt of another Missionary to help us to carry on the work of the College and the Church. "As pastor of the Church, I will say, that in the interest of our congregation it would be very desirable if the incumbent of the Church could be relieved of all educational work, and be placed in the same position as all the other French Missionaries in this city. If I say this, it is not that I wish to win any compliment, nor that I have any desire to shirk the work, but because I know that there is work enough now for two more agents."

The need which was then felt and which we feel now is one of more laboueurs in the vineyard. The incumbent should be relieved of all other work, and give his whole time to the congregation. He should have time to find out and visit those who occasionally, especially in winter time, come to the evening service.

However, though the progress, as far as increasing the members of our Church is concerned, is not what we would wish it to be, yet we are not discouraged, for we think we are on the eve of a better time. Collecting agents in Canada and in England are now at work, and with God's blessing, will soon wipe off the existing debt on the College. Arrangements are now being made by which the incumbent will almost have his whole time for the work of his congregation, and another encouragement is that four or five young men, who have been for the last three years students at the Sabrevois College, are now about to enter at the Montreal Diocesan Theological College to prepare themselves for the work of the Ministry. While pursuing their course at the Theological College they will be, we are sure,

They have raised the funds sufficient to meet the current expenses and contributed \$21.00 to the Mission Fund of the Diocese. We hope that their continued zeal and patience will be rewarded by greater encouragement and greater success in the future.

THE REV. JEAN ROY, MISSIONARY AT SABREVOIS, REPORTS AS FOLLOWS

Sabrevois, 1st July, 1888.

Mention was made in my last report of typhoid fever being prevalent in the vicinity and of members of my congregation being prostrated with the disease, thanks be rendered to our heavenly Father, these have now recovered and no death has occurred in our midst by the epidemic. Alive, I trust, to the duty of parochial visitation, I have performed this duty faithfully and have offered many prayers with the sick. I also availed myself of the opportunities to point unto them the simple truth as it is in Jesus, with a free and perfect salvation to all who believe in Him, while insisting on the necessity of a holy life as an evidence of the sincerity of our repentance and faith. These visits have been blessed, signs of repentance were shown, and desire to live holy and religious lives expressed. Let us be "confident of this very thing, that he which began a good work will perfect it." Several Roman Catholic families in the neighborhood have also been visited, where I have been most cordially received and invited to return again. A family that I visited specially impressed, me, the woman was dangerously ill and lying on the verge of eternity, however, she was perfectly conscious, there were eight or nine persons in the room around the poor creature, they had hung the bead (chaplet) at her bedstead, and placed a crucifix, a scapular, and an *Agnus Dei* on her chest, to assuage pain, I presume, or give her better access to the gates of paradise. At the sight of these old remains of pagan Rome, "my spirit was stirred within me seeing the people wholly given to idolatry." I exhorted her to put her whole trust and confidence in the sacrifice and merits of our blessed Lord and Master. She spoke a few words in approval to what I said and all the R.C.'s present listened attentively. In other cases they heartily joined with us in the

prayers offered in behalf of the sick, and listened eagerly to the words of comfort and encouragement spoken for the occasion.

Interesting conversations might also be related, but I fear this would occupy too much space and I must pass them over in silence, to say one word or two with more direct reference to our work.

The exterior of the Church has been thoroughly repaired during this quarter. The wood of the steeple and window frames has been renovated where necessary, the stone-walls pointed, a new chimney built, and the windows and cornices painted. Some improvements have been made in the interior also, but much remains yet to be done.

The services of the Church have been changed from 3 to 7 p.m. and instead of the regular sermon, I give in the evening service an extempore address. The people are pleased with the change and both the morning and evening services are well attended. The Sunday-School is held at 2.30 p.m.—Number of visits during the quarter 120.

Sabrevois, 1st October, 1888.

Our Morning and Evening Services have been very well attended during the Summer, so is the Sunday-School. The children take a great interest in their lessons and have rarely missed a Sunday. I had an excellent class of candidates for Confirmation, ready to receive the imposition of the Bishop's hands at his first visit, which was to take place on the 1st October, but, unhappily, owing to circumstances, the Bishop is unable to visit us this year.

The inclement weather we have had, together with the bad state of the roads, prevented me from accomplishing the same number of visits as usual, but the sick I have regularly attended, and I trust that my visits among them have been blessed.

I am also thankful to say that I have met with words of encouragement from Roman Catholics who have knelt by our side to pray to one common Lord and Master, and who with tears eulogized the manner Protestant clergyman could pray and administer comfort and ghostly counsel to the afflicted. I could beside relate interesting conversations I have had with them, but this would make my report too long.

No less gratifying to me are the words of encouragement which I hear occasionally from my own congregation, most of whom show their appreciation of the divine services by a serious and earnest attention.

The Day-School under the teaching of Miss M. Riendeau, is doing well, and the children have made excellent progress. Twenty pupils are attending.

Number of Visits 30, Tracts and Sunday-School papers distributed 105, Bibles 2, Prayer-Books 4, Hymn-Books 10, The Ascension Catechisms, 12.

Sabrevois, 31st December, 1888.

The routine work of this Mission has been carried on during the past quarter with its customary regularity. The services of the Church have been well attended and on Christmas and New-Year's Day we have had very good services with larger attendances, I believe, than in any previous year.

A Christmas Tree and entertainment, which is always the delight of the young, at the return of the joyous season was provided. These festivals are always well patronized by Roman Catholics and exercise over them an influence for good. I have once more to acknowledge with thankfulness the zeal of our Church Wardens, Messrs. Charles Miller and Hermon Jones, in their office, and, I will add, for the kindness of our people towards myself and family.

I have made during the quarter 25 visits, distributed 75 tracts and Sunday-School papers, performed 1 Marriage and 3 Baptisms.

Sabrevois, 31st March, 1889.

It is with gratitude to God and with satisfaction to myself that I am again, at the end of another quarter, enabled to speak encouragingly of our congregation and of the work of this Mission generally. It may not have pleased God to have given any extraordinary token of His presence among us, but still I am impressed with the belief that the Gospel of our Lord is being made the power of God unto the salvation to some among us. The average attendance on the public means of grace is good and encouraging, and I do sincerely hope that the soul-inspiring service of our Church finds a hearty response within them and that when they go home, they feel indeed it has been good for them to be there.

Now for one fact or two as matter of encouragement. I had last autumn a class of young men as candidates for Confirmation. It is my habit to speak privately to each of these so as to have a better idea of their feeling and disposition. In addressing one of them I asked him if he had any notion of presenting himself as a candidate for Confirmation and if he was prepared to renew the solemn vow and promise that was made for him at his baptism. He replied that he was not prepared to renew this promise and that he had no notion of being now Confirmed as he was not a Christian. I urged upon him to prepare and not lose the present opportunity of consecrating himself to God, delay was dangerous, and if he did so he would in all probability never become a Christian.

He replied that he would think over the matter and would bring me an answer on the next Sunday. The following Sunday he expressed his desire of being now Confirmed and said that he had decided to consecrate himself to God. This same young man who is a person of ability and promise has concluded lately to study for the Ministry and he has obtained promise of admission to a Theological College. He is now a regular communicant. Another one who had always lived a careless life expressed his determination of becoming a soldier of the cross and of giving his whole heart to Christ. He too has become a communicant.

In my visits with Roman Catholics I have had some interesting conversations but I fear it would occupy too much space to relate them here as my report is already long. Meanwhile, the Jesuits, who have so stirred the Protestant element of our Dominion with their incorporation bill and the \$400,000.00 voted them, are hard at work spreading their nefarious influence, which has already reached us. Our attention has been called lately to a Reverend Father lecturing in the interest of the Society, whose lectures have been reported in some papers, and from which it appears that the Reverend gentleman is circulating the fabricated story that the late Mr. Charles Roy, the first convert of this community "had 40 years ago seceded from the Church and become Protestant with some other families owing to a difference with a local priest over levying a rate for the erection of a new Church." Nothing can be more false. It is well known through the community that this new Church was built a good many years before Mr. Roy left the Church, that he never was in any difficulty with the local priest, and that even after he was become Protestant he made all his payments for the erection of the new Church, though not bound to do so, alleging for reason that no one then would be able to impute him pecuniary motives for leaving the Church of Rome. In reply to the assertion of the Reverend Father a document was circulated in the locality denying the statement as a deliberate falsehood and slanderous fable.— It has been signed by the oldest Protestants of the community and four Roman

Catholics, among others the mayor and two justices of the peace. A larger number among them could easily have been secured to sign had it been desirable, but the number was deemed amply sufficient. To prove the genuineness of the signatures, the person who has had charge of the document was sworn before a justice of the peace.

MR. JOHN TUCKER, Catechist Missionary at St. Francis, reports as follows :—

My Mission work among the Indians of St. Francis during the past year has been very encouraging. Church attendance, has been good. At all my services every house being represented. This means to say much, as the Indians entertain a natural aversion to going to Church. They consider the Sabbath as a day of leisure and like to spend its sacred hours in visiting and strolling about. This is characteristic alike both of Protestant and Roman Catholic. Their going to Church is due solely, under God, to the real hard labor and influence of the missionary.

I have visited from house to house Protestant and Roman Catholic, setting before every one the words of eternal life as it is in Christ Jesus. I also exhorted them to accept Jesus as the only Saviour and Mediator; referring to the word of God as to the support of this great truth, I prove to them at the same time that angels and saints are not mediators between God and man. That God loves his people and by the blood of his dear Son alone our souls are washed from guilt and sin and that He will never put his servants to suffer in the flames of purgatory. I also show them that man is justified by faith and not by works, that good works are the consequences of a strong faith. I have adopted a plan to bring these truths before my people and it works admirably. In every house almost there is an old person who only understands the Indian language; I ask one of the family to be interpreter; they willingly accept office as they do not like to refuse me a favor. This increases an interest in the conversation and invariably makes an impression on all. Many Roman Catholics have attended my services during the past year. Some I trust will become Protestant shortly; but they find this a hard step. Let us pray God to help them.

Report of Mr. Norman Dumesnil, Colporteur.

I beg to submit the following report of my first month's work, as colporteur in connection with l'Église du Rédempteur, Montreal. I gained access to upwards of a thousand houses, most of which were the houses of French Canadian Roman Catholics. In most of these places I was able to say something in the Master's name, if it was but a word, or a Text of Scripture quoted. Of course I was ordered out by some just as soon as they knew I was a Protestant Missionary, but in no case rudely, or even harshly. I was able to distribute Bibles, Testaments and French Prayer-Books at the rate of fifteen per week. In many cases the latter were very much appreciated and admired. In one family I found a young man, a cripple who has never been able to attend any Church on account of his infirmity. To him I gave a copy of God's Word, and at his request I returned to see him again, and found that he had read it eagerly and was most anxious to be instructed therein. I spent two afternoons in conversation with him and the members of the family, on the subject of salvation in Jesus-Christ. I have a good hope, that when I renew my visits, I may have the joy of seeing them embrace the gospel of peace and light.

Roy had given her a Bible some years ago which she had read with much pleasure, but she had lost it and was most anxious to obtain another; great was her delight when I gave her one. She promised to read it diligently. I reported both these cases to Rev. D. Larivière in order that they may be visited. In conclusion, I can only say, I am casting my bread upon the waters, in prayer and faith, leaving results to God. I would ask the Christian readers of the report, kindly to follow my work with their prayers that God by His Holy Spirit may open doors for me to enter and bless the seed sown.
