

Literary Lectures.

Last evening the Rev. J. M. deSoyres opened a course of lectures which is to be held this winter in connection with St. John's church, by a brilliant lecture on the great novelist William Makepeace Thackeray. In chosing a subject of this kind the rector of St. Marks showed good taste and judgment, and gave an example which we trust will be generally followed. St. John is not renowned as a literary centre. A critic who looked closely at the characteristics of our people might say with a great deal of truth that they are not conspicuously literary. Perhaps it is because the conditions of life are harder here than in other cities, that our men have to work so incessant ly to make a living, or perhaps it is that too much devotion to toil in their youth, has given our people a distaste for literary pursuits. But certainly it cannot be denied that the majority of the people of St. John, would be improved in many ways by giving up more of their attention to those great masterpieces of English literature, which will stand out as landmarks for all time, of the intellectual progress of the century. No better theme could be chosen for the initial lecture of a literary course than Thackeray whose incisive style, whose familiarity with the weaknesses of mankind, and whose daring characterization and analysis of human nature make him beyond all comparison the ablest noveliat of the age. 
