






DEDICATION












BIOLOGY CLUB



FRATERNITAS was based on the belief that a growing University campus requires a broad meeting point for different ideas and religions. Any organization that seeks to limit itself inflexibly to a single viewpoint has no real place in a University. Inevitably, FRATERNITAS developed into a humanities group, discussing anything from the use of force in desegregation to the status of females in modern society. A minimum of restriction was placed on the expression of opinions. I cannot say that FRATERNITAS produced answers to social problems. Rather, we sought a fuller appreciation of a problem. If any beliefgoverned our approach to prejudice and group relations, it would be this: "Justice, Justice shalt thou pursue".

Our contact with other groups and students was enhanced by participation in the "Winter Institute on Human Relations" at Brandon, and our own Regina Campus seminar on "Brotherhood of Man". Special thanks are due to the Council of Christians and Jews for assistance in many of our activities. As our staff advisor, Dr. Harvey Mitchell was a sympathetic and encouraging mentor and "father". I can only hope that future students will consider the work of FRATERNITAS worthy of being continued.

The executive was elected at the beginning of the year and regular meetings were held once a month thereafter.


Speakers included Mr. G.M. Cairns from Imperial Oil and Mr. J.L. Reigert from the Department of Public Health.

We wish to thank all the members of the Chemistry Department for their assistance throughout the year.






The sale of poppies also came under this slate of activities. As with Treasure Van, Regina Campus set a high sale record.

















Drawing of the elevation for the podium concept being used in the building of the new Regina Campus.







Good-bye for now.


