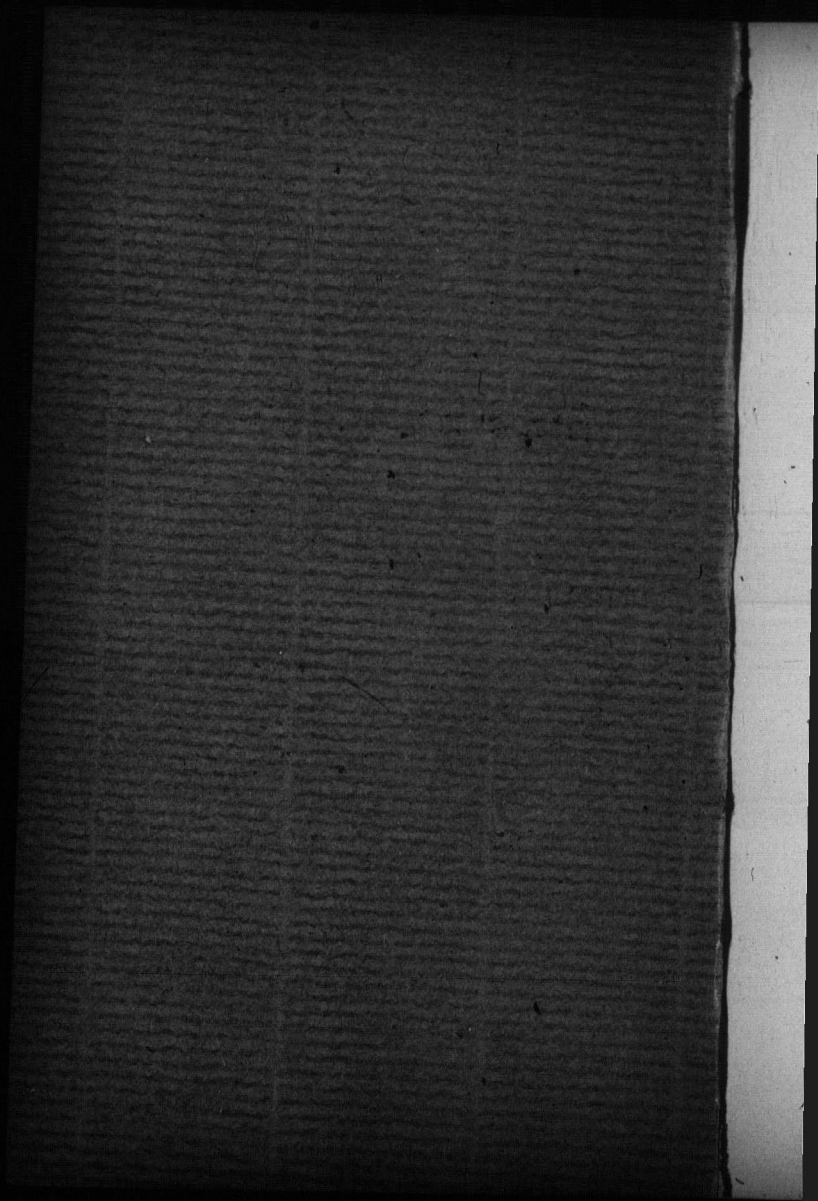

ADMISSION.

THE ACADEMIC YEAR consists of one Term, commencing on the FIRST MONDAY IN SEPTEMBER and ending on the FRIDAY preceding the FIRST MONDAY IN JULY.

Students will be admitted on the following conditions:

Those who have already passed the entrance examination to any of the High Schools or County Academies, those holding High School Certificates of any Grade, those holding Teachers' Licenses, those holding Provincial Normal School Diplomas, will be admitted without further examination. All others will be required to pass an examination on the following,—

(1). ENGLISH.—Punctuation, Sentence Building, Correcting Wrong Forms, Elements of Prosody, Figures of Speech, &c. Prescribed text book in Grammar omitting notes and small print.

(2). GEOGRAPHY.—Elementary Geography in full with special attention given to map drill.

(b). HISTORY.—History of British America. British History as in "Brief History of England."

(3). ARITHMETIC.—As in Kennedy and O'Hearn. Algebra, fundamental rules. Special attention should be given to evaluation of Algebraic expressions.

(4). USEFUL KNOWLEDGE.—A paper containing questions on useful knowledge as embraced in the Common School Course. The Health Readers No. I. and II., and Chemistry and Physics Primers give an idea of work required. Analysis of a few common plants as in Gray's Botany. There will be an imperative question on Tonic-sol-fa notation.

(6). DRAWING, WRITING, and SIMPLE ACCOUNTS.—Construction of Angles and Simple Geometrical figures to

scale and their measurement. Drawing as in Manual Training No. 2, and Public School Drawing Course Nos. 5 and 6. A simple set of Book-keeping.

This examination will be held, beginning on the first Monday of July, 1896. The papers will be prepared by the Department of Education at Halifax, and will be forwarded to the Principal, under seal. To pass this examination candidates must make at least an average of 50, with no paper below 25. Successful candidates will receive a certificate of having passed the High School Entrance Examination.

SUPPLEMENTARY EXAMINATIONS.—Candidates who are unable to be present at the regular examination, may, at the discretion of the Principal or Faculty, be admitted to a supplementary examination at the opening of the School Year. This Examination, if such is found necessary, will be held on the first Tuesday of September.

SPECIAL STUDENTS.—Students may be admitted to a special course on the recommendation of the Principal or Faculty, provided they do not encroach upon the privileges of the regular students.

CLASSIFICATION.—The work of Academy is divided into four grades or years, namely:—the *First Year* or grade "D," the *Second Year* or grade "C," the *Third Year* or grade "B," and the *Fourth Year* or grade "A."

HIGH SCHOOL EXAMINATION.—At the end of the year, examinations will be provided for the different grades by the Department of Education at Halifax. Candidates passing these examinations will receive High School Certificates of the corresponding grade.

MINIMUM PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATION EXAMINATION.—This Examination will take place on the Saturday immediately following the High School Examination and will be on the following subjects: (1) School Law and Management. (2) Teaching. (3) Temperance and School Hygiene.

This Examination is only required of such students as purpose teaching without first receiving a Normal School training. A fee of \$2 is necessary for this Examination.

These Examinations will be held the first week in July. The April *Journal of Education* will contain full information as to days and hours for each paper.

Students are expected to pass these grades in order. At the discretion of the Faculty students may be admitted to a higher grade than that to which their High School Certificate entitles them. Such students may be required to take Botany if not holding a "D" Certificate, and Chemistry and Book-keeping if not holding "C," if a pass has not been already made in these subjects.

COURSE OF STUDY.

FIRST YEAR OR GRADE D.

1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE.—(a) Selections from 6th Reader, and Goldsmith's *Deserted Village* (or an author prescribed during the year), with critical study, word analysis, prosody and recitations. (b) Text Book of English Composition, with essays, abstracts and general correspondence.

Regular Class Essays on assigned subjects will be required during the year.

2. ENGLISH GRAMMAR.—Text book (excepting "notes" and "appendix") with easy exercises in parsing and analysis.

3. LATIN.—As in *Collar and Daniell*, to the end of Chapter I, III., with easy translation and composition exercises.

4. FRENCH.—As in Fasnacht's First year, with easy translation and composition exercises.

5. HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY.—(a) Text book of British History up to the House of Tudor, and oral lessons on "How Canada is governed. (b) Geography of North America and Europe as in Text book.

6. SCIENCE.—(a) Physics as in *Balfour Stewart's Primer*. (b) Botany as in *Gray's How Plants Grow*, substituting for details of "Flora," Part II, common or prescribed native plants. Drawing of Parts of Plants.

7. DRAWING AND BOOK-KEEPING.—(a) Construction of Geometrical figures and solution of mensuration and trigonometrical problems by mathematical instruments. (b) High School drawing course as in No. 1 with model and object drawing, and Manual Training, No. 2. (c) Commercial forms and writing with Single Entry Book keeping problems.

8. ARITHMETIC.—As in *Hamblin Smith* to end of Section 21, with practical knowledge of the metric system which will be required in all grades.

9. ALGEBRA.—As in *Hall and Knight's Elementary Algebra* to end of Chapter XIV.

10. GEOMETRY.—Euclid I, with very easy exercises as in *Hall and Stevens* to page 86.

The minimum aggregate for a "pass" is 400, with no subject below 25.

SECOND YEAR OR GRADE C.

1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE.—(a) Selections from 6th Reader and Goldsmith's *Deserted Village* with critical study, &c., as in previous grade but more advanced. (b) Advanced Text book of English Composition with practical work and essays.

2. ENGLISH GRAMMAR.—(a) Text book (excepting "appendix") completed with exercises in parsing and analysis.

3. LATIN.—As in *Collar and Daniell* complete and "*Cæsar's Invasion of Britain*," by Welsh and Duffield (MacMillan & Co., London).

4. GREEK.—As in *Frost's Greek Primer* (Allyn & Bacon, Boston) to end of Part III, or *Initia Græca*, Part I

5. FRENCH.—As in *French Principia* Parts I and II to end of page 79.

6. GERMAN.—As in *Fasnacht's* First year or equivalent.

7. HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY.—(a) Text book of British History from the House of Tudor to the present time. (b) Text book of Geography excepting North America and Europe.

8. SCIENCE.—(a) Chemistry as in *Williams*. (b) Mineralogy as in *Crosby's Common Rocks*, or Agricultural Chemistry as in *Tanner*.

9. DRAWING AND BOOK-KEEPING.—(a) Mathematical drawing as in previous grade continued with prescribed High School Drawing Course No. 2 and model and object with simple drawings from nature. (b) Book-keeping:—Double Entry forms and problems.

10. ARITHMETIC.—Text book complete without appendix.

11. ALGEBRA.—As in *Hall and Knight's Elementary* to end of chapter XXVII.

12. GEOMETRY.—Text book with exercises to Prop. 20, book III as in *Hall and Stevens*.

The minimum aggregate for a "pass" is 400 with no subject below 25.

THIRD YEAR OR GRADE B.

This examination may also be known as the Junior leaving examination of the High School.

2. ENGLISH LITERATURE.—Critical study of authors. (a) Irving's Sketch Book or DeQuincy's *Joan of Arc*. (Bingham, Maynard & Co., N. Y.) (b) Scott's *Lady of the Lake*.

ENGLISH GRAMMAR.—(a) History of English Language and Text book completed with difficult exercises. (b) History of English Literature as in Meiklejohn.

3. LATIN.—Grammar and easy composition partly based on Prose authors read.

4. LATIN.—(a) *Cæsar, De Bell. Gal.*, Book I. (b) Virgil, *Æneid*, Book II with grammatical and critical questions.

5. GREEK.—Grammar and easy composition based partly on authors read. *Frost's Primer* completed.

6. GREEK.—*Xenophon Anabasis* Book IV, with grammatical and critical questions.

7. FRENCH.—*Brachet's Public School Elementary French Grammar*, Souvestre's *Le Serfe* and Daudet's *La Belle Divarvaise*.

8. GERMAN.—*Fasnacht's Second Year*.

9. HISTORY AND GEOGRAPHY.—General History and Geography as in *Swinton*. Lectures on Canadian Constitution.

10. PHYSIOLOGY.—As in prescribed text, *Martin's Human Body, and the effects of Narcotics*.

11. PHYSICS.—As in *Gage's Introduction to Physical Science*.

12. PRACTICAL MATHEMATICS.—As in *Eaton*.

13. ALGEBRA AND ARITHMETIC.—As in *Hall and Knight's Elementary Algebra* and *Hamblin Smith's Arithmetic*.

14. GEOMETRY.—Euclid I to IV with exercises; definitions and algebraic demonstrations of Euclid V; and Euclid VI (text) to Prop. 19. *Hall and Stevens*.

The minimum aggregate for a "pass" is 400, with no subject below 25

FOURTH YEAR OR GRADE A.

The examination on this syllabus may be known as the Senior Leaving examination of the High School. There is in this grade a bifurcation of the course into a scientific side and a classical side, with minor options leading to the certificates of "A" (scientific) and "A" (classical) respectively.

(A) IMPERATIVE FOR BOTH SIDES.

1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE.—As in *Lounsbury's English Language*, *Shakespeare's Julius Caesar*.

2. ENGLISH LITERATURE.—*Stopford Brooke's Primer*. *Scott's Waverley* with *Hutton's Scott*.

3. BRITISH HISTORY.—As in *Green's Short History of the English People*, with the Canadian Constitution.

4. PSYCHOLOGY.—As in *James' Text Book of Psychology* (MacMillan & Co., London), or *Maher's* (Stoneyhurst Series),

5. SANITARY SCIENCE.—As in the Ontario Manual of Hygiene.

(B) IMPERATIVE FOR CLASSICAL SIDE.

1. LATIN GRAMMAR AND COMPOSITION.—Grammar as in *Bennett*, and Composition as in *Bradley's Arnold* or equivalents.

2. TACITUS.—Histories, Book I.

3. CICERO AND SALLUST.—(a) Cicero—First Oration against Cataline, *Kelsey's Cicero Allyn and Bacon, Boston*, is an excellent edition.

(b) Sallust. Conspiracy of Cataline.

4. VIRGIL.—*Aeneid*, Book VI.

5. HORACE.—*Odes*, Book III.

6. ROMAN HIST. AND GEOG.—As in *Liddell's*.

7. GREEK, GRAMMAR AND COMPOSITION.—Grammar as in *Goodwin* and Composition as in *Fletcher & Nicholson's* or equivalents.

8. XENOPHEN.—*Hellenica*, Book I and II. *Blake's Text, Allyn & Bacon*, is a suitable edition.

9. DEMOSTHENES.—*Philippics* I, II and III, (*Rivington's* London).

10. HOMER.—*Iliad*, Books I, II, III, omitting catalogue of Ships, Book II.

11. GREEK HISTORY AND GEOG.—As in *Smith's*.

(C) IMPERATIVE FOR SCIENTIFIC SIDE.

1. PHYSICS.—As in Gage's *Principles of Physics*.
- 2.—CHEMISTRY.—As in *Storer and Lindsay's Elementary*.
3. BOTANY.—As in *The Essentials of Botany* by Bessey (Henry Holt & Co., New York) with a practical knowledge of representative species of Nova Scotia flora.
4. ZOOLOGY.—As in *Dawson's Handbook*, with dissection of Nova Scotian species as in *Colton's Practical Zoology*.
5. GEOLOGY.—As in Sir William Dawson's *Hand Book of Canadian Geology* (excepting details relating to other Provinces from Page 167 to 235).
6. ASTRONOMY.—As in *Young's Elements of Astronomy*.
7. NAVIGATION.—As in *Lock's Elementary Trigonometry*.
8. TRIGONOMETRY.—*Lock's Elementary*.
9. ALGEBRA.—As in *Hall & Knights Higher Algebra*. (McMillan & Co, London), omitting "e" paragraphs and chapters XXVII to XXXI.
- 10.—GEOMETRY.—Including *Euclid VI and XI*, as in *Hall & Stevens* with exercises.

(D) OPTIONAL FOR BOTH SIDES.

1. FRENCH GRAMMAR AND COMPOSITION.
2. FRENCH AUTHORS.—Prosper Merimee's *Colomba* and *Corneille's le Cid*.
3. GERMAN GRAMMAR AND COMPOSITION.
4. GERMAN AUTHORS.—Hauff's *Wirtshaus in Spessart*. (McMillan & Co.)

To pass Grade A (scientific) a minimum aggregate of 1,000 must be made on twenty papers, including all in groups (A) and (C) and only other *five* papers.

To pass Grade A (classical) a minimum aggregate of 1000 must be made on twenty papers, including all in groups (A) and (B) and any other *four* papers.

Candidates who desire it may divide the work of this Examination over two successive years by taking ten subjects each year. When so taken an aggregate of 600 will be required on the ten subjects with no mark below 50.

THE LIBRARY.

The Library contains about 400 volumes, consisting of works in Classics, Mathematics, Science and General Literature. It has also a number of very valuable books of reference, including the *Encyclopædia Britannica*, and the *Century Dictionary* in ten volumes. Students may take books from the Library and keep them for a period of ten days. Such books must be first registered.

THE LABORATORY.

The Laboratory is furnished with a good supply of Physical and Chemical Apparatus, and all students have an opportunity of carrying on Practical Laboratory work.

THE MUSEUM.

The Museum is one of the largest and best equipped in the Province,

The Department of Mineralogy contains specimens of almost every known rock and mineral arranged and classified according to Dana. All the specimens contain different varieties. Many of them are very rare and valuable.

The Department of Conchology contains over five hundred specimens of shells, affording examples of every order of the mollusca.

The Department of Entomology has recently had added to it a large collection of Insects, the gift of Miss Lucy Eaton of Salmon River.

The Department of Ornithology contains specimens of a large number of our Nova Scotia birds and small wild animals properly mounted. It is purposed shortly to add specimens of every bird found in the Province.

MEDALS AND PRIZES, 1896-97.

THE GRADUATING CLASS GOLD MEDAL.—A Gold Medal, offered by the Graduating class of '96, will be awarded to the student of the "B" class making the highest standing in the work of the year.

THE MUIR SILVER MEDAL.—A Silver Medal offered by Dr. W. S. Muir will be awarded to the student of the "C" class standing highest in the work of the year.

THE G. O. FULTON PRIZE.—Books to the value of \$3 will be awarded by G. O. Fulton, Esq., to the student of the "C" class making second highest standing in the work of the year.

THE SMITH PRIZE.—Books to the value of \$3 will be awarded by D. H. Smith & Co., to the student of the "B" class making second highest standing in the work of the year.

THE ALUMNISTS' PRIZE.—Books to the value of \$5 will be awarded by the Alumnists of Academy to the student or students of the "B" class standing highest in English—two subjects. *The class essays will be counted as part of this work.*

THE LANGILLE PRIZE.—Dr. M. K. Langille will award a cash prize of \$3 to the student of the "B" class standing highest in the work of the year.

THE MAYOR'S PRIZE.—One or more volumes of books will be awarded by His Worship, the Mayor, for the highest standing in some subject which he may specify.

SPECIAL PRIZES.—THE BOARD OF SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS and THE FACULTY offer special book prizes to the value of \$20. These will be awarded for highest standing in the different subjects to which prizes have not already been assigned.

MATRICULATION.—Students who have passed the Junior High School Leaving or Grade B examination will be admitted to the standing of College Matriculants without further examination.

Students who have passed the Senior High School Leaving or Grade A examination will be admitted as College undergraduates of the second year.

SCIENTIFIC WORK.—In addition to the Laboratory classes in Chemistry, Physics, &c., a course of lectures will be given by leading specialists in the town. These lectures will be open to all students. Provisions will also be made for Botanical and other excursions during the summer.
