Extracts from Acts of Assembly.

When any County is incorporated, the Collectors of Rates for each Parish shall be elected on the day of the election for Councillors, furnish the Town Clerk with a correct list under their hands of all persons rated upon property for Parish or County rates for the year in which the said election is held.

Town Clerk of any freholder then present.

No person shall be elected a Councillor, unless he be an inhabitant of the County, seized and possessed at the time of his election of real estate of the value of one hundred and fifty pounds above encumbrances.

The meeting shall begin at ten o'clock in the morning, and if a poll be demanded, the chairman shall grant it, and keep the meeting open till four o'clock in the afternoon.

The voting for Councillors shall be by ballot; the names of the Candidates shall be written or printed on white paper, and delivered by the elector to the chairman of the meeting, who shall examine the same, and be satisfied that his vote is single, and deposit the same in the ballot box without reading.

At the hour of closing, each candidate may choose an elector, to be sworn before the chairman of meeting, as tellers, and the chairman shall publicly open the ballot box and take out each ballot separately and read the names thereon, so that each teller may take them down.

When all are read and taken down, the chairman shall state the number of votes polled for each candidate, and declare the two having the majority elected. The chairman shall give the casting vote if necessary.

The chairman within ten days after closing the election shall, under the penalty of twenty shillings for each day, make a return in writing to the Secretary Treasurer of the County, and shall also deliver to him the number of the voters for each candidate, which shall be open for inspection to any member of the corporation.

The chairman may, or if required by any person claiming to vote, the oath (B) in the Schedule.

The chairman during the time of election of Councillors, shall be invested with all the powers of a Justice for the preservation of the peace.

Each Parish shall elect two Councillors.

Failure of a Savings Bank.

HEARTRENDING SCENES. The New York "Herald" of Friday last, gives the following account of the scenes at the failure of a New York Savings Bank.

At the opening of banking hours yesterday morning honest people who had deposited their earnings in the Third Avenue Savings Bank, at Third Avenue and Twenty-sixth street, gathered about its doors to learn the truth of the report published in the "Herald" in the morning that the bank had failed.

Their worst fears were realized. At ten o'clock, a. m., the porter of the bank hung out a sign with the words "Bank closed" and a notice to the effect that the bank had failed. Their worst fears were realized.

For a few minutes the scene baffled and loudly proclaimed that the bank had failed.

The bank officials anticipated a detail of police to guard the building. The police were posted on the Third Avenue and Twenty-sixth streets, and the bank was closed.

One old lady, scarcely able to walk, leaning on the door of the bank, and holding on to the arm of her daughter. The tears were streaming down her cheeks and her voice was broken by sobs, as she said in the report of "Oh! all that we have in the world is in that bank; every dollar; nearly a thousand. I came here two weeks ago to get it. And they told me to wait until next week. Then I came again, and they told me to come yesterday. I came then, and the man said I must close. What shall I do? What can I do to pay my rent in the morning? It must be paid or the landlord will put us out. Oh! God! have pity on us! What can we do?"

One of the policemen on duty in front of the door said, "I had \$300 there last week, but my wife coaxed me to take it out." A butcher, doing business on the Second Avenue, deposited \$1,400 last week, fearing to keep it in his own house until to-day when he wanted to use it. Hundreds of poor people flocked around the doors early in the morning, for the news spread like wildfire, and earnestly denounced the managers of the bank for their supposed mismanagement.

The News of the 20th says: "The announcement that had been made that some amateur swimmers would on Saturday afternoon swim a race from London bridge caused a large number of spectators to assemble on the bridge. The tide was good but the wind, which, high water, was dead against the swimmer, rendered the race more unfavorable than on any previous occasion."
