of age, who lives at Jacques River, 25 miles

illegal rumrunner near his home, and

was standing on the ice. He brought a

barrel of liquor, got very drunk, and then

started for home. Two fellows saw him on

the road, attacked him and gave him such

beating that he is not expected to recover

for some time.
