



THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

1. Have all flues and chimneys properly cleaned before attempting to

2. Look very carefully at the chimney or flue, at the point just above the peak of the room where the chimney goes through, as the lower part may have settled and the upper portion, being held up by the roof timbers, may have pulled away, leaving an open space or break in the chimnel that will permit sparks slipping through into the attic or concealed space.

will permit sparks slipping through into the attic or concealed space.

3. Be sure that all flue holes that are not to be used this year have good metal stops, as innumerable fires are caused by sparks through papering over unused pipe holes in chimneys.

4. Clean the ventilating collars around all flues, removing all fint, cobwebs and dust, leaving nothing in the ventilator, in this way permitting the air to cool the pipe where it goes through.

5. Be careful that the supply of kindling wood is not piled up in the yard in such manner as to carry fire to your house, in case your neighbour's house should burn.

6. It is best to keep all lightwood, kindling and boxes in sheds, stables or basements, in orderly piles, and not to have papers or excelsion mixed with it.

7. Extra caution should be used in the handling of gasol. In the winter months all windows and doors are closed, eliminating the possibility of the air blowing the inflammable vapours away.

8. Never use gasoline inside the house for cleaning, and when compelled to use it for any other purpose do not forget that you are handling a powerful explosive which may endanger your life and property.

9. Remove all directions and leaves from your premises before some carelessly throws a match away.

10. Do not dry clothing and inflammable materials above or near lostoves.


