





# NEW CLAUSE

 Victoria, Feb. 6.—Press Gallery, House of Assembly—Mr. McPhillip's bill for the protection of persons employed in factories, and the bill for the amendment of the act in relation to the assembly on being read a second time today. # TO PUNISH HIM

Thaw to be Confined for a Short Time ON GROUND OF INSANITY

PRISONER PROTESTS VEHEMENTLY THAT HE IS NOW SANE—IS FINALLY PERSUADED TO GO TO ASYLUM QUIETLY FOR A WHILE.

New York, Feb. 1.—Adjudged not guilty of the murder of Stanford White by reason of insanity at the time he shot or shot her dead, Harry Thaw today was held by the court to be a dangerous lunatic and was whisked away to the hospital for the criminally insane at Matteawan.

The young man in the Tombs, which had been the young man's home for more than 18 months, to the white bedded wards of the big asylum, tucked away on the snow-covered, sloping banks of the Hudson river, five miles above the city.

The verdict came after 25 hours of waiting and when everybody connected with the case had abandoned all hope of an agreement ever being reached in the room and an spectators' demonstration was stopped by the officers when they arrested Theodore Roosevelt Pell, the well known amateur tennis player, for a burst of applause and shouting about the verdict.

Thaw, protesting he was sane, was on his way to Matteawan. A little after midnight he was received in the institution under commitment papers which directed his detention "until discharged by due course of law."

Mrs. Evelyn Thaw and Josiah Thaw were the only persons who accompanied him on a journey to a state institution. Thaw's train on its way to Fishkill landing, where a carriage was taken to Matteawan, passed beneath the very walls of grim Sing Sing at no time since his arrest on the night of June 25, 1906, had the young Pittsburgh millionaire ever held the thought that he would see the inside of that famous prison, and he heeded not.

The first words of acquittal brought Thaw to his feet in the court room and with a lack of grace of action, which has always characterized his movements, awkward, almost halting, he bowed his acknowledgments to the 12 jurymen as they were discharged by the court. A smile played about his pallid features and there was every reason to believe that he was entirely pleased. # DOCTORS CONSIDERED

Republican Movement in Portugal Culminates in the Killing of the King and Crown Prince While Driving—Heroic Attempt of Queen Amelie to Save Their Lives With Her Own

Liabon, Feb. 1.—King Dom Carlos of Portugal and the crown prince, Luiz Filipe, were assassinated today and the city is in a state of uproar. The king's second son, the infant Manoel, was slightly wounded, but queen Amelie, who strove to save the crown prince's life by throwing herself upon him, was unhurt.

A band of men, who waited at the corner of Praao do Commercio and the Rua do Arsenal, suddenly sprang toward the open carriage in which the royal family were driving to the palace and leveling carbines, which they had concealed upon them, fired. The king and the crown prince upon whom the attack was directed, were each shot three times, and they lived only long enough to be carried to the marine arsenal, where they expired.

Almost at the first shot the king fell back on the cushions, dying, and at the same moment the crown prince was seen to half rise and then sink back on the seat.

Queen Amelie jumped up and threw herself toward the crown prince in an apparent effort to save his life at the cost of her own, but the prince already had received his fatal wound in the neck and she was unable to do more than guard him from the assassins and killed two of them.

The royal family were returning from Villa Vicosa, where they had been sojourning, and the family returned at the railroad station to the palace. A strong guard was in attendance because of the recent uprisings in the city and the discovery of a plot to assassinate the king and the crown prince. The band of murderers had selected the most advantageous spot for the commission of their deed, where they were concealed from the eyes of the public until the carriage and the crown prince had reached the Praao do Commercio, a large square.

Before any of the guards were aware of what was happening, the assassins leaped toward the carriage and instantly the fusillade of shots rang out. In a moment there was terrible confusion, the king and crown prince being shot down without the slightest chance to save themselves.

Some guards sprang upon the regicides, the number of whom is somewhat uncertain, killed two of them and captured three others. One of those committed suicide after being placed in prison, while the other two were being taken to the prison by justice.

The bodies of the king and crown prince were removed from the marine arsenal to the palace, and the crown prince, the Paao das Neesidades, the late residence of the king, escorted by municipal mounted guards.

The news of the assassination swept through the city and the population was in a state of panic, not knowing where the next blow may fall. There is the greatest dread for the future of the country, which seems on the verge of being plunged into the awful throes of a revolution with all the attendant horrors and bloodshed. Throughout the city the shops are closed, and all houses and business places are barricaded.

An examination of the wounds of the king, who was already dead when he reached the arsenal, showed that he had been shot in the head and neck. One bullet had found its mark in the head, a second in the shoulder, and the third, which was the fatal one, severed the spinal cord. The king's body was placed in a coffin and the crown prince, who was still breathing, but who died almost immediately after admission to the arsenal, suffered three wounds, in the head and chest. Two bullets struck the crown prince, the other in the lower jaw and the other in the arm.

Queen Marie Pit, the mother of king Carlos, the duke of Oporto, his brother, and a number of the ministers and court officials hastened to the arsenal, where the news reached them of the attack upon the royal family.

At the first blush it would seem as though the assassination had been the work of anarchists and not of republican sympathizers. Nevertheless, the stirring events of the last few weeks has prepared the people for some startling culminating act. The discovery of the plot, as well as the discovery of many secret stores of weapons and ammunition, had demonstrated beyond peradventure, the existence of a determination on the part of a large body of the Portuguese to overthrow the present conditions and proclaim a republic.

The tragedy occurred about 5:30 in the afternoon but the panic, which instantly gripped the city and all its activities, prostrated the lines of communication, and it was not for some hours that the news of the assassination was permitted to be sent broadcast.

Harry Thaw had been committed to the institution, he said the prisoner would be given no special privileges while he remained there.

"The first thing we will do with him," said the warden, "is to put him in the place him in the observation ward, to remain for a week or two or possibly longer, until we note his mental condition. This is the customary plan and it will be adhered to in this case. Then we will study his mental derangement, assigning him to some particular ward in the hospital. He cannot have any special quarters for all the patients here are treated alike. They will dine at the table with the other men and dine at the table in the main room. Thaw will be given no special work to do. He can take daily walks in the large court, and, as is so disposed, can have tobacco sent to him or he can, on an order, accompanied by the cash, procure any articles he desires for his comfort in Fishkill. The hospital is crowded with patients and the institution was originally planned to hold 500."

of Felipe D'Oriaes the Comte de Paris on May 23, 1888. He succeeded to the throne on October 19, 1888. The crown prince, Luiz Filipe, duke of Braganza, was born March 21, 1887. While there had been considerable disruption in political affairs in Portugal for a long time, the strained relations between king Carlos and parliament were brought to a head only on May 11, last, by the dissolution of the chambers. The state councilors addressed a letter to the king protesting against the state of absolutism which resulted from the dissolution and they declared that the king and the country had been placed in danger. The crisis in the political situation arose from the fact that the cabinet, which represented exclusively the liberal group, found its program of reforms obstructed by both the old conservative and progressive parties and decided to ask for the dissolution of parliament in order to bring about the proposed number of reforms by means of a decree. The cabinet, was of the opinion that thus having established its determination radically to reorganize the affairs of the country it could appeal to the people in a general election. The opposition attacked the king for dissolving parliament, declaring this to be unconstitutional.

Premier Franco published a decree dissolving the chamber, and stated that after seven months of political strife, he found it impossible to govern with a parliament and to carry out his legislative program, which included a policy of social and economical reforms and efficient party control of the administration. In this manner he established a veritable dictatorship, and since then has governed with an iron hand.

Reports emanating from many parts of Portugal, and throughout Madrid in Spain, within the last few months, have indicated that trouble was brewing for Portugal and that revolutionists were at work.

After numerous minor risings had been put down, the police, on January 23, came upon a widespread plot to overthrow the monarchy and proclaim Portugal a republic. The plot was organized by a small group of advanced republicans, and the original intention was to assassinate premier Franco and depend upon the secret, republican and labor revolutionists for the means of carrying out the plot. The king and crown prince were in the city on account of the wholesale fires and by continual discoveries of new depots of arms and bombs. A great throng were grouped about the barrier station and in the neighboring streets when the members of the royal family disembarked, for the purpose of driving across the Tagus in reaching the actual residence of the royal family. They awaited them before the landing stage and the king and the two princes entered the leading carriage, which started immediately, wheeling into the Praao do Commercio. Suddenly the sharp crack of a carbine startled the assembly. The air was filled with a succession of sharp reports and the king was seen to jump up and reach for his throat, then to drop back on the cushions.
