Division Courts---Canada West.

The Division Courts in Western Canada are presided over by the Judges of the County Courts, and have jurisdiction over almost all claims on debt, account of money demand whether payable in money or otherwise up to £25, and in all torts to personal chattles to £10. The suits are generally determined by the Judge in a summary manner; in certain cases, however, a Jury is allowed.

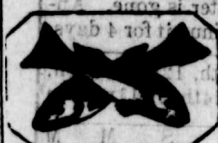

OBSERVATIONS.—The nearer the time of the Moon's changes, first quarter, full and last quarter, are to midnight, the fairer will the weather be during the seven days following.

2. The next space of this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

3. The nearer to mid-day or noon the phases of the moon happen, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days.

4. The space of this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to the Summer, though they affect Spring and Autumn nearly in the same ratio.

5. The Moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours (i. e. from four to ten), may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the wind as is noted in the table.

In the year 1868, there will be two eclipses of the Sun, and a Transit of the Planet Mercury over the Sun's Dix.

I.—An Annular Eclipse of the SUN, February 22-23, 1868, invisible in Greenwich and invisible in Canada.

II.—A Total Eclipse of the Sun, August 17, 1868, invisible at Greenwich and invisible in Canada.

III.—A Transit of Mercury over the Sun's Dix, November 4th, 1868, partly visible at Greenwich, also in Canada.

COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS, ONT.

This Court is held quarterly in each County Town. The Judge of the County Court is *ex-officio* Chairman of the Quarter Sessions, who, together with one or more Magistrates of the County or United Counties, constitute the Court. The Court has Jurisdiction over all minor cases of Larceny, Misdemeanor and appeals from decision of Magistrates. Trials are by Jury.

Sittings—Second Tuesday in March, June, September, and December.

COUNTY COURTS.

The jurisdiction in cases of Notes of hand, &c., is limited to £100, in cases of open accounts to £50, and torts to personal chattels to £50. It has also equity jurisdiction up to £50, and jurisdiction in certain cases of ejectment.

The Court sits for trial of cases at the same time as the Quarter Sessions.
