THE REPORT OF THE COUNCIL
OF THE
Dominion of Canada Rifle Association,
1890.

The Council has the honour to submit the Twenty-Third Annual Report of the Proceedings of the Association, and at the same time has pleasure in congratulating its members on a successful season.

Anticipating a large increase in the number of competitors, your Council considered it advisable to increase the shooting accommodation of the Rideau Range, so as to ensure the matches being completed in about the same time as heretofore. To insure this, the target trench was extended so as to make room for eight new targets, thus increasing the accommodation nearly one-third, making thirty-three targets, as compared with twenty-five previously; and other extensive and necessary improvements were made which entailed such heavy expense as to materially reduce the balance shown by the Treasurer to be at the credit of the Association last year.

The report of the Commandant of the Bisley team will well repay perusal, and shows that Canada's representatives acquitted themselves well, as although they did not succeed in carrying off the Kolapore Cups, they won the very handsome sum of £379 in money prizes, and had four competitors in the last stage of the "Queen's" Prize, an achievement which has never before been effected by any team.

The reference by the Commandant of the Team to the berth accommodation afforded to the members by the Steamship Company deserves consideration, and if arrangements can be made to secure upper cabin berths for all members of the Team, a very great advantage will be gained.

The suggestion made by Colonel Prior as to securing the range at Cambridge has been taken advantage of, and your Council has received a letter from Lt.-Colonel Roberts, the officer commanding the Cambridge University Volunteer Rifles, promising the use of the range for this year's Bisley Team's practice. The Association is much indebted to that officer for his continued interest in the Canadian team.

The annual matches of the Association, held at the Rideau Range, Ottawa, in September last, were largely attended, and more Canadian Militiamen competed than on any previous occasion since the year 1868.

The shooting was very good, and an improvement on the previous year, as will be seen by a comparison of the scores in the Grand Aggregate and other matches. The Prize List and general arrangement of the matches appeared to give satisfaction to the attendant competitors.

It is hoped that the impetus given to rifle shooting by the inauguration of the Military Rifle League last year will have the effect of largely increasing the attendance at the annual matches of the Association this year.

The thanks of the Association are again due to His Excellency the Governor-General, Lord Stanley of Preston, for his liberal contribution to the funds of the Association, and for the very great interest he takes in the welfare of the Association, and for his gift of Silver and Bronze Medals to the different Provincial Rifle Associations in the Dominion.

To the Government and Members of Parliament, the thanks of the Association are again due for the liberal grant voted last year.

To the Hon. Minister of Militia and Defence, Sir Adolphe P.

Caron, K.C.M.G., the Association is indebted for his continued interest in the affairs of the Association.

To the Canada Club of London, who, through their Secretary, Malcom O. Sim, Esq., again presented a handsome silver cup to be competed for by the Bisley Team; and to Mr. J. H. Steward, London, England, for a very handsome Graphoscope in Amboyna wood, which was made the first prize in the Snider Aggregate match.

The total entries at the Annual Competition amounted to 9,107 last year, as compared with 9,413 in 1889. This reduction is more than accounted for by the absence of Teams from Her Majesty's Regular Forces, Army and Navy, and it is hoped that, at the coming season's matches, they may again be represented.

The lease for the Rideau range has been renewed for five years.

The Staff employed at the Annual Matches performed their duties exceptionally well, and the Council desires to record its thanks to Lt.-Colonel Mattice, the Executive Officer, and those working under him, for their efficient services.

FINANCE.

The Council submit the Treasurer's Statement of the Finances of the Association, which have been duly audited :—

The receipts for the year amounted to \$18,669.67, which, with the balance of \$2,292.34 brought forward from last year, exhibits a total of \$20,962.01 to the credit of the Association.

The expenditure amounted to \$19,875.69, showing a balance of \$1,086.32 in favor of the Association at the end of the year.

As will be seen by the detailed accounts under the head of Ranges, a considerable expenditure was necessarily incurred for additional target accommodation, repairs and renewals, including drainage,—filling up gully at the 600 yard range, and work of a permanent character, towards which the Militia Department contributed a proportion of the cost, which was considered as properly chargeable to that Department.

Affiliation fees from Rifle Associations, including \$69, value of 23 bronze medals issued, amounted to \$869, as against \$879 received in 1889.

The number of Affiliating Rifle Associations this year were 8 Provincial and 50 local and other associations, showing a decrease of 1 Provincial and an increase of 1 local Rifle Association, as compared with 1889.

The annual subscriptions for the year amounted to \$286, as against \$322 in 1889. The Council express the hope that members of the Association will interest themselves, as far as possible, by inducing others to become members.

The Associate Members' fees for the Annual Matches this year amounted to \$347, as against \$351 received in 1889.

The receipts from Special Donations amounted to \$700, the same as last year.

The special donations from Banks amounted to \$825, an increase of \$25, as compared with 1889.

The net receipts from entry fees, including post entries and fines, exclusive of the charge for ammunition, amounted to \$4,323.03, as against \$4,384.92 in 1889, a decrease of \$61.89.

Receipts from the sale of ammunition this year amounted to \$1,226.60, as against \$1,161.90 in 1889, an increase of \$64.70.

Cash prizes and badges amounted to \$7,519.30 this year, as against \$7,423.30, an increase of \$96.00 as compared with last year.

The expenditure for the Bisley Team this year amounted to \$5,811.27, as against \$5,753.73 in 1889, an increase of \$57.54.

A statement of the expenditure made by Lt.-Colonel Prior, M.P., commanding the Bisley Team for 1890 is herewith submitted and will be found in the appendix.

REPORT OF
Lieut.-Col. E. G. Prior, A.D.C., M.P., Etc.,

COMMANDING BISLEY TEAM, 1890.

VICTORIA, B.C., OCTOBER 30TH, 1890.

*Lieut.-Colonel Hon. Geo. A. Kirkpatrick, M.P., President, Dominion of
Canada Rifle Association :*

SIR,—Having had the honour of being appointed Commandant of the Bisley Team for the year 1890, I now beg to hand you this my Report of our proceedings.

The team, with three exceptions, embarked at Montreal on the evening of Tuesday, the 24th of June, 1890, on board the s. s. "Parisian."

A large number of our brother Militiamen assembled to wish us *bon voyage*, and the officers of the Victoria Rifles very kindly allowed their band to serenade us.

I am sorry to say that a great deal of dissatisfaction was expressed by members of our team on finding that the same class of berths had not been allotted to every one. Four of them had to sleep down below the saloon in one cabin, although they knew that first-class passages had been purchased for all the team. This, I consider, is most unfair and not at all what members of the team have a right to expect. The consequence was that those who had such poor accommodation were ill the greater part of the voyage and thus were badly prepared on landing in England to uphold the honour of Canada. I sincerely trust that in future each member of the team will have an equally comfortable cabin, and this can be assured if the different steamship companies are brought into competition for the passages of the team. The berths might be secured months before the date of sailing, and thus all excuses as to there being an insufficient number of good berths left, be avoided.

At Quebec, the Hon. Sir Adolphe Caron, Minister of Militia, honoured us with a visit on board ship, and spoke a few words of encouragement to us all: Col. Montizambert and officers of "B" Battery also saw us off and their band enlivened the leave-taking. At

Rimouski two of the team joined the ship, so that, with the exception of Capt. Silver (who had leave to proceed to England previous to our sailing), we were all on board. Owing to four days of fog and the presence of icebergs we were detained a good deal and took twelve days crossing the Atlantic.

We arrived at Liverpool on Monday morning, the 7th of July. After clearing our baggage at the Customs, I sent the team under the command of the Adjutant to Cambridge, whilst I went up to London to make the necessary entries for the matches at Bisley and to look after several important matters connected with the team.

I found the offices of the N. R. A. in Pall Mall closed and had to go to Bisley to make the entries. I there found Mr. A. P. Humphrey, the Secretary of the N.R.A. and made the entries; but he impressed upon me the advisability of making them earlier, as by being delayed to so late a date they were open to be charged as post entries.

I believe I am right in saying that it is the opinion of many experienced shots that there would be an advantage in being entered earlier, as there would be more chance of obtaining better hours of the day to fire in than when entering, as we now do, after all other entries are made. I would suggest that the Secretary of the D. R. A. correspond with the Secretary of the N. R. A., with the object of arriving at some agreement in regard to entering the team earlier. As the *personnel* of the team is not known until they assemble at Montreal, ready to embark, the entries might be made long before by numbers or letters, and these changed for the names on arrival of the team in England; or, as an alternative, half the team might be squadded for one time through the meeting, and the other half for a different time, so that the whole team would not be likely to shoot under any disadvantages, such as a bad storm, &c.

The team arrived at Cambridge University Ranges at five o'clock on Monday evening, and found their tents pitched on the range, and everything requisite to their comfort arranged through the courtesy of Col. Roberts, commanding the University Corps, and of Major Riddell, the Adjutant. Owing to the wet weather and excessive dampness of the locality the men suffered a good deal from colds. One man was completely crippled by rheumatism for a couple of days and unable to fire. To my mind it is very questionable whether being under canvas at Cambridge in such wet weather as we had is in the interest of practice and preparation for Bisley, but if maintained the tents most assuredly ought to be floored as a preventive against colds. It would cost the D. R. A. a very trifling sum to purchase these, and they could be stored away when camp breaks up ready for the next year's use.

Major Scott, of the Cambridge University Corps, kindly entertained the officers on the team at his college rooms, which gave them an opportunity of getting an insight into college life and a view of the colleges and grounds, which was much appreciated.

Major Riddell notified the Adjutant that if the University ranges

were to be secured in the future for the Canadian team to practice on it would be necessary to make application for them much earlier than has hitherto been the case, as other applicants are yearly becoming more importunate for their use. This, I trust, will be attended to, and application made some months ahead.

We left Cambridge for Bisley on Saturday, the 12th of July, at noon, but did not arrive in camp until about nine o'clock p.m. Owing to the fact that it was the first meeting at Bisley, and that many of the firms catering for the camp in various ways were not old Wimbledon hands, there was great confusion, and although I had spared neither trouble nor expense in endeavoring to have everything complete, it was simply impossible to get the camp quite ready for the men by the time they arrived. However, next day everything was obtained and the men were comfortably settled down in their quarters under canvas.

Bisley camp is about one hour's run from London. It is close to Brookwood Station, on the London & South-Western Railway, from which station a line about one and a quarter miles long has been built right into the centre of the camp. Although it is nearly double the distance from London that Wimbledon is, still, as the train takes you right into the camp, it takes very little longer to get to the ranges now than formerly. This, however, the general public did not seem to be aware of, as the attendance of visitors was lamentably small. Large numbers of the wealthier classes of people who used to drive down to Wimbledon find it impossible to get to the present place in the same manner. I was informed that the loss to the N. R. A. this year, through the falling off in gate money, would be at least £3,000. However, the Association is in hopes that when the place becomes better known this will, to a great extent, be remedied.

Here I must record my grateful acknowledgement to Sir Casimir Gzowski for his choice of locality and arrangement of camp quarters, in advance of our arrival at Bisley. The site set apart for the Canadian camp is, to my mind, on the whole, most satisfactory. Although my instructions informed me that floors for the tents were not allowed by the Association, I felt sure, after the experience I had at Cambridge, that it was absolutely necessary for the ordinary comfort of the men, and in the interest of good shooting, that such should be supplied. I therefore supplied them at my own expense. I feel certain that, if the matter is discussed fully, the Association will see that it is highly necessary that every advantage possible should be given to the men who are representing the country, even if it does cost a little more than heretofore.

I found it to be the almost universal opinion amongst old shots that the ranges at Bisley are more favourable for high scores than those at Wimbledon.

On Saturday, the 12th of July, Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess of Wales came to Bisley to open the new ranges. Major Todd and myself were honoured with invitations, and the cere-

mony was a most brilliant one. H. R. H. the Princess of Wales made the proverbial bulls-eye from a rifle fired with the new smokeless powder.

It seemed to be the general opinion before we left Canada that the team this year was not, by comparison, a strong one. This impression may have been created by the fact that a great many who were first on the list were unable to go to Bisley. However, I am proud to say that the shooting of the team, as will be seen by the results, was very good, indeed. In some measure I attribute this to the fact that, after consultation with the Adjutant, I came to the conclusion that it would be advisable to enter the members once in an extra series match of the same range as the regular match, just immediately before firing commenced, thus giving the men every possible chance in the regular matches.

The divided winnings of the team amounted to £379, being within 7s. per man of the divided winnings of the previous year's team.

Had there been a second prize in one of the chief competitions, viz., "The Standard," where but one prize of £105 was given, the winnings would have been largely increased, as our team took second place in this match.

The "Standard" Match was a new feature in the programme, and is, I think, deserving of some notice here as being a purely military match adapted to the new attack formation. I may say that it excited quite as much general interest on the field as did the Kolapore Cup. The team consisted of twelve men, under command of the Adjutant, by whom all necessary words of command were given. They were drawn up in extended order at about seven hundred yards from the target, which was lined off as a second-class target for the purpose of scoring hits, but instead of having a black bulls-eye on a white target, two figures of men were depicted standing on either side of a field gun, with colored foliage and sky worked in, which, at a distance, made a strange and difficult object to aim at. The firing and advancing had to be completed in eight minutes from the start—at about seven hundred yards to the finish—at about three hundred yards; that is to say, four minutes were allowed for advancing between the firing points, and the other four minutes were expended in firing as follows, viz., one minute individual firing at 700 yards, one minute volley firing at 550 yards, one minute volley firing at 450 yards, and one minute individual firing at 300 yards.

Five teams competed. The Home team come out first, and took the prize of one hundred guineas, and the Canadians were second.

I draw attention to this eminently practical military match in the hopes that our shots on next year's Bisley team may practice for it over their own ranges at home and so have a better chance in competition with the Home and Channel teams who practice months beforehand in preparation for it.

It gives me great pleasure to bring to your notice the unusual success of the Canadian Team in the "Queen's." Four men succeeded in getting into the second and third stages, and came out in the following order, viz.:—

- 26th. Lieut. Smith.
- 32nd. Captain Bishop.
- 58th. Qr. Mr. Sergt. Ogg.
- 62nd. Sergt. Hall.

It will be observed on perusal of the accounts that I have charged the sum of £9 7s. for cable messages to Ottawa announcing names of winners of prizes and the amounts won. This, I am well aware, may not be allowed by the Association, but if it is not, I will cheerfully refund the money. I attempted to get the Associated Press to send the messages, but was not successful. Knowing the great interest that is taken in the doings of the team all over the Dominion, it seemed to me most absurd that for the sake of a few pounds the whole country should be left in ignorance of how its representatives were acquitting themselves.

On Tuesday, the 22nd of July, H. R. H. the Duke of Cambridge, Commander-in-chief, accompanied by General Viscount Wolsley, visited the camp and inspected the team. His Royal Highness was pleased to express himself as much gratified with the appearance of the team. He questioned each member individually as to his former visits to England, if any, and also asked his opinion as to the superiority of Bisley over Wimbledon.

The "Kolapore" match as usual excited great interest, especially when it became known that the Canadian Team was ahead of all the others at the two hundred yard range. The home team, however, proved too strong for us at the five hundred and six hundred yards ranges, but we managed to get second place.

Owing, I presume, to the lack of visitors in camp, the Canadian "At Home" was the only entertainment given during the meeting. The Hon. Mrs. Colville very kindly consented to preside for me, as Lady Tupper was unfortunately prevented by indisposition from attending. It was attended by some three hundred ladies and gentlemen, and was in every way a success. The band of "The Buffs" was in attendance and the day was beautifully fine.

Amongst the many distinguished visitors to the camp were the Marquis of Lorne, Lord Colville, Sir Chas. Tupper, Sir Henry and Lady Fletcher, Col. Sir Henry and Lady Halford, Lord Wantage, Col. Sir Casimir Gzowski, Major Lord Fitzgerald, Col. Hon. H. F. Eaton, Commandant of the Camp; Major and Mrs. Colebrooke-Carter, Sir John and Lady Thompson, Hon. Senator Botsford, General and Mrs. Laurie, Lieut. Stairs, R.E., &c., &c.

The Canada Club most generously presented the team with a beautiful silver vase and Mr. Malcolm Sim, the secretary of the Club, very kindly came to camp and presented it. Qr. Mr. Sergt. Ogg and

Lieut. Smith tied for it, but as the shooting of Qr. Mr. Sergt. Ogg was the best at the long ranges he was declared the victor.

To Dr. Rae's kindness in again making the members of the team honorary members of the Royal Colonial Institute we are much indebted.

I must not forget to express my thanks to Mr. Charles Drinkwater, secretary of the Canadian Pacific Railway Co., for obtaining the consent of that company to allow me the use of several magnificent large photographs of Canadian scenery. These were placed about the camp and, together with a large number of other photographs of Canada that I took over myself seemed to be of great interest to all who visited us.

As usual the officers of the National Rifle Association were, one and all, unremitting in their kindness and attention to us, and I would specially thank Mr. A. P. Humphrey, the secretary, and Major Colebrooke-Carter, the camp Adjutant, for their constant assistance and advice.

I am sorry to say that we missed the usual sight of a formal distribution of prizes, it having been deemed advisable by the authorities to dispense with the interesting ceremony this year.

It is impossible for me to adequately express my appreciation of the services rendered by my Adjutant, Major A. H. Todd. His large experience as a competitor in rifle matches and his thorough knowledge of what was necessary were simply invaluable. His constant and untiring attention to duty, and his tact in dealing with several questions involving diverse interests, was beyond all praise.

Of the conduct of the members of the team, I can only say that from first to last one and all of them was a credit to the country they so worthily represented. They seemed to vie with each other in showing what a true Canadian is, and if they have only as kindly a recollection of me as I have of them, I shall never regret the Bisley Camp of 1890.

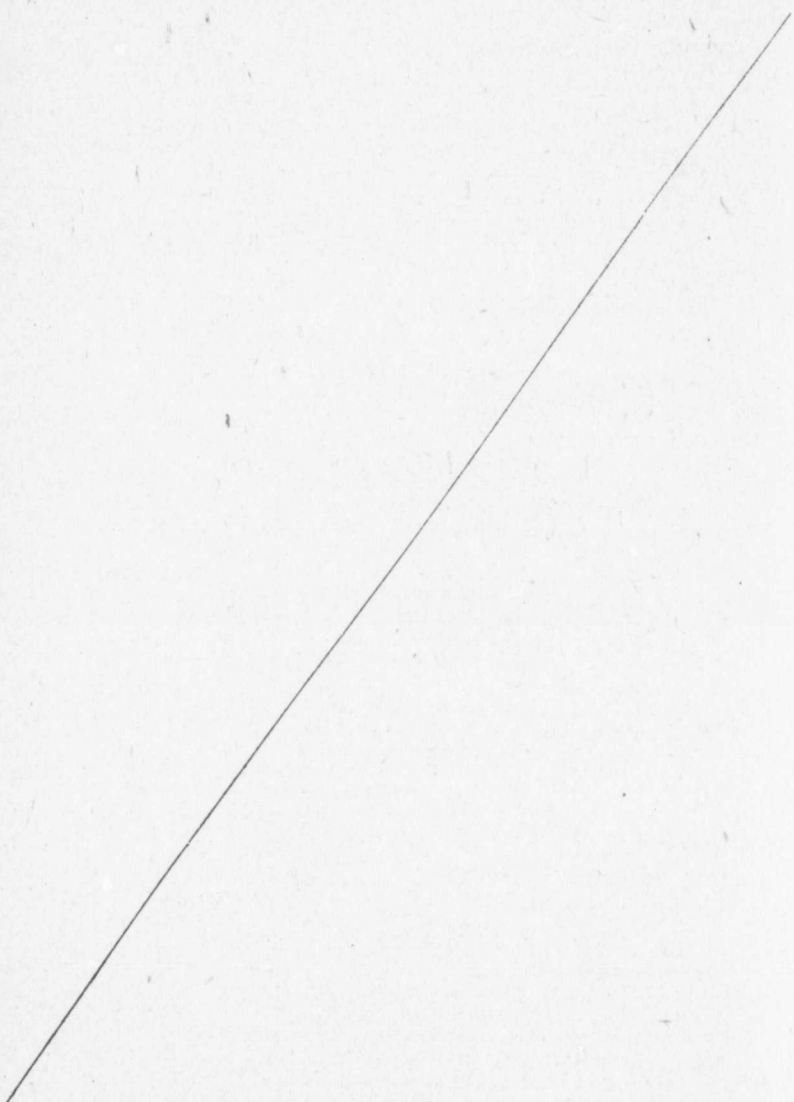

On the matter of the expenses incurred at the presentation of prizes in September last, at the Rideau Skating Rink, brought up by Major Tilton, it was

Moved by Major Bond, seconded by Capt. Hood—

“That the Treasurer be authorized to pay fifty dollars towards expenses incurred on the occasion of presentation of prizes in the Rideau Skating Rink, September, 1889.”—Carried unanimously.

The President, Lt.-Col. G. A. Kirkpatrick, informed the meeting that Col. Gzowski was going to England this spring, and suggested the advisability of requesting Col. Gzowski to take the trouble to visit Bisley Common and choose the camping ground for the Canadian Team.

When Lt.-Col. D. A. Macdonald proposed, seconded by Major Bond—

“That the President be requested to ask Col. Gzowski to act on behalf of the D. R. A. in selecting the ground for the team at Bisley and to make arrangements generally.”—Carried.

The size of targets for Revolver Shooting was then discussed, and it was

Moved by Major Bond, seconded by Lt.-Col. D. A. Macdonald—

“That the Secretary be requested to confer with the Secretaries of Revolver Associations of Toronto and Montreal, regarding the size of Targets and Regulations under which Revolver Matches should be conducted with a view of obtaining uniformity.”—Carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

Executive Committee Meeting Held 20th July, 1890.

Members Present—Lt.-Col. White, Lt.-Col. Tilton, Lt.-Col. Macdonald, Lt.-Col. Macpherson, Major Bond, Major Blaiklock and Secretary.

The minutes of previous meeting held 6th May, 1890, were read and confirmed.

The programme of the Annual Matches was then gone into and finally settled, and the efficiency clause as under was definitely settled, viz :—

EFFICIENCY.—In the case of a Commissioned Officer, one in good standing in the corps; in the case of a N. C. O. or Private, one who has performed the last annual drill of his corps, or in cases where no such drill has been ordered within the eleven months previous to the meeting of the D. R. A. at which he may be present, been a duly enrolled member of the corps for that period, shall be held to be an efficient member of the Militia and entitled to compete at the D.R.A. matches.

The personnel of the staff to conduct the matches was then discussed and it was

Moved by Lt.-Col. D. A. Macdonald, seconded by Lt.-Col. Tilton—

“That Lt.-Col. Van Straubenzie be requested to act as Executive Officer.”—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Tilton, seconded by Major Blaiklock—

“That Lt.-Col. Jones, 38th Bn.; Major Hodgins, Major Heron, G. G.F.G.; Capt. Aumond, Capt. Manley, and Lt. Macnaethan, Coburg Garrison Artillery, with four others to be added be appointed Range Officers.”—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Col. Tilton, seconded by Lt.-Col. Macdonald—

“That the pay of the Statistical Officer shall be as before, of his

first Assistant (Mr. C. C. Rogers) \$4.00, and of the second Assistant, \$3.00 per diem."—Carried.

Moved by Major Bond, seconded by Lt.-Col. Tilton—

"That the Secretary be empowered to make the usual arrangements for Register Keepers, Markers, &c., for the meeting."—Carried.

Moved by Major Blaiklock, seconded by Lt.-Col. Macdonald—

"That Lt.-Cols. Tilton and Macpherson be a Committee, with power to add to their number, to make arrangements for the presentation of prizes."—Carried.

The meeting then adjourned.

Annual Meeting of Competitors.

The annual meeting of the competitors was held Tuesday evening, 2nd September, in the Drill Hall. The chair was occupied by Lt.-Col. G. A. Kirkpatrick, President of the Association, and by him sat Lt.-Col. Wm. White, Chairman of the Executive Committee. Lt.-Col. Thos. Bacon, Secretary, kept the minutes of the meeting. There was a good attendance of competitors.

THE NURSERY MATCH.

Pte. W. R. Pringle, Queen's Own Rifles, suggested a further reduction in the amount of prize winnings debarring from entry in the Nursery match, and a recommendation that the Council should take the matter into consideration was carried.

MEDAL WINNERS' FREE ENTRIES.

Capt. Russell, 45th Battalion, called attention to the inconveniences caused to medal winners—who as such were entitled to free entry in two matches—by being called upon to pay that part of the entry fee which covers the cost of ammunition. He asked that the supposed free entries should be made entirely free, and if the Association could not afford to throw in the ammunition that they should charge for entry and ammunition in one match, and in the other have both entry and ammunition free for medal winners. This would protect the Association from loss and simplify the business for the competitors. A recommendation in accordance with Capt. Russell's suggestion was unanimously adopted.

THE PRICE OF AMMUNITION.

Staff-Sergt. Murray, Halifax, complained of the cost of ammunition, which, he said, kept young men from practising.

Major B. A. Weston, 66th, moved, and Capt. J. Adam, 13th, seconded, a recommendation that the Council should apply to the Department of Militia for a reduction in the price of the ammunition issued to the Dominion Rifle Association.

Staff-Sergt. N. S. Young, 45th, moved, and Capt. S. M. Rogers, 43rd, seconded, an amendment including all associations in the request, but Major Weston protested that this meeting had nothing to do with any other associations.

The amendment was withdrawn, and Major Weston's motion was carried unanimously.

THE SQUADDING.

Lieut. E. D. Sutherland, 43rd, asked why the Martini ammunition could not be issued at the firing points as the Snider is now. This, he urged, would save the competitors a great deal of bother, and cause little or no expense to the association. He did not think that the plan tried this year, of leaving each range officer to target the tickets allotted to his butt, had worked satisfactorily, as much time had been lost, and the range officers were prevented from attending to their proper work. For instance, the tickets, though supposed to be checked by the range officers to see that they tallied with the scores on the blackboard, had to go quite unchecked.

Major Hood, 5th Royal Scots, coincided with the remarks just made respecting the squadding. He thought the target and butt should be marked upon every ticket, just as is done at Wimbledon.

Major Weston said this association could not do better than follow Wimbledon.

SIGHTING SHOTS VICE EXTRA SERIES.

Capt. J. Adam, 13th, moved, seconded by Capt. E. D. Adams, H. G.A., a recommendation that the council should consider the advisability of doing away with the extra series shooting and allowing two sighting shots at each range. The mover said a great deal of dissatisfaction was felt about the extra series matches as at present conducted.

Lieut. E. A. Macnachten, Cobourg G. A., thought it would be a great mistake to do away with the extra series.

Capt. W. Bishop, 63rd, moved in amendment, seconded by Capt. F. B. Ross, 13th, that the council be recommended to continue the extra

series matches on such targets as are continuously set apart for that purpose, but not to throw open all the targets as at present done, and in place of the extra series thus discontinued to allow sighting shots.

After discussion the amendment was put and carried by a vote of 25 to 19.

ANTI-COACHING.

Capt. J. T. Hartt, St. John Rifles, suggested that in future the competitors should be squadded indiscriminately, instead of allowing members of the same corps to shoot together as at present.

Major Mason, 13th, suggested that not only should the members of the same corps be placed on different targets, but also that all such should be squadded for the same time, so that those firing later should not have the benefit of the experience of the earlier pairs.

THE BISLEY TEAM.

Capt. Rogers, 43rd, moved, seconded by Capt. Bishop, 63rd, a recommendation that for the future the membership of the Bisley team should be determined solely by Martini shooting.

Lieut. Macnachten, Cobourg G. A., protested against any change of this nature. The great object of the Association was, he held, not to send a team to Bisley, but to encourage shooting in the militia force, and for that reason those who practised mainly with the Snider should not be debarred from a chance of winning a place on the Bisley team, the goal every rifleman sought to reach.

The Chairman said this was the annually recurring motion, which was always met with the statement that this Association is maintained for the benefit of the volunteer force of Canada as a whole. They must not do anything to discourage the rank and file; all such were wanted at the prize meeting, whether or not they could shoot Martini. That rifle would soon not be the rifle of England, and therefore was not likely to be officially adopted here. He hoped the motion would not be pressed.

Capt. Russell, 45th, was opposed to the suggested change. His

experience was that the best Snider shots easily developed into the best Martini shots.

The motion was put and lost.

THE STEAMSHIP ACCOMMODATION.

Capt. Rogers, 43rd, brought up the subject of the accommodation provided for the Bisley team on the ocean steamers. He did not think it fair that the discrimination now made in favour of the officers on the team should be continued. The members having won their places were on an equality, as riflemen, and there should be no class distinctions. The officers, who had first choice of quarters, usually fared pretty well, he believed, but he knew that last year those who were not officers had very inferior accommodation. As the time of sailing was known so long beforehand he thought the Council should arrange for proper accommodation for every member of the team. If they could not get it on the Allan line they could on another.

Capt. Bishop said the same unpleasantness about the choice of quarters had been experienced this year, and some of those forced to go below had had a miserable passage, being sick all the way across on account of the poor accommodation they had. He thought this state of affairs should not be allowed to continue any longer.

The Chairman promised that the subject would receive due attention.

The meeting then adjourned.

REGULATIONS.

The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members (three to form a quorum), appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other Members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or that of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. *Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of any match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.*
2. *Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them seriously.*
3. *Competitors must, when at the firing point, comply with all orders given by the range officers on duty.*

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.

II.—No Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, or Private, employed by the D. R. A. for duty at the firing points, or in the butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.

III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, in accordance with the Regulations and Orders of the Militia, viz. :—

a. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket. Elbow caps of leather or other material will not be allowed.

b. Trousers.

c. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and great coats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order, as must also Non-commissioned Officers and Privates. Where a duly authorized undress for officers exists, they (the officers) may appear in it, although the Non-commissioned Officers and Privates may be in full dress. *Waist belts must be worn, except when firing.*

d. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia competitors must appear strictly in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. (See Reg. XIX c.)

NOTE.—In “Military Matches” the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress are issued.

IV.—All protests or objections shall be made at once to the Secretary or Range Officers on duty, and, when practicable, in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the occurrence on which the protest is founded, and the Executive Committee reserve the right to refuse or accept any protest received or presented after the expiration of that time.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Fixed or artificial rests will not be allowed, except in Skirmishing Matches.

VII.—Competitors shall only use the mats provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests will not be allowed.

VIII.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

IX.—“Blowing off” shall not be permitted at the firing points, or after competitors have taken their position for firing. Pits will be provided at places near the firing points where competitors can “blow off” *before joining their squads* on presentation of a “blow off” ticket, which will be sold for five cents each, and include the cost of *one* round of ammunition, to be obtained from the person in charge on delivery of ticket.

X.—No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word, “All Clear.”

XI.—Slings may be used in all matches, but they must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government arms.

XII.—In individual competitions—competitors may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided their doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIII.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper, or an Officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XIV.—In *Matches* where both team and *individual prizes* are being competed for, *coaching* of any kind is strictly prohibited.

XV.—In *Matches* where the prizes are offered to *teams only*, the members of each team shooting together will be permitted to “coach” or “spot” for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint spotters to assist him. With the above exception no other persons will be allowed within the ropes, or permitted to offer advice or instruction to the competitors.

XVI.—Any violation of these rules, or any part of them, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down, under the head of “penalties,” and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

XVII.—PENALTIES—DISQUALIFICATIONS.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or
- (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive or Special Committee; or

- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct, or the aforesaid offences; or
- (h) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangement with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize,

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association, until reinstated.

XVIII.—EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up; or
- (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting; or
- (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing; or
- (d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given]; or
- (e) Who shall alter or make any erasures on his firing ticket; or
- (f) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous;

shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

XIX.—DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize; or with the orders of the Executive or Range Officers; or
- (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize, or
- (c) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes. (See Reg. III. d);

shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor-General's Match.

XX.—FINES.

Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed," for any particular prize, the *circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In case of "disqualification," the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

XXI.—MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to vary, mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

XXII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

- (a) Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.
- (b) Winners of prizes will, on signing the official prize list, receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) If a formal presentation of prizes takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.
- (d) All Challenge Cups and Shields must be returned to the Secretary on or before the 15th August, 1891.

XXIII.—DISTANCES AND TARGETS.

The Targets must be of the following dimensions :

MILITARY MATCH TARGETS.—At all ranges 6 feet long, 2 feet 6 inches high.

XXIV.—SIGNALLING—SCORING.

1. The signalling will be as follows :

- (a) Bull's Eye, counting.....5.....White disc.
- (b) Inner, "4.....Red disc.
- (c) Magpie, "3.....Black and White disc.
- (d) Outer, "2.....Black disc.
- (e) Ricochet,R.....Black bar.

(f) *Misses* will *not* be signalled ; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a *black* disc. to signify that the target has not been struck.

2. When *two* shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the *signal disc*, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with the shot, provided he has fired. *Both shots will*, however, be shown by spotting discs.

3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, will be shown by the spotting disc when the target is again raised.

4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may have struck the target, he may call on the officer in charge at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination as signalled shall be final. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of *fifty* cents with the Officer in charge at the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.

5. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal disc*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstances to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the Officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.

6. All claims for shots signalled *must be made before* another shot is fired at the target in question.

7. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

XXV.

The rifles shall be Snider (Long or Short) and Martini-Henry rifles, either of Government issue or of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz.
Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
8. All alterations of the register must be initialled by the Officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first signalled to the butt.
9. No person will be permitted to go and examine a target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the targets in excess of the number of shots allowed, could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

- (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce grey, and no application of colour will be allowed after the competitor has taken his position at the firing point.

No application of a permanent nature will be allowed.

No shifting of sights will be permitted.

(i) The *back sight* may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by an extemporized means.

- (c) The sliding bar may be inverted and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider, and *three* for the Martini-Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or lines of any kind removable at pleasure may be used, but not consisting of slips of paper or other substance capable of being shifted or removed.

XXVI.—AMMUNITION.

None but the ammunition issued or sold by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed.

XXVII.

Unless otherwise specified the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the target.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard, and the left elbow clear of the body.

XXVIII.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. Competitors must be present at the firing points punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office. "Blowing off" and all other preliminaries must be completed beforehand, and will not be allowed as excuses for delay.

2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by threes and fire shot and shot *alternately*.

3. When but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay; but the officer in charge of the firing point, *or some one named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection *before* the next shot is fired.

4. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition, except in Martini matches, with the same rifle; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by Officer in charge.

5. The competitor must, after delivering each shot, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the Register, so that any objection to *the score recorded* may be investigated before the next shot is fired.

6. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the shot forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

XXIX.—TIES.

A. *In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes.*

1. If at more than one distance by the range totals in inverse order, commencing at the longest range.

2. By the fewest *outers*.

3. By the fewest *maggies*.

4. By the fewest *inners*.

5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.

In the case of ABSOLUTE TIES.

(a) If for PRIZES IN KIND, by *shooting off*, as in clause B.

(b) In the case of a prize PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by *shooting off for the Prize in Kind and dividing Money*.

These sub-sections apply also to competitions at single distances. Where a "possible score" is made, the maker shall fire *three* shots immediately after.

N.B.—In all competitions the *order* of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.

B. *In Individual Competitions for a single Prize.*

1. By the aggregate score in *five* rounds at the longest distance.

2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. *In Team Competitions.*

1. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.

2. By the fewest *outers*.

3. By the fewest *maggies*.

4. By the fewest *inners*.

5. By the highest scorers in each team *shooting off*, as in Clause B.

D. *Grand Aggregate.*

1. By the total score in each match in inverse order.

2. By the total scores at 600 yards.

3. By the *total scores at 500 yards.*
4. By the *total scores at 400 yards.*
5. By shooting off, as in Clause B.

In the Governor-General's Match scores of equal numerical value shall be treated and placed by the before stated Rule B.

E. *In cases not met by the foregoing.*

1. By any *special rule attached to the conditions.*
2. By the *fiat of the Committee.*

XXX.—ENTRIES.

The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any Entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.

The privilege of Entry is restricted to members who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to associate members, who pay the fee of \$1.00 at the time of entry.

1. Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the Committee.

2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.

3. No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.

4. Entries shall be classified :

(a) Ordinary (at the published rates of entrance fees). To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A. on or before 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.

(b) Post (at an increase charge of 20 per cent on the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made or received after 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.

N.B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the Special Committee may determine.

2. To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required

entries by the 26th August, Officers commanding corps and Secretaries of Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.) competitors, accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries, until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases the Register Tickets will not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for in the following regulations:

XXXI.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—
 - (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting; or
 - (b) Who attend the meeting but are incapacitated from illness or accident; or
 - (c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committee may have cancelled.
2. Claims based on other consideration than the above will, if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit.

XXXII.—SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as ordinary entries, arrangements will be made and details published of the day, hour and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

XXXIII.—ALTERATIONS OF SQUADDING.

1. Any alteration which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration, unless verified by the initials of the Secretary or Executive Officer, will cancel the ticket.
2. The place of publication of all notices affecting the detail of shooting shall be the board fixed without the tent of the Secretary, and the posting of a notice on such board must be taken and accepted as a good service on all affected thereby.

XXXIV.—REGISTER TICKETS.

1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity of competing for

the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.

2. Any erasure or substitution of one name for another, unless made by the Secretary or Executive Officer, shall invalidate the ticket.

The Council reserve the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$10.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association

at which he is present after he wins the medal ; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at which it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patron, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions :

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" each of the North-West Territories so soon as the Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations,

one-half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Association of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting ; the names of those elected by the Provincial Association to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same

may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instruction as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or an adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association.

General By-Laws of the Association

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council, Meeting of Council.
The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Extraordinary Meetings.
Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings.
all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any Member of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of Finance Committee.
three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Banks.
chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditure of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual Accounts A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
