This is the first collected edition of 1550, it is not quite perfect. It was JOHN DAYE, the printer of these volumes, who perfected the Greek types, and who first printed with Saxon characters in England. It was by means of his editions of the Bible and other

works printed with the above black lefter type that the Reformation was promoted.
