A SCARCE AND VALUABLE WORK by this LEARNED SPANISH AUTHOR, of whom it is said "His Stupor est Mundi qui Scibile discutit omne." He attended the Council of Basil, became a bishop, and was advanced to high offices in Spain. His commentary upon the CHRONICON of EUSEBIUS (above) is well known.

The first author was an ancient Greek ecclesiastic who became Bishop Achris in Bulgaria, as stated on the title, and who died about 1112. The second author was one of the most illustrious Greek fathers and pillars of the early Church who attended the Council of Nice, A. D. 325, and who was persecuted and exiled by Julian. This volume contains his Commentarii in Epistolas Pauli, Contra Gentiles Liberum, Disputatio Contra Arium, Epistolæ Nonullæ Romanom Pontifici ad Athanasium et Athanasii ad eodem, etc., etc.

These RARE and INTERESTING OLD VOLUMES contain The Jewel of Joye; a Treatise on Fastynge; The Solace of the Soul; The Fortress of the Faithful; a Dialogue; Agynst Adultery; The Flower of Godly Prayers; The Sick Man's Salve; Displaying of the Popyse Masse; The Reliques of Rome; Benedictions and Consecrations; The Reports of Certain Men of the Popes Proude Primacie and Arrogant Auctoritie; The Popishe Masse; The Christmas Basket; The Nosegay; David's Harpe; A New Year's Gift; The Booke of Matrimony, and others on other subjects. This is the first collected edition of 1560, *it is not quite perfect*. Nearly every line is printed in fine old English Black Letter and is excessively rare, nearly all of which have fine old engraved titles.

It was JOHN DAYE, the printer of these volumes, who perfected the Greek types, and who first printed with Saxon characters in England. It was by means of his editions of the Bible and other works printed with the above black letter type that the Reformation was promoted.
