We advise that the mail, via Point St. Charles and Summerside, arrived in this city very irregularly, during last week, being upwards of an hour and a half late on at least one evening.

The schedule time for arrival here is ten minutes past eight; but for the week ending Saturday last it was late five days out of the six as will be seen from the following figures: August 18th mail arrived at 8:50; 19th, at 9:10; 21st, at 8:30; 22nd, at 9:00; and 23rd, at 9:45.
