Arrival of the Hibernian.
PORT at Quebec, May 6.
The Canadian steamer "Hibernian"
from Liverpool on the 27th, via Londonderry
on the 28th, passed this point 2.30 this after-
noon, en route to Quebec. She has 35 cabin

In the English House of Lords, on Thurs-
day night, Earl Russell, and in the House of
Commons, Sir George Grey, on behalf of
Lord Palmerston, gave notice that they
would on the 1st of May, move an address to
the Queen, expressing sorrow and indignation

official bodies in various towns and Pro-
vinces. The American in London assembled in
Grosvenor Hotel, at the invitation of Mr.
F. Wood. The meeting adjourned till the
1st of May, when Minister Adams will preside
at a mass meeting of Americans in St. James
Hall.
