The Judge closed his charge on Wednesday last in the afternoon, and the jury after an absence of fifty minutes, brought in a verdict of "Guilty as indicted."

Port Locke.—The store of J. P. Foster, Esq., of Port Locke, was broken open on Friday morning, Jan. 27th. Three barrels of flour were taken and a large amount of dry goods. The loss is estimated at \$300.

A petition to abolish the stamp duty on promissory notes and bills of exchange has been presented by the Dominion Board of Trade to His Excellency the Governor General in Council, assembled, and Senate and House of Commons.
