REMEMBER TO BE CAREFUL.—Ottawa, Jan. 28.—It is stated that owing to the unsatisfactory state of the public finances, the Government has decided to introduce a measure at the coming session. Parliament concerning all salaries granted in aid of railways which have not that far been available, or where the conditions of such grants have not been complied with by any chartered railway companies. The action of granting Dominion aid toward the construction of local railways was compromised in the session of 1882, and at every session since many large grants have been made until the aggregate of the subsidies voted by Parliament for such purposes has reached about \$24,000,000, exclusive of grants to the Canadian Pacific Company, and for roads to be built in public works. The Government think that subsidies which have not been applied for up to the present should be cancelled and the public liabilities reduced to that extent.—Montreal Witness.
