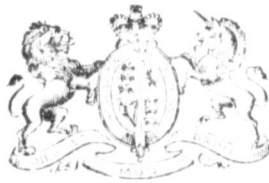
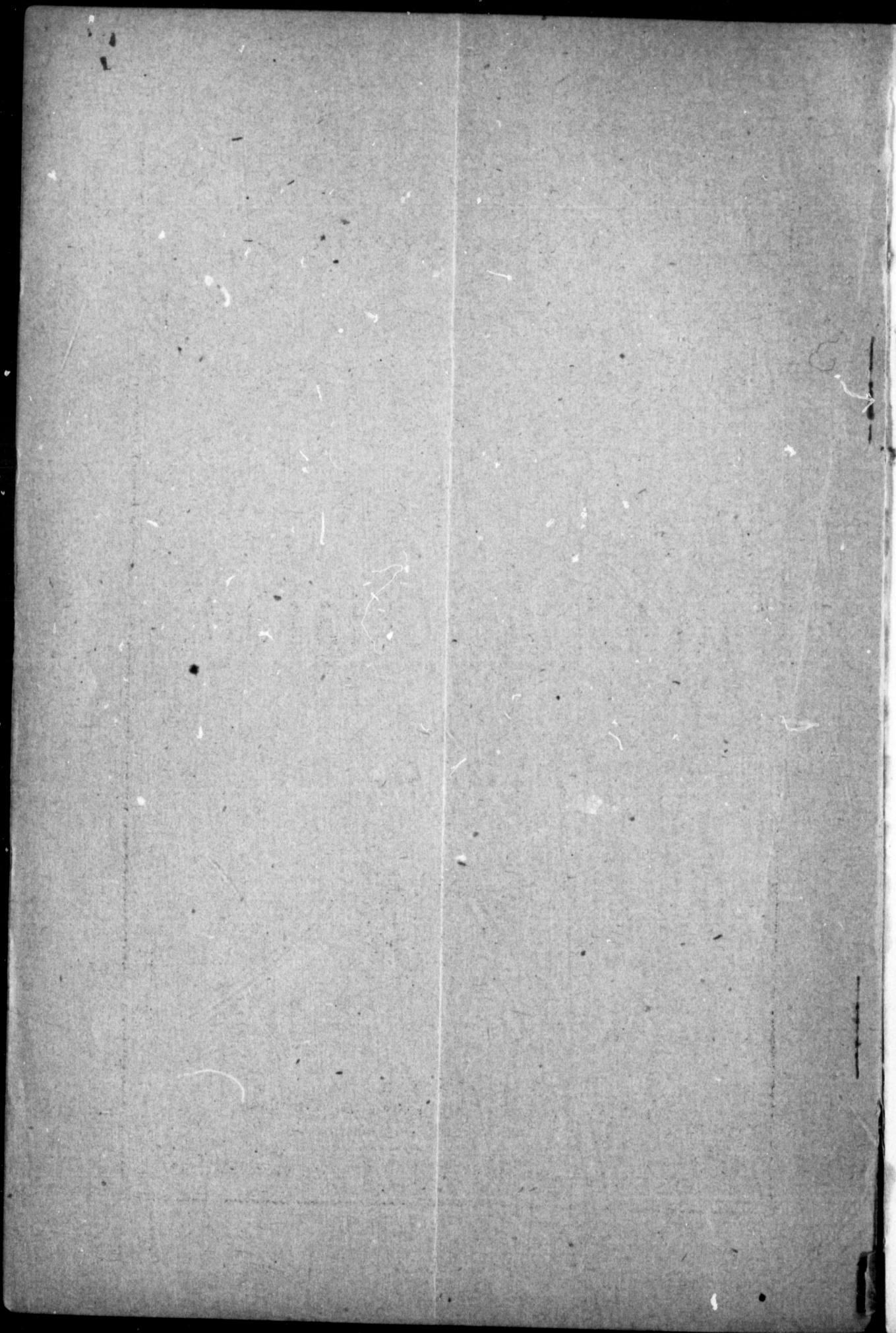

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TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION.

The Council submit the following as their report for the year now ending:

As was the case last year, the conduct of the affairs of the Association has been wholly in the hands of the Executive Committee, as the necessity for special meetings of the Council did not arise.

Shortly after the last annual meeting, the special Committee appointed at that meeting visited and inspected the property of Mr. D. M. Fairweather, at Sussex, which had been recommended as a suitable site for a new Range. It was ascertained that a lease for a term of years could be secured on fairly reasonable conditions. In consequence of the very favourable report of this Committee, an estimate of the probable cost of constructing Butts and Firing Points was prepared, and sent to the Department of Militia, together with a strong application for a grant sufficient to cover this cost.

The application, it might be stated, received the favourable recommendation of the Deputy Adjutant-General, but was not so favourably regarded by the Major-General Commanding. Subsequently the President of the Association had private interviews on the subject with The Honourable The Ministers of Militia and Finance, but nothing definite has yet resulted.

The matter is still before the department, and it is deeply to be hoped, for the welfare of the Association, that further

efforts may shortly be made leading to a satisfactory consideration of the application.

To complete the New Brunswick Eight for the Maritime Match, the Committee had to nominate six men as only two of those who won their places at Ottawa were able to assist in the match. The Council would not omit recognition of the readiness shown by the men named in consenting to go to Charlottetown, and in performing some preliminary practice. The Match was shot on Thursday, June 12th, and our team, under the command of Captain J. H. McRobbie, had the great success of winning the trophy. The team totals were: New Brunswick, 617; P. E. Island, 597; Nova Scotia, 587. Next June the teams are to meet at Bedford Range, N. S.

On the Canadian Team attending this year's National Meeting at Bisley, three of our members had places. Lieut. E. A. Smith, Lieut. Jas Manning, and Col.-Sgt. M. B. Henderson.

The two latter had their first experience of an N. R. A. Meeting, and both found their way into the Prize List; while Lieut. Smith was no less fortunate than to win a place in the Queen's Hundred, with its accompanying Badge; a badge also in the Grand Aggregate; and finally scored well for Canada in the Kolapore Match.

It was thought desirable to hold the Annual Shooting early enough in August to leave a week's interval between "Sussex" and the D. R. A. Matches at Ottawa, and Tuesday, the 19th, was accordingly selected as the opening day. Had the lateness of the season been foreseen, this would hardly have been done, as it proved a very inconvenient time for many of the members, and operated to some extent against the attendance. Finding that there was no prospect of having a new Range, the old one was secured from Mr. Stockton for the year at the former rental, and was got in readiness by the 19th. The firing was delayed about two hours on the second morning by rain, but apart from this, nothing occurred to interfere with the progress of the matches, and wind and weather were on the whole favourable.

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The Prize List, both in amount and arrangement, was similar to that of last year, excepting only the addition, as a gift from Lieut-Col. Beer and members of the 74th Battalion, of the York Pitcher, which was shot for in connection with the two Martini Extra Matches. A first Prize for the Nursery Match was again received from Lieut.-Col. Maunsell, to whom the Association thus continues under great obligations.

The Cup presented in 1888 by Charles E. McPherson has had its three competitions, and so drops out of the Prize List, though it is yet to be shot off by the three winners.

The presentation of prizes was made on the ground on Thursday afternoon by the Vice-President, Lieut.-Colonel Armstrong, to whom the members are indebted for coming specially from St. John for the purpose. The meeting was, therefore, as in the past few years, easily completed in three days.

The Association has suffered a serious loss in the withdrawal of the Provincial Grant of \$300. For some years past the Council had devoted this grant to the purposes of the Ottawa Team, regarding that as the best use to which it could be put, as insuring a creditable representation from New Brunswick at the Dominion of Canada Meeting. Strange to say, the fact that it was so expended was put forward as a reason for discontinuing the grant. The Ottawa Team of this year, as a consequence, was not as strong numerically as recent teams have been, its members being 22, as against 34 in 1889. The thanks of the Association are especially due to the Railway Department for free return passes to Pt. Levis, and to the C. P. R. for a very reasonable special rate to Ottawa *via* Short Line.

A return of the Prizes has been submitted, and records only a very moderate degree of success; the principal thing to be noted being the position of three members for the Bisley Team of next year.

The Council would again notice with regret the practice of some of the County Associations of holding their matches after the Provincial, and after the season's shooting is virtually

over. It does seem to the Council that County Associations, by waiting until September or October to hold their shooting, altogether fail to encourage new shots to come forward for the P. R. A. matches, and are little likely to do any real good in the way of encouraging interest in rifle practice. Were these matches held in the early part of August, we feel that there would be a much greater probability of each County being fitly represented at Sussex.

The report of the proceedings of 1889 was printed in the usual form, and copies distributed among the members.

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OTTAWA TEAM REPORT.

ST. JOHN, N. B., OCTOBER 30th, 1890.

The President N. B. Rifle Association:

SIR, — The experience of our Ottawa Team at the recent D. R. A. Matches was not an eventful one, and there is but little upon which I can dwell in now submitting the return of the prizes gained.

It was expected that this year's team would be smaller in point of numbers than those we have sent of late years, because of the loss of the Provincial allowance. Such was the case; but, happily, not to the extent that was generally feared. When we all reached Ottawa, we found that we required entries for 22.

Still, this is a decrease in numbers from preceding teams, and is a thing to be regretted, as it means so much less chance of our meeting with good success. That the withdrawal of the grant should not have had a more serious effect, doubtless shows that the Dominion Meeting now has a firm hold on the affections of our riflemen, and that no uncertainty as to forming a team is likely to again arise.

It is right that I should mention that Intercolonial passes to Quebec were available, and that the C. P. R. continued their special rate of last year; two advantages of very great moment.

New Brunswick riflemen continue to be under no slight obligation to the Secretary, Col. Bacon, for the latitude he allows us in making our entries. Had we to send forward names and entrance fees beforehand, much difficulty and inconvenience would result, all of which is avoided by our being permitted to bespeak a number of entries, and receiving the tickets in blank when we reach Ottawa. The concession made in our favor must cause Col. Bacon additional trouble, but for some years past he has kindly incurred it for our sake.

The shooting began on Monday morning, Sept. 1st, and was concluded at mid-day on Friday. The intention was to have fin-

ished on Thursday, but that was found to be impracticable, and it would not, I think, be in the interest of the Association, nor agreeable to the bulk of the competitors, to again attempt to compress so much shooting into the four days.

The special new feature of the programme was the addition of two "shoots" (one being the Governor-General's Match and the other the London Merchants') with the Martini, over Queen's Ranges for the first hundred in the Grand Aggregate, the scores counting in the aggregate for Bisley; so that familiarity with the Martini was more than ever necessary to the aspirant to a place on the Team. In this Bisley aggregate, 118 shots were fired, of which 59, one-half, were with the Martini. This state of things is likely to continue, and it means that members of our Association must take up the practice of Martini shooting as seriously as that of Snider, if we are to retain our share of the honours.

Thanks to the Maritime Match, we have no reason to feel that we are without Martini men; but we do need more rifles, and better ones. In militia stores are plenty of rifles of newer make than any in the hands of our Association, and which, I understand, are obtainable by officers commanding corps on making application and giving security for their safe keeping. Surely this is an opportunity which should be seized upon.

In reference to the shooting of the Team, I will add but a remark or two to the detailed statement contained in the Prize Return. When the anxious time of "making up" the Grand Aggregate was over, 9 N. B. names were found to be included in the first hundred. They were, Sgt. Miner, Major F. H. Hartt, Lieut. McAvity, Pte. Burns, Capt. J. T. Hartt, S.-Sgt. Loggie, Col.-Sgt. E. Wetmore, Col.-Sgt. M. B. Henderson, and Capt. J. H. McRobbie. The subsequent Martini shooting, on the whole, bettered their positions, and now, in the twenty, are Lieut. McAvity and Col.-Sgt. Henderson, while Capt. Hartt is 25th and Pte. Burns 39th.

The London Merchants' Cup went to Nova Scotia with a score of 662; the other Provinces being, Quebec, 644; Ontario, 641; New Brunswick, 637; Manitoba, 604; P. E. Island, 575.

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This report furnishes me with an opportunity of which I am sure it will not be out of place to avail myself. I gladly use it to mention the delight which the gift of the Martini rifle from the team of 1889 occasioned me, and which I still feel in its possession. I hope my words did not fail to express something of this to those who were present at Sussex. The journeys since made over the Ranges have but strengthened my rifleman's proper pride in so beautiful a "gun." I thank the members indeed, one and all, to whom I am indebted for such a weapon; and I trust there will be no regret on their part should I now and again succeed in turning it against themselves.

The Return was received, and on motion of Captain McROBBIE and Lieut. MANNING, Captain HARTT was directed to prepare a report after the usual form, to be printed in the pamphlet report of the year's proceedings.

It was also resolved that the President have power to name a Committee in regard to the Application now before the Department of Militia, whenever it should seem to him that further action ought to be taken.

The meeting then adjourned.
