



OTTAWA IN THROES OF TYPHOID EPIDEMIC

A Repetition of Last Year's Experi-

"The water cituation in Ottawa has suddenly assumed a most serious aspect. A typhoid epidemic is abroad in the city. Only a few days have gone by since the medical health officer issued his warning to the people to 'boil the water,' and already the situation is perilously near that of last year in the beginning of the epidemic. It will be remembered that matters ultimately became so grave that about 1,200 cases of typhoid developed and about sixty deaths resulted.
"Only a few days have elapsed since the water was declared polluted, and already there are at least sixty cases of typhoid in the city. 




