case that it is a fraud on the part of a public journal to conceal a fraud.

The only reasonable explanation of 'The Telegram's attitude seems to be that it is so conscious of Mayor Fleming's trickery that it finds itself paralyzed and cannot argue the case, it merely drifts.

The Mail is aiding and abetting the deal because John Shaw has told them that it would let a Conservative of the Mail type in as Mayor.

The News is supporting the deal because it opposed Fleming at the late election and is nothing if it is not advocating this quarter what it denounced last.

The World, single-handed, has exposed the transaction because of the rankness of its inception, of the rankness of its nursing and of the rankness of its execution.

The proposed deal is not by any means popular, nor is it thought to be in the interests of the city that such a deal should go through without being challenged.

Mr. Fleming should resign his position as Mayor before he is an applicant for such an important position as that of an Assessment Commissioner.

There is no doubt that he is possessed of some ability, and he makes an admirable presiding officer.

He is well up in municipal politics. He knows how to pull wires and use men for his own aggrandizement.

He has possession of the members of the Council, and some of them have not sense enough to see that he is using them.

According to reports Mr. Fleming argues that he does not see any reason why he should not take less than \$4300 a year, his present salary as Mayor and Chairman of the Board of Control.

As a taxpayer I beg to differ with him on this point, and, with all his well-known abilities, he would find it up-hill work for a great many years in any business he might choose, and especially if he had to depend upon his own exertions, to earn anything like \$4300 a year.

But the fact of the matter is that there are a few in the Council who wish to get rid of him, to step into his shoes and to get other positions.

Allow me to tell your numerous readers that Mr. Fleming has made a good average Mayor, but all the time he has been looking after Robert Fleming, and the proposed deal is the culmination of his ambition.

I think it is about time that the citizens of Toronto should turn over a new leaf and not elect men to the position of supreme magistrate who have no real stake in the city.

Robert Fleming has a long head and looks into the future. Legislation was obtained some months ago to enable this deal to go through.

I think it is beneath the dignity of the Chief Magistrate to put himself into the position and use his influence to secure the assent of the Council.

It is a disgraceful thing that the Mayor should be so much interested in his own pecuniary interests as to neglect his duty to the city.

The members of the Council will be watched, and no man who votes for this deal should be returned at the next municipal elections.

As a taxpayer this is my protest against what I consider a transparent fraud on the taxpayers of the city. Balaam-Avenue.

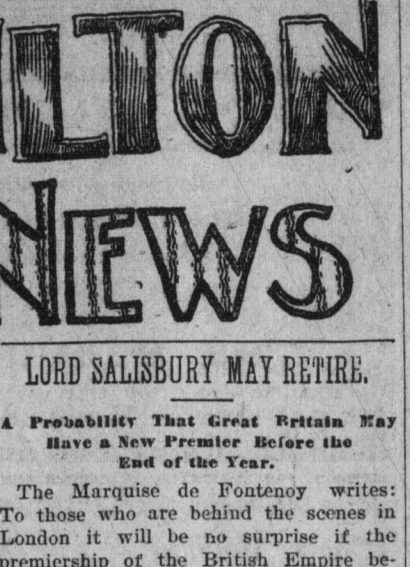

**Mr. J. W. Lang's Affairs**—Motion to commit the Mayor, Engineer and Ontario Board of Works.

The Canada Sugar Refining Company are creditors of Mr. J. W. Lang, the wholesale grocer on Front-street, in an amount they estimate at about \$5,000, and they object to the sale of certain of his stock-in-trade to Mr. Lumsden, and to the mortgage of the stock for \$22,000 by Mr. Lumsden to Mr. T. H. Steele, yesterday. Mr. George Lang, the agent, obtained the never-filling injunction (at least never-failing, except in the North Ontario election case), restraining Lang, Lumsden and Steele from selling the stock, and from disposing of the proceeds of the portion sold to themselves and all other creditors, and thus the court looks upon them with as much favor as is consistent with impartial justice.

**Chamber Motions**

Mr. Justice MacMahon presided in what the lawyers call single court sessions. Several of the motions, though as far as The World reporter could ascertain from the assembly, were heard in the usual manner, but some of them were heard in chambers and court in vacation, that is to say, counsel may appear in any costume he pleases, but, of course, a sea-side bathing suit.

**Two Justices Necessary**

His counsel, Mr. W. M. Douglas, coolly asked the Mayor, the Engineer and the Chairman of the Board of Works of the city of Ottawa, to consent to the Ottawa Corporation in disobeying the injunction granted by Justice Robertson, ordering the corporation not to pay over any money on street paving contracts. It soon appeared that, whoever was at fault, the applicant had done his duty. The trouble appears to be that the corporation did not advertise for tenders in accordance with the contract. Mr. Dwyer is very tender on this point. He objects to the work being continued by the present contractor, the Canadian Granite Company of Ottawa. Mr. W. L. Riddell appeared for both defendants, and in his opinion the law is against this client who would not entertain for the fifty-million part of a second any idea of disobeying the order of the court. The corporation had only to pass a by-law to get out of the present litigation, which they felt compelled to do, and were appealing from Justice Robertson's injunction, and he contended that the appeal being filed in court 505 a stay of proceedings. Cur ad vult, as the lawyers say, which means that for Justice Robertson's injunction to stand, the applicant must be furnished with the matter into his serious consideration.

**Patrols Must be Furnished**

In the North Ontario election the respondent obtained the usual order requiring the petitioner to furnish a detachment of constables within fourteen days of the day fixed for the trial, viz: Sept. 13, next.
