GEN. BULLER KEEPS WAR OFFICE DARK AS TO HIS MOVEMENTS

But Military Men in London Assume That the Fighting is Still Going On to Prevent Further Entrenching by the Boers.

A Durban Story Says That Lord Dundonald's Flying Column Has Reached Ladysmith—Pretoria Said to Be Perturbed—Casualties in Gen. Hart's Brigade—Buller's Move is Looked Upon by Some Critics as Dangerous—Still Bombarding Kimberley.

A special from Durban last night says the statement comes from an excellent source in Pietermaritzburg that Lord Dundonald has reached Ladysmith with 1000 men. The story, however, has not been confirmed.

Writing from Lorenzo Marques, The London Times correspondent says it is reported that Pretoria is much perturbed. This news is confirmed from various sources, and it was even hinted on Sunday that the Boers were about to sue for peace.

The Times' correspondent at Frere Camp yesterday that on Friday General Warren began a long march from Trichard's Drift westward. This was also done owing to the fact that the long ridge which runs west from Spion Kop was occupied by the enemy, who commanded the route, rendering the maintenance of communications for transport impossible.

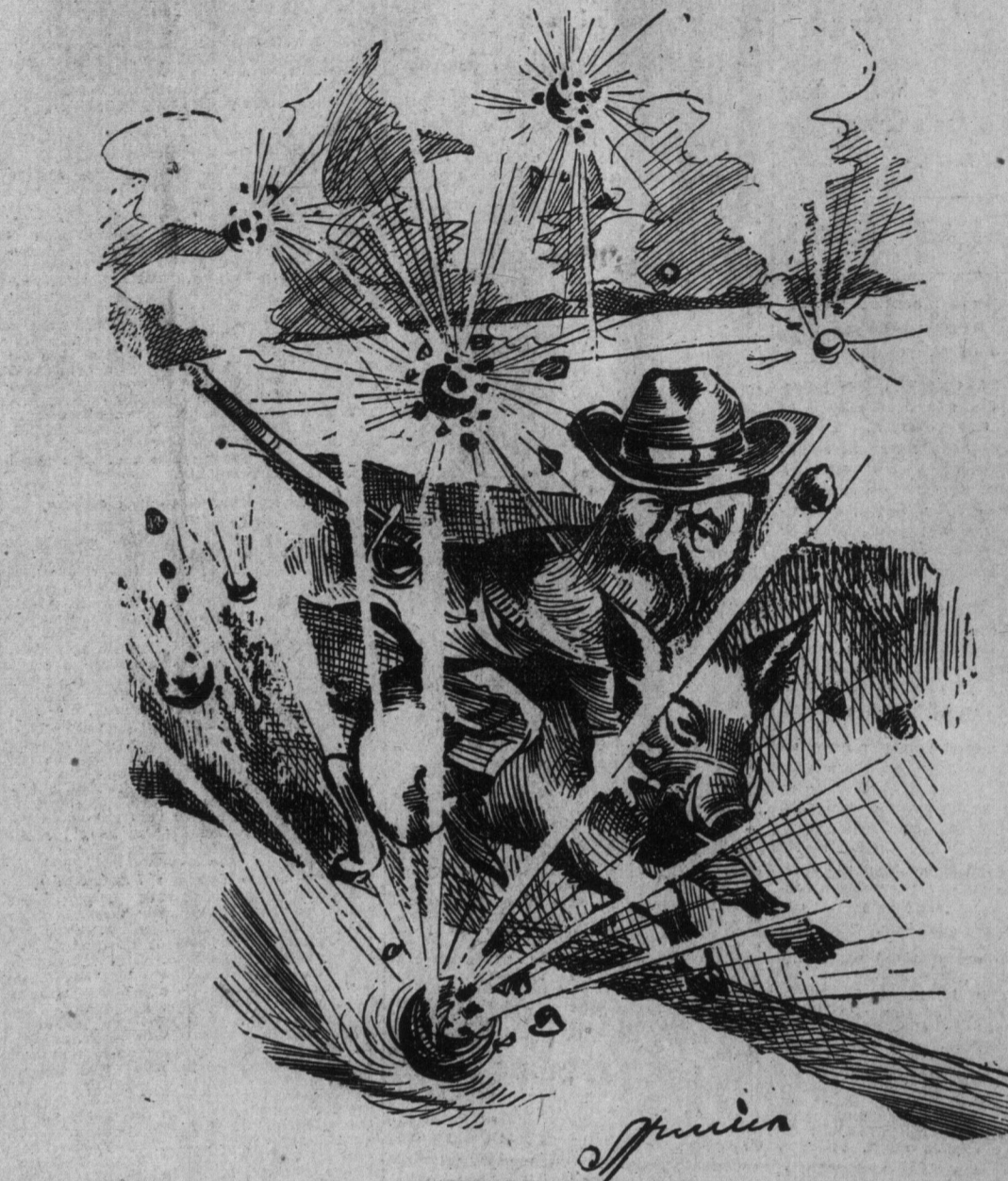

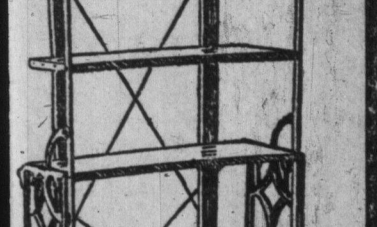
