Buffalo, June 3.-The Commercial this afternoon says regarding the Queen's Jubilee banquet, which will be held on the evening of the 22nd: "There is every indication that the forthcoming banquet ever held in Buffalo. PRETTY STATE OF THINGS

Keat County Council Has an Investigation on Hand-Officials Said to Have Overdrawn Their Salaries. Chatham, June 3.-It is reported there are grave irregularities in connection with the County Treasurer's office, and an investigation is now in progress by the County Council. The auditors' report, which was presented yesterday, states that certain county officials had overdrawn their accounts, a practice which was strongly condemned as irregular, and as paying names to the gravest abuses, but neither names nor amounts were mentioned. Yesterday, however, the auditors were summoned to give particulars, and did so, the disclosure being made that more than \$3000 had been charged against County Treasurer Douglas on the treasurer's books in excess of his salary for the year, and had been credited to the county as a set-off from the official who had made the overdraw.

Wife Murderer Hanged

Morrisville, N.J., June 3.-David Wilson, colored, was hanged here this morning. The crime for which he paid the penalty of the law was the murder of his wife in a tenement known as "Folly" in this city, June 6, 1896. He chopped her to pieces with an ax while she lay on a bed. This was the first murder in Morrisville for 60 years.

Lynn, Mass., June 3.-Five persons were fatally burned by a gasoline explosion at 1 o'clock this morning in the circus tent of a traveling show. A score were injured. The big tent was lighted by gasoline lamps. An employe was filling a torch with the liquid when the fumes took fire and flames spread to the tent. They crept to the main pole, against which stood an immense gasoline tank. The tank was overturned, there was a wild scramble. Tents and seats were destroyed.
