NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF TIMBER LICENSES

CHATHAM, N. B., 24th July, 1900.

The attention of all holders of Timber Licenses is called to Section 12 of the Timber Act, which reads as follows:

"Every tree shall be cut by any Licensee under any License, not over 12 inches in diameter at the base, and not less than 12 inches in length and not less than 12 inches in diameter at the base, and shall be cut in such a manner as to leave the stump and the Licensee be liable for the same."

It is hereby notified that the provisions of this section will be strictly enforced.

dinner, in which he expressed the views

of nine-tenths of the most intelligent

people of the country on the subject of

party rule. He told them that if they

cast their eyes over the political world

they would find that party government

had not been a success, or taken root

anywhere, except in England, or her

offshoots, the colonies and dependencies.

He said that, in the United States, the

parties were two: Power and Placate.

It is one of the many novel experiences of the Kings and Queens of England that, wherever their travels take them, from Scotland to the South of Europe and from Russia to Canada, they can always rely on finding their own tradesmen, trusty and approved, to execute their Royal commands.

These Royal purveyors of all things, from pickles to perfumes and silks to saddles, form a small army of nearly 900 men, who very naturally regard themselves as the elite of tradesmen, and who are as proud of the Royal Coat-of-Arms which throws its auspice over their shops as any Duke of Devonshire is of his dukedom.

It is this business-pride without ample justification; for it is only given to a few tradesmen, and those of unimpeachable business rank, to be granted the honor of being entrusted with a special application to have it transferred to them; and it may equally be cancelled by bankruptcy or anything unsatisfactory in the tradesman's conduct.


