The Candidates for St. John.

Several of our Daily contemporaries

have declared their leaning towards

the election of one of other of the candidates

mons. The names appear to favor Mr.

Burpee; the Globe does the same; the

Telegraph holds in the same direction,

believing that Messrs. Elder and Burpee

are the best men to represent the County.

The religious papers have not thus

far taken any part in the Election Cam-

paign, probably because they feel there

is no great religious question at stake,

nothing to justify them in selling their

hands with the muddy waters of politics.

All the candidates before the constitu-

ency have qualities which justify their

candidate. Mr. Kerr's legal abilities

are of a high order, and his patience

and perseverance in pursuing the object

on which he fixes his aim, are worthy

of all praise. He has sought to recom-

mend himself to the constituency by ac-

knowing public improvements of one

kind or another, and in so doing

has followed a highly laudable course.

Mr. Elder's literary attainments are of

a high order. He has many of the

qualities required in a legislator, and

the time is coming when he will find his

way into Parliament. Mr. Burpee is a

leading merchant, and the representa-

tion most particularly of the railway in-

terest. He is in easy circumstances and

can afford to devote some time to poli-

tics. Mr. Palmer has been eminently

successful at the Bar, successful as a

ship-builder and ship-owner, and suc-

cessful as a manufacturer. He has

always been identified politically with

what we call the Party of Progress,

with the old Liberal Party and the new

Confederate Party. His knowledge of

Provincial and Dominion laws, his ability

in argument, his extensive acquaint-

ance with mercantile transactions, espe-

cially his thorough study of the ship-

ping interest, all seem to point him out

as a suitable man to represent a con-

stituency so largely interested in com-

merce and shipping and to be able to be

affected by sudden or slight changes in

the laws. The large vote which was

polling for Mr. Palmer on a former oc-

casion in this City indicated a strong

preference for him on the part of a large

body of electors and was ample justifi-

cation of his early appearance in the

field during the present contest. The

presence of so numerous a representa-

tion of the voters is entitled to respect-

ful consideration, and we feel disposed

to aid them in their aspirations.

The canvassing connected with the
