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CONFRATERNITY

OF

MOUNT CARMEL.

It has been found in many places that the establishment of the above Confraternity has helped very much to promote the spiritual welfare of the Christian Soldier. Here, then, are some rules to help those who wish to form this pious union; and which may, of course, be adapted to particular circumstances.

RULES.

1. Those who are admitted into the Confraternity should endeavour to lead pure and holy lives; to love God above all things, and their neighbour as themselves, according to the words of our Blessed Redeemer, "Love one another, as I have loved you."
2. All who are able and not on duty are expected to attend every evening at the recital of the Rosary. All are earnestly exhorted to approach the Sacraments at least once each month. The brethren are also strongly recommended to attend Mass on week-days when they can, more especially should military duty have kept them

away on Sunday. They are also to bear in mind the duty of observing holidays of obligation as well as they are able.

3. The brethren are to be obedient to the prior and sub-prior. They are to love and help each other; and to be mindful of the duty of fraternal correction if they see any one going wrong by drunkenness, cursing and swearing, or bad company.

4. A Prior, Sub-Prior, and Secretary are to be chosen from amongst the Brethren one a year (oftener if necessary); and, if possible, on July 16th, the Festival of our Blessed Lady of Mount Carmel.

5. The above Officers of the Confraternity are employed to receive and hold all collections and moneys of the Confraternity; for which they have to account to the Brethren at their general meetings, which shall be held once each month, on the day most convenient to all. At such meetings the monthly subscription is to be paid, and the names of Postulants for admission into the Confraternity will be proposed.

6. Postulants are to remain one month on probation; during which time they are expected to attend the evening devotions, and to give general good example. They will be admitted by ballot, or by consent of the chaplain.

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7. The brethren shall each contribute a small monthly subscription, to be employed in purchasing candles for the altar, scapulars for the Brethren, and good books for a lending-library. On the death of a brother of the Confraternity, a Mass is to be offered for the repose of his soul. A Mass is to be offered likewise for the Brethren on the first Saturday in each month, and one for all deceased Brethren on the Saturday within the Octave of All Sou's.

8. The Officers of the Confraternity have no power as to the disposal of its funds without the consent of the Brethren.

9. Should the conduct of any Brother be, unhappily, such as to cause scandal to others, it will be the duty of the Prior and Sub-Prior to warn him three several times. Should this, however, be in vain, his name will be erased from the confraternity-roll at the next meeting. If he afterwards repent, he may, on his own request, be re-admitted after a probation of six weeks.

Create a clean heart in us, O God, and renew a right spirit within us. We beseech thee, O Lord, to hear us, and to have mercy upon us. And we beseech the blessed Mary ever Virgin, blessed Michael the Archangel, blessed John the Baptist, the holy Apostles Peter and Paul, and all the Saints, to pray to the Lord our God for us.

May Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. Amen.

May the Almighty and Merciful Lord grant us † pardon, absolution, and remission of all our sins. Amen.

Let us offer up the holy Rosary to the greater honour and glory of Almighty God for all the members of this confraternity, for the conversion of all sinners, for our own perseverance in grace, for the agonising, and for the holy souls in Purgatory. Let us offer it likewise for the intentions of our holy Father the Pope, that we may gain all the indulgences granted to this holy exercise.

PART I. THE FIVE JOYFUL MYSTERIES.

1. Let us contemplate, in the first joyful mystery, how the angel Gabriel saluted our Blessed Lady with the title "Full of grace," and declared unto her the Incarnation of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

*Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times.
Glory be to the Father.*

Let us pray.

O Holy Mary, Queen of Virgins; through the most high mystery of the Incarnation of thy beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, wherein our salvation was begun, obtain for us, through thy most holy intercession, light to understand the greatness of the benefit he hath bestowed upon us, in vouchsafing to become our Brother, and giving thee, his own beloved Mother, to be our Mother also. Amen.

2. Let us contemp'ate, in the second joyful mystery, how the Blessed Virgin Mary, understanding from the angel that her cousin St. Elizabeth had conceived, went with haste into the

mountains of Judea to visit her, bearing her divine Son within her womb, and remained with her three months.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O holy Virgin, most spotless mirror of humility; by that exceeding charity which moved thee to visit thy holy cousin, St. Elizabeth, obtain for us, through thine intercession, that our hearts being visited by thy divine Son, and freed from all sin, we may praise and give thanks to him for ever. Amen.

3. Let us contemplate, in the third joyful mystery, how the Blessed Virgin Mary, when the time of her delivery was come, brought forth our Redeemer, Jesus Christ, at midnight, and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for him in the inns at Bethlehem.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O most pure Mother of God; through thy virginal and most joyful delivery, whereby thou gavest to the world thy only Son, our Saviour, we

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beseech thee obtain for us, through thine intercession, the grace to lead such pure and holy lives in this world, that we may become worthy to sing without ceasing the mercies of thy Son, and his benefits to us by thee. Amen.

4. Let us contemplate, in the fourth joyful mystery, how the Blessed Virgin Mary, on the day of her purification, presented the child Jesus in the Temple, where holy Simeon, giving thanks to God, with great devotion received him into his arms.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O holy Virgin, most admirable mistress and pattern of obedience, who didst present the Lord of the Temple in the Temple of God; obtain for us, of thy blessed Son, that with holy Simeon and devout Anna, we praise and glorify him for ever. Amen.

Let us contemplate, in the fifth joyful mystery, how the Blessed Virgin Mary, after having lost her beloved Son in Jerusalem [through no fault of hers], sought him for the space of three days; and at length found him in the Temple, sitting

in the midst of the doctors, hearing them and asking them questions, being of the age of twelve years.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O most blessed Virgin, more than martyr in thy sufferings, and yet the comfort of such as are afflicted; by that unspeakable joy wherewith thy soul was filled, when at length thou didst find thy well-beloved Son in the Temple, teaching in the midst of the doctors, obtain of him that we may so seek him and find him in his holy Catholic Church, as never more to be separated from him. Amen.

Salve Regina.

Hail, Queen, Mother of Mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope, hail. Exiles, children of Eve, we cry to thee. To thee we sigh, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Ah, then, our advocate, turn upon us those merciful eyes of thine; and after this our exile, show to us Jesus, the blessed Fruit of thy womb. O merciful, O kind, O sweet Virgin Mary.

r. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Remember, O Mary, most tender Virgin, it was never heard that any one ran to thy protection, implored thy help, or asked thy prayers, in vain. Filled with such confidence, Virgin of virgins, Mother, I run to thee; to thee I come, before thee I a weeping sinner stand. Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions; but in thy pity hear and answer. Amen.

PART II. THE FIVE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES.

1. Let us contemplate, in the first sorrowful mystery, how our Lord Jesus was so afflicted for us in the garden of Gethsemane, that his body was bathed in a sweat of blood, which ran down in great drops to the ground.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O most holy Virgin, more than martyr; by that ardent prayer which our beloved Saviour poured forth to his heavenly Father in the garden, vouchsafe to intercede for us, that, our passions being reduced to the obedience of reason, we may always, and in all things, conform and subject ourselves to the holy will of God. Amen.

2. Let us contemplate, in the second sorrowful mystery, how our Lord Jesus Christ was most cruelly scourged in Pilate's house, the number of stripes they gave him being about five thousand.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O Mother of God, overflowing fountain of patience; through those stripes thy only and much-beloved Son vouchsafed to suffer for us, obtain of

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him for us grace to mortify our rebellious senses,
 to avoid the occasions of sin, and to be ready to
 suffer every thing rather than offend God. Amen.

3. Let us contemplate, in the third sorrowful
 mystery, how those cruel ministers of Satan
 platted a crown of sharp thorns, and cruelly press-
 ed it on the sacred head of our Lord Jesus Christ.

*Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory
 be to the Father.*

Let us pray.

O Mother of our Eternal Prince, the King of
 Glory; by those sharp thorns wherewith his sacred
 head was pierced, we beseech thee obtain, through
 thy intercession, that we may be delivered from
 all notions of pride, and escape that shame which
 our sins deserve at the day of judgment. Amen.

4. Let us contemplate, in the fourth sorrowful
 mystery, how our Lord Jesus Christ, being sen-
 tenced to die, bore, with the most amazing pa-
 tience, the cross which was laid upon him for his
 greater torment and ignominy.

*Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory
 be to the Father.*

Let us pray.

O Holy Virgin, example of patience; by the most painful carrying of the cross, in which thy Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, bore the heavy weight of our sins, obtain for us of Him, through thine intercession, courage and strength to follow his steps, and bear our cross after him to the end of our lives. Amen.

5. Let us contemplate, in the fifth sorrowful mystery, how our Lord Jesus Christ, being come to Mount Calvary, was stripped of his clothes, and his hands and feet nailed to the cross in the presence of his most afflicted Mother.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O holy Mary, Mother of God; as the body of thy beloved Son was for us stretched upon the cross, so may we offer up our souls and bodies to be crucified with him, and our hearts to be pierced with grief at his most bitter Passion; and thou, O most sorrowful Mother, graciously vouchsafe to help us, by thy all-powerful intercession, to accomplish the work of our salvation. Amen.

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PART III. THE FIVE GLORIOUS MYSTERIES.

1. Let us contemplate, in the first glorious mystery, how our Lord Jesus Christ, triumphing gloriously over death, rose again the third day, immortal and impassible.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O glorious Virgin Mary, by that unspeakable joy thou didst receive in the resurrection of thy Divine Son, we beseech thee obtain for us of him, that our hearts may never go astray after the false joys of this world, but may be for ever wholly employed in pursuit of the only true and solid joys of heaven. Amen.

2. Let us contemplate, in the second glorious mystery, how our Lord Jesus Christ, forty days after his resurrection, ascended into heaven, attended by angels, in the sight, and to the great admiration, of his most holy Mother, and his holy Apostles and disciples.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O Mother of God, comforter of the afflicted ; as thy beloved Son, when he ascended into heaven, lifted up his hands and blessed his Apostles, as he was parting from them, so vouchsafe, most holy Mother, to lift up thy pure hands to him on our behalf, that we may enjoy the benefits of his blessing, and of thine, here on earth, and hereafter in heaven. Amen.

3. Let us contemplate, in the third glorious mystery, how our Lord Jesus Christ, being seated on the right hand of God, sent, as he had promised, the Holy Ghost upon his Apostles, who after he was ascended, returning to Jerusalem, continued in prayer and supplication with the Blessed Virgin Mary, expecting the performance of his promise.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O sacred Virgin, Tabernacle of the Holy Ghost ; we beseech thee obtain, by thine intercession, that this most sweet Comforter, whom thy beloved Son sent down upon his Apostles, filling them thereby with spiritual joy, may teach us in this

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world the true way of salvation, and make us to walk in the path of virtue and good works. Amen.

4. Let us contemplate, in the fourth glorious mystery, how the glorious Virgin, twelve years after the resurrection of her Son, passed out of this world unto him, and was by him assumed into heaven, accompanied by the holy Angels.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O most prudent Virgin, who, entering the heavenly palaces, didst fill the angels with joy and man with hope; vouchsafe to intercede for us at the hour of our death, that, being delivered from the illusions and temptations of the devil, we may joyfully and securely pass out of this temporal state, to enjoy the happiness of eternal life. Amen.

5. Let us contemplate, in the fifth glorious mystery, how the glorious Virgin Mary was, to the great jubilee and exultation of the whole court of heaven, and particular glory of all the Saints, crowned by her Son with the brightest diadem of glory.

Our Father once. Hail Mary ten times. Glory be to the Father.

Let us pray.

O glorious Queen of all the heavenly host ;
 we beseech thee accept this Rosary, which, as a
 crown of roses, we offer at thy feet ; and grant,
 most gracious Lady, that, by thy intercession,
 our souls may be inflamed with so ardent a desire
 of seeing thee so gloriously crowned, that it may
 never die within us until it shall be changed into
 the happy fruition of thy blessed sight. Amen.
