





It is only when the Equation of time = 0 that forenoon hours equals the afternoon.

On the Right hand page of each month are the changes of the moon, its Rising, Southing, and Setting, and the time of High Water at Charlottetown, to the nearest minute of local mean time. The bearing of the Moon at the time of full and change, time of Perigee and Apogee, crossing the Equinoctial, and of reaching its greatest North and South Declination, are given for the purpose of assisting weather forecasts, it being generally found that the Lunar Equinoctials are marked by atmospheric disturbances, the stronger the more nearly the times agree with those of the moon's changes and perigee.

ECLIPSES.

During the year 1883 there will be two Eclipses of the sun and two of the moon, of which only one of the moon will be visible at Charlottetown.

I. A Partial Eclipse of the moon, April 21st. Greenwich mean time of opposition, oh. 7m. 33.1 sec.

II. A Total Eclipse of the sun, May 6th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 9h. 45m. 12.7 sec., to the South Pacific Ocean, partially visible in the morning, New Zealand, east of Australia and New Guinea, in the evening Peru and Central America.

III. A Partial Eclipse of the moon, October 15th. Greenwich mean time of opposition, 19h. 20m. 30.7 sec., (7.20.5 a. m., October 16.)

IV. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, October 30th. Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 11h. 36m. 46.1 sec., to North Pacific Ocean, partially visible in the morning, China, Japan and the Philippines, in the evening, west of Rocky Mountains, North America.


PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Mercury will be at his greatest apparent elongation from the Sun, towards the West rising before, towards the East setting after the Sun on the following days : Jan. 21st, East, March 3rd, West, May 14th, East, July 1st, West, Sept. 10th, East, October 22nd, West.

VENUS.—Venus, motion direct throughout the year, a Morning Star previous to her superior conjunction with the Sun, September 20th, after which she will reappear as an Evening Star to the end of the year, at greatest brilliancy January 10.

MARS.—Mars, motion direct throughout the year, till December 23rd, first appearing a Morning Star about the end of February.

JUPITER.—Jupiter, motion retrograde till February 15th, direct till November 21st, retrograde for the rest of the year, an Evening Star during the first half of the year, coming in conjunction with the Sun, July the 5th, reappearing as a Morning Star towards the end of the month.

SATURN.—Saturn, motion retrograde to January 21st, direct till September 22nd, and retrograde the remaining part of the year, beginning the year as an Evening Star, coming in conjunction with the Sun May 20th, reappearing as a Morning Star in June, in opposition to the Sun November 28th.

URANUS.—Uranus, motion retrograde to May 29th, direct to the end of the year, in opposition to the Sun March 11th, in conjunction September 16.

NEPTUNE.—Neptune, retrograde to January 26th, direct to August 26th, retrograde for the rest of the year.

There will be 19 occultations of Planets by the Moon, namely : of Mercury, Venus and Mars, one each, of Saturn nine, of Neptune seven, but not one under conditions to be visible at Charlottetown.

Principal Light Houses in Prince Edward Island.

North Cape.—On Point. Latitude 47° 3′ 46″. Longitude 63° 59′ 10″. Revolving white light every minute, visible 14 miles. White octagonal tower.

West Point.—On Sand Beach. Latitude 46° 37' 30". Longitude 64° 23' 10". One revolving red and white light. One red and three white flashes in 14 minutes. Greatest brilliancy every 224 seconds; visible 13 miles. Tower wood with broad and white horizontal bands.

Indian Point.—(Summerside) East edge of shoal on Sside of Bedeque Bay. Latitude 46° 22' 40''. Longitude 63° 48' 50''; fixed white light, visible 13 miles. White octagonal wood tower on a circular stone pier.

Sea Cow Head, or Salutation Head.—Latitude 46° 19' 10", Longitude 63° 48' 20"; fixed white light, visible 15 miles. White octagonal tower.

St. Peter's Island.—Hillsborough Bay, westernmost point of Island. Latitude 46° 7′ 10″. Longitude 68° 11′ 40″; fixed white light, visible 12 miles. White square wood tower.

Blockhouse Point.—At west side of entrance to Charlottetown Harbor. Latitude 46° 11′ 36″. Longitude 63° 7′ 28″; two fixed lights in one tower, 21 feet apart vertically, upper white, lower red. Visible 12 miles. White square wood tower with dwelling and signal mast attached.

Point Prim.—S. E. extremity of Hillsborough Bay, 100 yards from the Point. Latitude 46° 3' 10". Longitude 73° 2' 0"; fixed white light, visible 15 miles. White square tower with dwelling attached.

Wood Islands..-Off S. Point. Latitude 45° 57' 22". Longitude 62° 44' 30"; fixed white light, visible 15 miles. White square tower with dwelling attached.

Cape Bear.—On the headland. Latitude 46° 0' 35". Longitude 62° 27' 15"; red light revolving every 30 seconds, visible 12 miles. White square tower with building attached.

Panmure Island.—S. E. extremity of Cardigan Bay. Latitude 46° 8' 55". Longitude 62° 27' 40"; fixed white light, visible 16 miles. White octagonal tower.

St. Andrew's Point.—(Georgetown). Latitude 46° 9' 57". Longitude 62° 31' 23"; fixed red light, (seaward) visible 10 miles. White square tower.

Souris.—Knight's Point, 300 feet S. E. of Breakwater. Latitude 46° 20' 50". Longitude 62° 14' 30"; fixed white light with red streak, visible 15 miles. White square wood tower with dwelling attached.

East Point.—200 yards inshore from S. part of point. Latitude 46° 27' 9". Longitude 61° 58' 15"; white light revolving every 3 minutes, visible 17 miles. White octagonal tower wood.

New London.—1st. West side of entrance to Grenville Harbor. Latitude 46° 31′ 10″. Longitude 63° 28′ 45″; fixed red light, visible 10 miles. White square tower with dwelling attached.

2nd Range. Light 500 feet N. E. of main light; xed white light, visible 3 miles. White tower, square open frame.

Fish Island.—Entrance to Malpeque or Richmond Bay on inside of Island. Latitude 46° 34' 44''. Longitude 63° 42'29''; two fixed white lights 400 yards apart E. by S. and W. by N., visible 12 miles. White square tower with dwelling attached.

Lesser lights are situated at Summerside. (wharf), Crapaud, Orwell, Little Sands, Murray Harbor, St. Peter's Bay, Tracadie, South Rustico, North Rustico, Covehead, Little Channel, Tignish.

To be erected. One light at Cape Egmont. Range lights at Savage Harbor.



FORECASTING THE WEATHER.

Men have, from a very early period, studied the weather, on account of its great influence on their pursuits, in order if possible to predict its nature, and prevent those losses to the Farmer and the Sailor which result from violent storms.

The earlier students based their predictions on the phases of the moon, but an examination of the Greenwich observations for more than half a century has shown that this theory is entirely unfounded. Weather prophets like Moore, Zadkiel and Vennor claim in their Almanacs to be able to forecast the weather day by day for a whole year; but meteorological science in the British Isles, and the Signal Service of the United States, with the Weather Bureau of the Dominion, does not claim to forecast, with any certainty, the weather, for more than three or four days at the most.


If an observer could obtain, at regular and repeated intervals, readings of the Barometer at stations distributed over a large area, he would be enabled to trace the march of the storm, for it has been found that the wind always blows towards the place of the lowest barometer reading; and so, by means of the telegraph, he may warn those places the storm is approaching. Still, mistakes are often made, and the forecasts are not always infallible, so that much remains to be done before meteorology can be ranked among the exact sciences.





and so on, three cents being charged for every $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., or fraction of a $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The rate of Postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by Mail to any place in Canada, is three cents per half ounce weight; but the Statute provides that this rate must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly *unpaid* (or prepaid less than one full rate of *three cents*) cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—" *postage not prepaid*."

Letters as aforesaid posted in Canada, and addressed to places in Canada, when weighing more than half an ounce, and liable therefore to two or more rates of Postage, will be transmitted by mail to destination, though not fully prepaid, if as much as one full rate of three cents has been prepaid thereon by postage stamps; and in such cases will be forwarded charged with double the amount of deficient postage not prepaid : Thus, if such a letter weighing more than $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, be posted prepaid

3 cents only, it will be rated 6 cents unpaid—" more to pay" ---and forwarded to its address.

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it, commonly known as "*drop letters*," the rate is one cent per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamp affixed to such letters when posted.

The charge for the Registration of a letter is 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

Letters for Newfoundland are charged at the rate of *five* cents per half once, and must in all cases be *prepaid*.

The Registration fee to Newfoundland is the same as to places within the Dominion, viz., 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.


CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of postage upon letters passing by mail between Canada and the United States is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp.

The Registration fee to the United States is 5 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS

published regularly at intervals of not more than one calendar month, having a full title, the place, date of publication, and the number of the issue printed at the top of the first page, posted by the publishers in the Post Office at the place where they are printed, and addressed to regular subscribers, or newsdealers, in Canada, residing elsewhere than at the office of publication, are transmitted free of postage.

Newspapers and periodicals published not less frequently than once a month, and posted from the office of publication, or news agency, to actual subscribers, or news agents, in the United States, Newfoundland or Great Britain, by the Canadian Line, are subject to a rate of one cent per lb., bulk weight, which must be prepaid at the time of posting.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS ADDRESSED TO PLACES IN CANADA, NEWFOUNDLAND AND UNITED STATES,

On all newspapers and periodicals other than those from the office of publication, including all newspapers and periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the postage rate is one cent per 4 ounces, which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than one oz. may be posted singly; if prepaid by postage stamp, one-half cent each.

Newspapers and periodicals published in the United Kingdom, and re-posted by News Agents to regular subscribers, are not liable to any additional postage.

PARCEL POST.

To any part of the Dominion, for each parcel weighing Not more than 4 ozs., 6 cents,

Exceeding 4 ozs., and not exceeding 8 ozs., 12 cents, Each additional 4 ozs. or fraction, 6 cents.

Parcels should not exceed 5 lbs. in weight or 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth, and should be marked "by *Parcel Post.*" Parcels may be registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the postage.

Legal and Commercial papers generally are liable to letter rate of Postage.

The rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulbs and Roots is I cent per 4 ounces, the weight of a package not to exceed 24 ounces.

USEFUL HINTS.

Register all valuable letters, and use sealing wax for letters containing money.

Transmit money by Money Orders.

Make complaints and enquiries in writing.

Preserve and request correspondents to preserve envelopes of mis-sent or delayed letters.

Send to the Postmaster envelopes of letters about which you seek information or make complaint.

Business men should be careful to authorize but a limited number of persons to receive their letters, and only those in whom they have full confidence.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, posted for places in the United States, are subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ozs. in weight.

The Supreme Court has both original and appellate jurisidiction-Original, as to (1) habeas corpus in criminal and extradition cases; (2) judicial opinions to the Crown; (3) private bills and petitions therefore referred by the Senate or House of Commons; and (4) civil suits in which

the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. Appellate in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

The Exchequer Court has original jurisdiction $(\mathbf{1})$ in revenue cases, $(\mathbf{2})$ in civil suits when the Crown for the Dominion is plaintiff, (3) controversies between the Dominion and the Provinces, or between two Provinces.
