MECHANIC INSTITUTE.—Public meeting at the call of the Mayor, was held in the town hall on Friday evening last for the purpose of discussing the present condition of the Mechanics' Institute, and if thought advisable, to devise means to revive and sustain it. A report of the indebtedness of the Institute was laid before the meeting. Considerable discussion followed concerning the cause of the indebtedness, and the means to be adopted to liquidate the debt. It was also thought advisable to remove the library to more central locality, and to have a room at a nominal rental. Should the Council be willing to assume control of the Institute, a canvass of the town will be made to add to the membership and to secure such support for it as is hoped will make it a useful institution and a benefit to the town. The meeting was unanimously disposed to encourage the scheme. A special meeting of the Town Council has been called for Monday evening next, to take the matter into consideration.
