No steps, with a view securing the incorporation, should be taken until the whole matter has re-ceived the most careful so daration, as in the present unfortun the town's finance

city governm is necessarily more expensive that that of a town. It is more than pro bable that this impression is erroneou and if, on examination, it should prove to be so, there is little doubt that great advantage would accrue to the town from taking its place among the cities, an honor which its present posi tion of material progress and stability, counled with its brilliant outlook for the future, richly deserves.
