A MARVELOUS ROMAN CATHOLIC EDIFICE IN BATHURST STREET.

The Seventy Thousand Dollar House of Worship for the Parish of St. Mary's—Project of a great architect in Toronto—Who the Builders are.

Church architecture in Toronto, like its sister arts, painting and sculpture, has of late years made steady progress. It has grown with the growth of the Queen City. This is indisputable. The proofs abound on all hands. And the reason for this growth are not far to seek. The people are being educated to the appreciation of high-class art and the supply follows the demand.

Torontonians are becoming nearly as creative thinkers as the artists of the old world. In a corresponding degree appreciative of the masterpieces of art in the older countries. An illustration that such is not the case may be seen in the beautiful Church of Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, commonly known as St. Mary's Roman Catholic Church, now nearing its completion on Bathurst-street.

The church is built on solid stone foundations. The superstructure is of the best hard white brick, with blue terra cotta decorations, painted in the most delicate shades of blue and white.

The front facade, which looks towards Bathurst-street, is a grand composition. The great central arch, from which the lofty tower rises, is supported by bold wings on either side, varied by niches, which hold statues of granite pillars of various colors, rose windows with beautiful tracery, spacious and well-proportioned, and a dome of delicate design and color.

Passing through the spacious vestibule there are the nave, transepts, etc., divided from the altar and choir by noble arches of polished granite, which are of a blue color, and having molded bases of freestone. The interior is very finely wrought, and would be of the highest order of architecture.

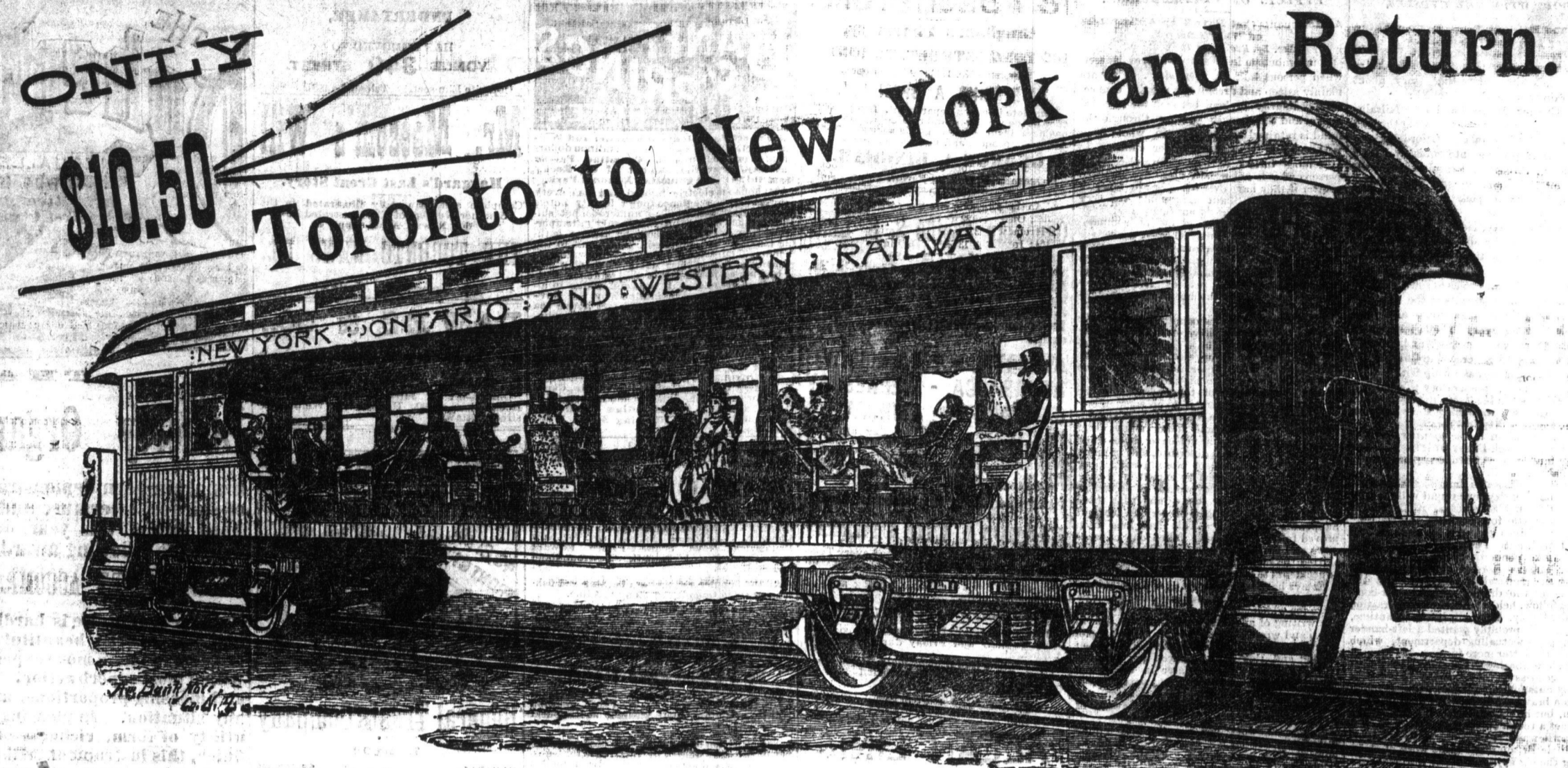

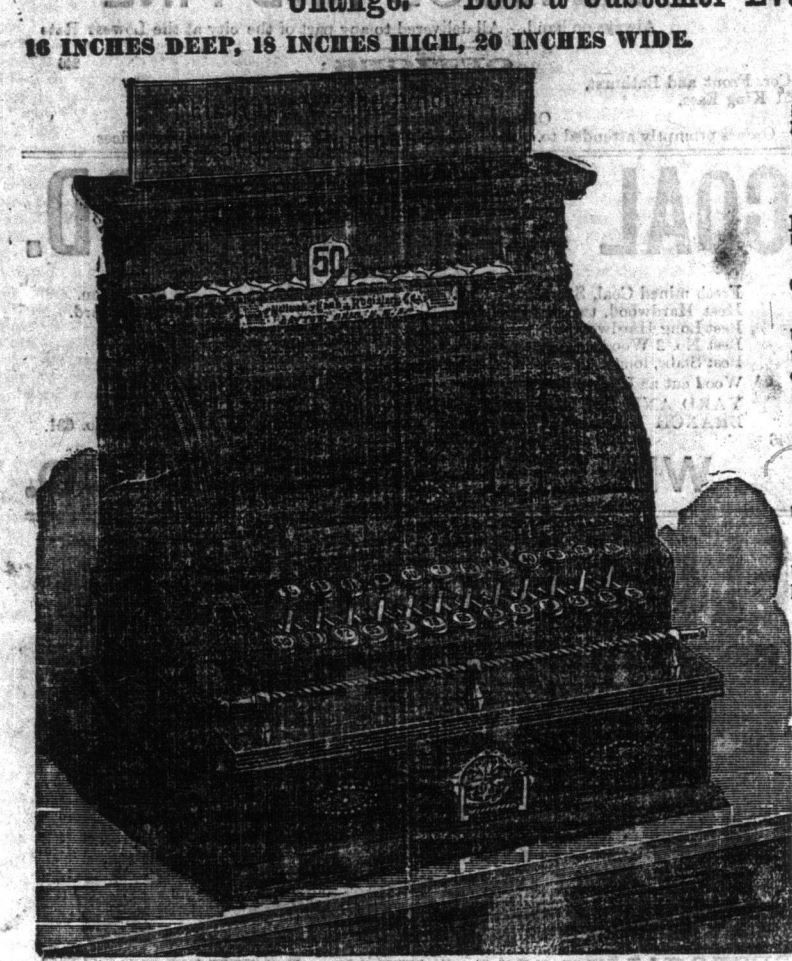

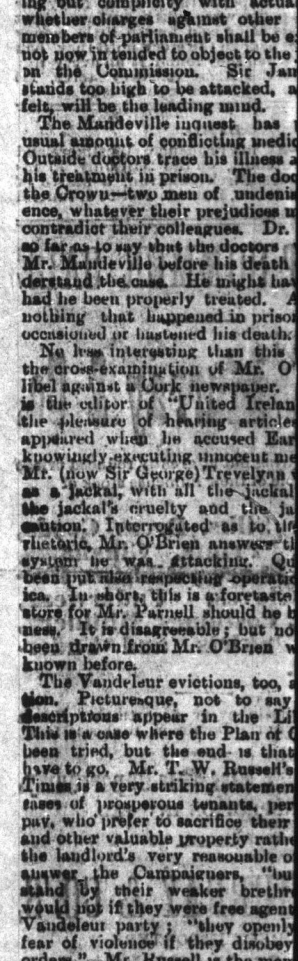
