Report of the Pastor and Deacons.

Dear Brethren and Sisters:

At this, our Eighth Annual Roll Call, we desire to direct your attention to a few things which may be adapted to quicken us in the work we are unitedly attempting to accomplish.

At our Roll Call two years ago, our membership numbered 236; and one year ago, 249. Within the year just ended 34 have been added by baptism, 15 by letter and one by experience. From one person fellowship has been withdrawn, two have been taken away by death and four have been dismissed by letter, making a net increase of 43, most of whom have come into the Church from the Sunday School. For this ingathering let us continue to render unto God devout thanksgiving, and let us now turn with prayer and faith to meet present opportunities, and all opportunities as they come, that many more may be won to Christ before our next Roll Call comes round.

There are on our church-book 31 names of non-residents, and we are endeavoring to keep the number as small as possible by doing what we can, from time to time, to have absent members secure letters of dismission to other churches. At the same time we are encouraging those who are living in the vicinity of our place of worship, who belong to Baptist Churches elsewhere, to secure their letters and cast in their lot with us. We deem this to be work of importance, and we will be glad of any assistance which brethren and sisters may give us in it.

The Prayer and Conference Meetings of the year have been, we are happy to say, quite well attended. But we look for further improvement in this particular. There are those whose faces are seldom or never seen at these services, though not providentially kept away, and we sincerely hope that they will not, for their own good and the Church's, allow this to continue. We long for your presence and your help.

Our Sunday School has had during the year an average attendance of 109. A monthly teachers' meeting has been begun by the pastor, which, it is expected, will continue to have the faithful support of all teachers. Parents are requested to do their utmost to interest their children in the home-study of the lessons, and to have them in the Sunday School with regularity. In this branch of our work there is a call for special vigilance.

The Young People's Union is well sustained. The pastor has a class in the "Christian Culture Courses," and it is confidently hoped that this will grow in interest and profit. The change of our Conference Meeting from Friday to Wednesday evening permits the carrying on of this work in a more consecutive manner than was possible before.

Our Sunday congregations are good. We ought, however, to be ambitious to have them larger. Each member should not only strive to be in his own place in his own church at every service, if possible, but should endeavor to bring in others who are not with us but who should be. Cultivation of this sort of zeal and cordiality yields good returns.

Financially the year shows some improvement. The church debt has been diminished by another thousand dollars, and we hope that our people will seek, as far as they can, to increase their quarterly collections toward this object, that at the year's close little effort may be required in the way of personal solicitation to fill out the needed amount. By removal of the debt we have the more to devote to our great denominational enterprises, whose needs are so urgent. The wide extent of the Great Commission must never be lost sight of. We trust that for the benefit of individual members themselves, as well as for the cause in general, all will be contributors to the various objects before us, whether they be able to give little or much.

Within the year gone the sisters have rendered the pastor and deacons valuable assistance in calling upon the sick, and upon new people who have had a claim upon us, and still larger gain do we look for through them hereafter. It would be well if we could all be more thoughtful regarding the aged and afflicted, and more intent upon showing sympathetic attention to strangers.

For the blessings of the year just closed we desire to offer heartfelt praise unto our God. And we ask, in concluding this report, that you not only offer prayer for the pastor and deacons that they may rightly meet their responsibilities, but that you yourselves seek to carry out any suggestions which seem to you well suited to promote the true welfare of our church and the glory of our Redeemer.

You will notice that the deficit on General Account, which at the close of 1893 amounted to \$387.00, has been reduced to \$273.00, a difference of \$114.00. Not large, it is true, but, nevertheless, encouraging, and but for the extra demand made upon our resources on account of the work done in the interior of the church during the year, our finances would have been in a fairly satisfactory condition. We hope at the close of the present year to see the existing balance altogether paid off. Our weekly offerings have been well sustained. We have

nothing special to report regarding the circulars sent out at the first of the year, inviting pledges and increased contributions. In this particular there is room for improvement, which will be more apparent when we point out to you that only about seventy-five members of the church are regular contributors through the envelope system.

For the information of the church, your committee subjoin the following comparative statement, showing amounts collected on current account, and the weekly average for the last six years :

It will be seen by this statement, that with but one exception, our offerings for the current year have been in excess of any year since 1888, prior to which we do not appear to have any data.

We are pleased to report the sale of one of the condemned furnaces, at a figure which we believe you will regard as satisfactory. Other similar assets we hope to see disposed of in the near future.

Our hearty thanks are due to the Mite Society for their generous support in the contribution to current expense account of \$48.75. Thirty-two dollars of this is the work of five months. The remainder is a balance which has been at the credit of this Society for some years

Your Committee, together with those appointed to assist them, acting under instructions from the Church, made a special effort in September last, in connection with the Building Fund, with the result that the mortgage debt has been reduced by another thousand dollars.
