

London, in August 1907, Mr. Willett's ideas were embodied in a bill that was inroduced in the House of Commons by William Pearce, Liberal member for the Tower Hamlets, early last year. In June a committee of the House filed a report favoring the bill. It provides that all clocks in the United Kingdom shall, on a certain day, be advanced 80 minutes, thereby giving to business men an im-mediate gain of one hour and twenty mintes of daylight. 


