MINUTES.

Minutes of the Proceedings of the African Baptist Association of Nova Scotia, held with the Digby Joggings Church, County of Annapolis, Saturday, Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, September 28th, 29th, 30th, October 1st and 2nd, 1878.

Saturday, Sept. 28th, 1878.

Met at 3 o'clock, P. M., with the Digby Joggings Church, in the 11th Session of the African Baptist Association of Nova Scotia. The Rev. Randolph Langford, read Psalm cxviii Prayer was offered The brethren spoke returning thanks to the Lord for sparing them to meet again in yearly conference and also of their hopes and their determination to follow the Lord. Truly we had a good time. Adjourned.

Sunday, Sept. 29th.

Met at 10 o'clock, A. M. It was arranged to have the preaching in the open field the Church being two small. The Rev. Nathaniel Drayton preached from St. Luke xiv. 23, followed by Rev. R. Langford. Adjourned.

Met at 3 o'clock, P. M. Preaching again in the open air by the Rev. G. R. Neale from Isaiah lxiii. 9, followed by the Bishop. Adjourned.

Met at 7 o'clock, P. M. Preaching by Rev. John D. Eaton in the Church from Rev. v. 17, followed by the Bishop. Exhortations by more of the brethren. Truly we had a good and happy time. Adjourned.

Monday, Sept. 30th.

Met at 9 o'clock, A. M. Rev. G. R. Neale read Psalm ix. Prayer was offered by Deacon Charles Pomp, the Council was called to order by the Bishop.

It was moved by Rev. G. R. Neale, and seconded by Brother George Barton, that Rev. R. Langford be Moderator for this year.

It was moved by the Bishop, seconded by Rev. G. R. Neale, that Rev. John Eaton, and Rev. Nathaniel Drayton take seats in Council with us.

It was voted that Brother Timothy Pleasant be assistant Secretary for this year, Rev. G. R. Neale was re-elected Secretary.

Met at 11 o'clock, A. M. The Rev. Randolph Langford preached the Introductory Sermon from 1 Sam xvii. 37; David said moreover the Lord that delivered me out of the paw of the lion and out of the paw of the bear, he will deliver me out of the hand of this Philistine, followed by Rev. J. D. Eaton Adjourned.

Met at 3 o'clock, P. M. Moderator called the Council to order and read Psalm xi., and offered prayer. The Minutes of the

Session were read and approved.

It was voted that the Minutes of last year be read, they were accordingly read, and a debate took place concerning the churches not making up the five dollars a year for the Bishop to visit them. Many of the brethren took part.

It was voted that Brother James Smith be the central treasurer all the rest to send the money to him and he to write to the Bishop.

It was moved by Rev. G. R. Neale, and seconded by Brother James Smith, that a Committee be appointed to examine the Letters from the various Churches and to read them.

It was voted Rev. G R. Neale, Brethren T. Pleasant, P. J. Hawkins, and Thomas Langford be the Committee. Adjourned.

Met at 7 o'clock. P. M., at the Hill Grove Church, to which our white Brethren had given us an invitation. They made us welcome. Preaching by Rev. John D. Eaton from Joshua vi. 5. Exhortations by all the ministering Brethren Adjourned.

Tuesday, Ootcber 1st.

Met at 9 o'clock, A. M., the Moderator called the Council to order and read Psalm xxiv. Prayer was offered by Rev. N. Drayton. The Minutes of last Session read and approved.

It was voted that Rev. George R. Neale and the Bishop super-

intend the printing of the Minutes.

It was voted that Rev. G. R. Neale write the Circular Letter, the Committee reported they were ready to read the Letters, the Letters was read and were satisfactory. Adjourned. Met at 3 o'clock, P. M., the Moderator called the Council to order and read Solomon Song viii. Prayer was offered by Rev. H. Frances, the Minutes of last Session read and approved. A request was brought in to the Council by the Rev. R. Langford from the Rev. N. Drayton that he wished to unite and join our Association.

It was voted to hear him on Wednesday. A request was brought in from Granville Mountain Church for the Association to be held

with them next year.

It was voted that the Association be held with the Granville Mountain Church next year, on the last Saturday in September,

1879. Adjourned.

Met at 7 o'clock, P. M, at the Hill Grove Church. Preaching by Rev. N. Drayton from Joshua i. 5. Exhortations by all the ministering brethren. We were glad and happy to have the Rev. Brother Parker with us, and take part in speaking with us. We felt the Lord was in our midst. Adjourned.

Wednesday, October 2nd.

Met at 9 o'clock, A. M., the Moderator called the Council to order and read the first Psalm. Prayer was offered by the Rev. J. D. Eaton. The Minutes of last Session were read and approved.

It was voted that Rev. Henry Francis preached the Introductory

Sermon next year, 1879.

It was voted that the Bishop be his alternate.

It was voted to hear Brother N. Drayton. Brother Drayton came in and related his Christian experience and his hope in the Lord, and of his baptism in South Carolina, and told of his traveling and of uniting with the Wesleyan Methodist Episcopal Church at Camden, S. C. there being no Baptist Church there, and of his ordination, handing to us his certificate telling of his desire to join our body, the African Baptist Association of Nova Scotia. He then went out and there was short discussion He was afterwards called in and the Bishop asked him his belief of the Bible, of God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost, and of baptism and many more questions which he answered satisfactorily.

It was voted to receive him He was received. The Bishop gave the charge to the minister, and Rev. R. Langford, the charge to the Churches as evangelist Baptist minister. The right hand of followship was given by all the ministering Brethren. Adjourned.

OF THE EMPLENTH SESSION OF THE AFRICAN BAPTIST ASSOCIATION, CONVENED AT DIGBY JOGGINGS CHURCH THIS YEAR OF OUR LORD, 1878, SEPTEMBER 28th.

Dearly Beloved Brethren,-
