Scovil Brothers Limited have an account in the Bank, consequently I cannot answer that questi on. Mr. Frank C. Smith has no account." Mr. Shadbolt further stated that he had no knowledge of the transaction on the 30th day of August, but that he was present yesterday when the affidavit was signed by Mr.Hazen. A Standard reporter got in touch with Mr. Frank C. Smith last evening over the telephone, an effort to locate him in his home Rockland Road earlier in the evening having been unsuccessful.
