STATEMENT OF SESSION.

In accordance with a resolution adopted in meeting of session last year the congregation has been divided into districts, a district being assigned to each elder, whose duty is to acquaint himself with the families and with each individual in his district, to learn of cases of sickness or destitution of any kind and report the same, and to call upon each member the week previous to communion and leave with them their membership card.

The session are pleased to notice that the effect of carrying out this arrangement has on the whole been good and that in some individual cases the benefit has been very decided.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been observed three times during the year under most favorable circumstances, and it is believed with much spiritual profit.

The Session note with pleasure an increase in the number of families and members connected with the church, and also an increase in the contributions for the support of ordinance and for the schemes of the church.

It is a cause of regret that not a few members and adherents contribute little, and some nothing whatever, to the cause of the Lord.

The Session would remind all such, and particularly members, that they are under solemn obligations to the church and to Christ to do their part in supporting the material interests of the cause, and, that to give of their means when done in the right spirit is a privilege, an act of worship and a means of grace.

The Session, after consultation with the Board of Managers, organized a Fund of their own to be known as the Session Fund. The treasurers report will be found on another page.

After due notice and consideration the following resolution was unanimously adopted at a meeting of session October 12th.

"In view of the importance of the Sabbath School in the teaching and training of the young for the fellowship and service of the church of Christ, and, that many children receive little or no christian instruction in their homes, and in view of the fact that the future welfare and success of the Lords cause is closely identified with the work at present being done in the Sabbath School. Therefore be it resolved:

1 That this session henceforth take a deeper and more lively interest in this department of christian work, 1st, by encouraging the teachers and officers by our prayers and sympathy. 2ndly. By seeing that all the young in our several districts, as far as possible, attend Sabbath School. 3rdly. By seeking to interest parents in the spiritual and moral welfare of

their children.

2. That all who take part in Sabbath School work in this church shall be appointed by the Session. To this end the Session ask the officers and teachers at least two weeks before the close of the year to submit to the Session a list of said officers and teachers, together with the names of any others whom they consider necessary and suitable for work in the School, said list to be carefully examined by the Session, and as approved by them returned, persons named therein to constitute the officers and teachers for the ensuing year.

The Sunday School may make all appointments, with the exception of Superintendent, Vice Superintendent and teacher of the Bible class, these appointments to be made by the Session.

3. That any teacher or officer wishing to resign shall do so in writing to the Session.

4. That teachers and officers shall be amenable to the Session for their conduct and doctrine."

In conclusion the Session would call attention to the Death Roll on the next page. A year ago we could not have guessed whose names would be written there. Some of those called away, we, as a congregation, greatly miss. Their presence, words and deeds were always helpful. The Death Roll for 1887 must be made up. May not our names appear on the Roll? If so, are we prepared for the summons?

Too earnestly we cannot plead with all over whom

the Lord has placed us in holy things, to live soberly, righteously and Godly, and to be ready, waiting and watching for the coming of the Lord.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING.

The annual meeting of the congregation was held in the basement of the Church on the evening of Wednesday, January 12th, Rev. Jas. Murray in the chair. After devotional services Mr. N. Steen was appointed Secretary of the meeting, and read the minutes of the last annual meeting which were adopted.

Reports were then read by Mr. Thomas McCracken, Clerk of Session, Mr. F. W. Morgan, Secretary, and Mr. John Wilson, Treasurer, of the Sunday School. The meeting in adopting the Sunday School reports tendered a hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Thomas Hassard for his services as Superintendent of the School during the past year.

The Treasurer, Mr. J. G. Beaty, read the report of the Board of Managers, which was adopted and the thanks of the congregation tendered Mr. Beaty, for his faithful services in connection with the finances of the Church.

It was agreed to increase the number of Managers from nine to twelve. The following were then elected to fill vacancies and take the place of those retiring. John Weylie and Hugh Morrow, to serve for one year. George Irwin and Dugald McGregor, jr., to serve for two years. J. C. Johnston, John McIlwrick, Samuel Wolf and Joseph, Featherston re-elected, to serve for three years.

Mr. Thomas Hassard and Louis Scruton were appointed Auditors.

The Board of Managers were authorized to take steps to introduce the envelope system of raising the finances of the Church.

After singing and prayer the meeting was closed with the benediction.

In presenting their Annual Report the Managers with pleasure call attention to the increase, over last year, in the amounts contributed from pew rent and by collections, but, as can be seen by the financial statement, there is a balance of \$50 still due the Treasurer.

Reasons for this are. (1) Expenses have considerably increased. (2) Some pew holders are still in arrears for 1885 and 1886. (3) A few who attend services do not contribute to the funds of the Church. (4) Some who do contribute do not give in proportion to their means.

The Managers trust that those who are still in arrears will shortly pay up, and that with the adoption of the envelope system the finances will be in a satisfactory condition by the close of the year 1887
