CHILI NOT MERELY A VAST NITRATE MINE

Washington, October 13.—So engrossed has the world become with thoughts of war and its weapons that the reader often thinks of Chili as nothing more than a vast nitrate mine, contributing to munitions factories its millions of tons of non-metallic mineral, an essential ingredient of high explosives. The nitrate fields of the South American republic have an area of less than 350 square miles, however, and they are from fifty to one hundred miles from the coast in a desolate, arid region. The real Chili, the Chili of the Chilian and not the mining region, controlled by British nitrate companies, is described by Bailey Willis in a communication to the National Geographic Society, a part of which has been issued as the following geography bulletin:

"Chili is the longest and narrowest of all the countries of the world. It stretches 2,700 miles, from Cape Horn to the deserts of Atacama, within the tropics. Its width rarely more than 125 miles from the ocean to the Andean coast. If we were to place it upon a similar stretch of coast in North America, it would cover Lower California, California, Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia to the St. Elias District of Alaska.

"Chili is divided into three sections by the natural features of the Pacific slope of the Andes. The northern is that of the semi-arid and desert region which reaches from Peru southward to Valparaiso. It is an utter desert in the north and becomes less inhospitable toward the south. It is traversed from the Andes to the coast by short, deep valleys, separated by high spurs of the mountains, and communication from north to south has always been exceedingly difficult. Nevertheless, the Chilian engineers have found a route through which to extend the state railway which will link Santiago with the territories conquered from Peru.

The central section, extending from Valparaiso to the island of Chiloé, a distance of 600 miles, is the heart of Chili, the only part of the country in which there is sufficient population to constitute a nation. The area is not large (about as extensive as the State of Colorado), and much of it is occupied by mountain ranges of great heights and ruggedness. But between the Andes and the coast range there extends in this section a valley similar to that of California, which is the seat of the Chilian people. Many rivers rising in the Andes descend to it, and meander more or less directly westward through the coast range of the Pacific, but the intervening divides are nowhere of such altitude as to interrupt the continuity of the great valley which extends from north to south. Santiago is situated at the northern end, and flourishing cities are located at each favorable point on the railway that connects the capital with Puerto Montt.

"The climate as we go from north to south becomes ever more humid, and we pass from the irrigated lands about Santiago to the dense forest swamps in the southern portion of the district. While much of the land has been cleared or is in the process of clearing, in a state which reminds one of our own Pacific Coast thirty years ago, other areas remain impenetrable forests, still unexplored after nearly 400 years' occupation of the country.

"The third section of Chili, extending southward from Puerto Montt to Cape Horn, is like our southern Alaska coast—a stretch of islands, of peninsulas broken by intricate channels and profound fiords that penetrate far into the land. Turbulent rivers descend from the Andes and debouch into the fjords in swampy deltas which are covered with dense forests.

"Santiago is the chief city of Chili, but not in the same degree as Buenos Aires is of the Argentine Republic. Buenos Aires has become almost the republic itself, in the sense that Paris is France; but Santiago is only the capital of the country, which has other cities that may compare with it in local importance. Santiago contrasts with Buenos Aires as the conservative capital of a small country with the metropolitan city of the continent. You feel in the Chilian capital the conservative character of the people; in Buenos Aires the liberal spirit of the city.

"The modern Chilians are descendants of wandering Spanish invaders mingled with war-like Indian race, the Araucanians. They are without question the most aggressive, of South American peoples. The people of Argentina are the most enterprising, as they are the most cosmopolitan and progressive, of the Spanish Americans."—New York Evening Post.

CANADIAN NEWS —Ottawa, Oct. 25.—There will be no strike on the C. P. R. The Minister of Labor, at midnight, received a message stating that, after sitting all night, representatives of the men and the heads of the company had reached an agreement. Instead of striking at 5 o'clock this afternoon, an agreement will be signed and work will be continued. The news was received with great satisfaction by the Government, and the public. Labor disturbance on the great Canadian transportation system was genuinely dreaded by all who had the interest of the Dominion at heart. The terms of the settlement have not yet been forwarded to Ottawa.

Graham on Wednesday evening, October 25th, when their eldest daughter, Elsie Pearce, was united in marriage to Mr. William John Rollins, of St. Andrews. The bride, who was attended by her two little sisters Ruth and Gretchen, daintily dressed in blue and pink with white overtones, white net and carrying baskets of pink carnations and sweet peas, entered the parlor on the arm of her brother, Mr. Fred Graham to the strains of Mendelssohn's Wedding March, which was rendered by Miss Anna Mitchell. She looked lovely in a gown of white satin de chine and georgette crepe with veil arranged in Juliet cap with wreath of orange blossoms and carried a bouquet of pink Killarney roses. The groom's gift to his bride was a wrist watch, and to the flower girls rings. The couple stood under an arch of evergreen and autumn leaves and yellow Marguerites, while the ceremony was performed by Rev. R. W. Weddall, of the Methodist church. After refreshments were served, Mr. and Mrs. Rollins left by auto for a camping trip. The bride's going away gown was of tulle de regle venetian cloth with black tulle and black fur. Many beautiful gifts of silver-cut-glass and linen were received.

TEN YEARS OF UNIVERSITY EXTENSION
