The Cultan Expedition

The following are the latest particulars which we must in the Defend Region papers with respect to this extraordinary affair, which is certainly as suming a most serious aspect. If the account be true of the date of the sailing of the Expedition of LOPEZ from New Orleans, the order given by the squadron will be too late. We venture to predict that, if 6000 well armed Anglo-Saxons land upon the Island, they will not be dislodged without difficulty, if at all; though how the affair will eventually end it is impossible to say, because we are utterly ignorant of the true state of the Island, though out information leads us to believe that there is a large party of the inhabitants inclined to separation from Spain. Neither can we conjecture what course will be pursued by England and France in this conjuncture. We think that both these nations are parties to a Treaty which guarantees the possession of Cuba to Spain, though in these days treation do not go for much; we have also heard that the United States are a party to some Treaty of the same kind, but think this doubtful. The story about Jamaica and Barba-does we disbelieve. We should conceive that any portion of the American people anxious to obtain Cuba, desires its possession with its present Slave institutions; but in the British West India Islands the Slaves have been emancipated, and we should think no one in his senses could dream of restoring Slavery either in them or in St. Domingo The Negroes themselves would to a man resist any invasion did they suppose such a design to be contemplated; and Negroes, when disciplined and officered by English men, fight well. The greatest danger we see in this affair is the chance of some awkward collision, by which England and the United States may be involved in hostilities, a thing more to be regretted than the loss of half a dozen ruined Islands. As far as the British inhabitants of the West Indies are concerned, it can make very little difference to them to whom they belong, for they have been utterly ruined by England's suicidal policy towards her Colonies. LATEST FROM HAVARA—THE ISLAND IN COMMOTION.—

The impetus which Agricultural Societies have imparted to the improvement in farming and introduction of superior descriptions of stock is perceptible in this Colony, if we contrast late exhibitions with the clumay efforts of twenty years since. In the New England States, as in the Parent Country, the continuous transfusion of d by manufacturing, to agricultuwealth, acqui ral purposes, has elevated the operation of farming into a scientific pursuit, and widened fields of enterprise not less profitable than honorable; but our condition of Colonialism almost forbids the expectation that we shall be suffered to enact laws intended to foster local industry, from their hostile tendency to the doctrines of the Manchester School. Manchester Cotton Lords doom us, while their voice is paramount in the Imperial Parliament, to be the mere growers of food for English operatives, and require us, as a condition of our Connection, to refrain from all legislation which would create manufactures by protective duties. Forced back involuntarily upon the limited resources at our command, the cases are exceptional in which men of capital have taste or. inclination to indulge in the purchase of gare and valuable varieties of stock—they do so irrespective of pecuniary gain, a generous pride alone actuates them. From such causes do we derive the finer specimens of imported stock occisionally to be met with; but the inadequate semimeration which waits upon all agricultural pursuits in Canada under the operation of English Free Trade, debars the ordinary farmer from specula-tive outlay.
